The Unofficial Hellenic League Charity Shield Match

On Saturday 5th August the unofficial Hellenic League Charity Shield match was played between Banbury United, last season's Hellenic League Champions, who took on Hellenic Challenge Cup and Floodlit Cup winners Swindon Supermarine FC. The match was played on a very hot and humid afternoon with both sides playing some attractive football. Banbury United opened strongly but were met by a stubborn Marine defence that included Lee Hartshorn returning to the side for the first time since breaking his ankle last October. After 15 minutes Banbury took the lead with Steve Jenkins heading down for Ady Fuller to slam the ball past Chris Webb from 22 yards. After a further period of stout defending by Marine the visitors gradually got into their stride and started to create a few chances. From one of these Marine scored the equaliser when Simon Fletcher sent over a cross that was powerfully met by Ryan Lovegrove whose header beat keeper Meadows by the near post after 30 minutes. Marine were now well into the game and threatened to score a second when first Doug Inurie and then Jamie Garbutt got past a rather static defence, on each occasion with only Meadows to beat they were thwarted. Marine were forcing the pace and in the last ten minutes of the half they scored two scorching goals. The first came from Lee Randell who fired the ball into the top corner of the net from 25-yards after more good work from Ryan Lovegrove and Tom Jones. Seconds later it was 3-1 when new signing Doug Inurie beat the offside trap and sent a scorcher of a half volley into the far top corner of the net.

The second half saw Banbury United pile on the pressure, keeper Mark Teasdale and the centre back partnership of Mick Casey and Pete Farrow ably assisted by Simon Fletcher and Lee Randell were magnificent in stopping the very potent strike force of Matty Goodcrick, Steve Jenkins and recent signing Frankie Dorrian. A scrambled goal in the 60th minute from Darlington was all that got past them for what was a very well deserved Marine victory.
