

Good afternoon, and a warm welcome to you all and to our visitors Highworth Town, in the first of our local derby's in the Premier Division.

I write this article whilst in positive mood, following our Bank Holiday victory away at Cheltenham Saracens. It is often the way that after 2 home games that we could, and probably should have won, we then go away for a tough fixture and gain all three points. As a club though we are realistic about the continued and consistent hard work we are all going to need to put in to take the club further forward this season, and the team displayed that determination and hard work Monday.
