Fortunately for us the changes we did make during half time made a huge difference and we as a team dominated the second half and scored two very good goals to level us up. We pressed and pressed for the chance to take the lead and were thwarted by both posts until we finally did have the ball in the back of the net. However, it was disallowed by the referee after he'd allowed play to continue for up to 20 seconds to see us put the ball into the net only to disallow it because of a head injury. What was even more frustrating was the fact that the opposition had the ball and did not choose to kick the ball out of play but then when they lost possession kicked up a fuss about us not kicking it out. This then meant we had to settle for a penalty shootout which we eventually lost. Despite losing on penalties we were proud of the five players who stepped up to take the kicks because it's certainly not an easy task under pressure. We move on and look forward to earning another three points here today in what has been a cracking start to our league season so far.

Opponents History

1894 Like almost all women's sides the parent club was formed as a men's side and became founder members of the Mid Gloucestershire League (MGL), the first league in the county outside of the city of Bristol.

1902 When the MGL folded the club become members of the newly formed Stroud League and also the Dursley & District League.

1903 First piece of silverware was secured when the club won the Dursley and District League.

1912 Won the Stroud League under the name Nailsworth and Forest Green United, after the Nailsworth Club amalgamated with the club at the top of the hill above the town.

1921 After a break during WWI, the club enjoyed a period of great success winning two football leagues and three cups in both 1921 and 1922.

1926 The Lawn was created with the field where the team played officially enclosed.

1927 A crowd of over 5,000 saw the club lift the County Cup beating the Sharpness Sharks in nearby Dursley.

1936 Committee members bought the club's field at auction for the princely sum of £120.

1938 Won the Northern Senior League for the first time in 1938.

1968 Joined the newly formed County League.

1975 Were promoted to the Hellenic League.

1982 A successful few years culminate in a double winning season as the club clinched the Hellenic League title and won the FA Vase, defeating Rainworth Miners Welfare 3-0.

1989 In a bid to turn the club's fortunes around, the club were renamed Stroud FC but this near disastrous when many life-long fans & committee members turning their back on the club.

1992 The club name changed back to Forest Green Rovers.

1997 Frank Gregan arrived as manager in 1994, taking the club to the Southern League Southern Division title in 1997 and into the Southern League Premier Division for the first time.

1998 A showdown with Merthyr Tydfil in front of a record crowd of 2,962 at the newly upgraded Lawn saw the club through to the Conference.

1999 Despite being favourites for relegation the club went back to Wembley in the FA Trophy, becoming the first club to appear in both the Trophy and Vase finals. The Trophy final was lost to Kingstonian 1-0.

2001 Under Nigel Spink, the club returned to the Trophy Final at Villa Park, this time losing to Canvey Island again by a single goal.

2006 The New Lawn officially opened in September, 400m away from the old stadium. The ground was built to Football League standards and painted head to toe by the club's supporters, a tradition set back in the 1950s.

2010 With the club in financial difficulty, Ecotricity founder Dale Vince got involved with the club in August, to improve the club's social and environmental impact.

2015 The club went completely vegan as a football club, the first and still the only certified vegan team in the world.

2016 The club announce plans to move to a new 5,000 seat stadium to be built beside junction 13 of the M5, with plans for the stadium to be made almost entirely out of wood.

2017 Mark Cooper leads the club to the Football League for the first time in the club's history, following a 3-1 success over Tranmere Rovers in the National League play-off final at Wembley.

2019 In December, Stroud District Council approved plans to build Eco Park. The club aim to make their proposed new home the world's greenest football stadium, for the world's greenest football club.

2021 The FGR Women's team become part of the club, having previously been an independent organisation. The club also announce plans to launch a girl's academy.

The previously independent Women's team had been very successful playing in the The FA Women's National League Southern Division as recently as Season 2015-16. An exodus of players saw them drop back to the South West Regional League, winning the Eastern Division in 2016-17 and promotion to the Premier Division. However, the women's side were relegated back two seasons later. Leading the Eastern Division at the time Covid brought the 2020-21 Season to a premature close they were elevated back to the Premier for the current season.

Returning to league action for the first time in a month, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Ladies showed few signs of rust as they recorded a comfortable 14-0 win at home against Bideford.

Libby Davies was once again the star of the show for Bassett as she found the net eight times. But it was also a fine afternoon for youngsters Jorja Halden and Poppy Wannell as they both scored twice and in the process registered their first goals in competitive senior football for Bassett. Experienced campaigners Laura Jefferies and Maddy Elliott rounded off the scoring.

Facing the side currently occupying bottom spot in the South West Regional Women's Football League Premier Division, Bassett entered the game as favourites. And with Bideford only able to field nine players for

the fixture, a one-sided contest was a clear possibility.

To their credit, Bideford battled to the end. But the numerical disadvantage they faced across the 90 minutes meant they endured a long afternoon.

With the win and Torquay United's narrow defeat against Sherborne Town, Bassett climb up to fourth in the table and are theoretically within touching distance of top spot. With two games in hand, Bassett sit five points behind current leaders Ilminster Town (who beat Bassett 4-0 in their meeting in September), while they are only a point adrift of unbeaten St Austell and three behind Sherborne having played two games fewer.

In a tight division, the boost to Bassett's goal difference that their win against Bideford provided may eventually come in handy.

First though, Bassett will be hoping to maintain the pressure on the sides above and, crucially, aim to take points off them when they eventually meet.

She then chased down a ball from fellow youth section graduate Ellie O'Nions before slotting into the net to round off a fine hat trick.

With Bassett's victory, they move up into second, leapfrogging both Sherborne Town and AFC St Austell who were in Vitality Women's FA Cup action.

Bassett are not set to meet either side until the new year. But those could end up being crunch games, so long as they can maintain what has been an excellent start to the campaign for a young team.

Warminster had star striker Shannon Redhouse to thank for their healthy half time lead.

Her first - struck sweetly into the top

corner - came after a strong Lydia Shirley challenge won possession back for her team deep in Bassett territory on 18 minutes.

Redhouse then grabbed her second with one minute to go until the interval, slotting home after good set up play from Mia Blazey.

Bassett struck back five minutes after the restart through leading scorer Libby Davies before captain Laura Jefferies equalised quarter of an hour later.

There were no further goals - although Davies had what would have been the match winner controversially disallowed with five minutes remaining. That meant the game went to penalties.

Despite two excellent saves from young 'keeper Millie Powell, only Davies and Hayley Huckin were able to convert their penalties for Bassett, allowing for Warminster to claim a 3-2 shootout win and march on to the last four.

The result means Bassett pass up the chance to retain a title they won in 2018-19. There is little time to lick their wounds either, with an important home league fixture against Forest Green Rovers on the cards next.
