Due to the intervention of the elements the latest 'Team of the Month Awards' covered November & December. Swindon Supermarine won the Premier Division award with six wins and a draw in seven outings' that saw them top the division in December. The Division One (West) is won by another Wiltshire club with Purton FC dragging themselves away from the bottom of the table with an unbeaten run of six matches, securing three wins and three draws. Within minutes a team of people, including the groundsman and club President John Cannon, were working on the pitch brushing the water away and forking the affected areas. All the work was not in vain as play was sanctioned and a competitive local derby ensued with Didcot Town narrowly winning with a goal on the stroke of half time.

Firsts – travelled to Didcot Town on Tue 24th and came away with a well earned point from a battling performance in torrential rain.

Reserves - drew 0-0 away at Wantage Town. Failed to take a hatful of chances, but maintain their unbeaten season to date

A Team - Croft 1 Wootton Bassett 'A' 7, Craig reports :-

An excellent performance on a difficult pitch against a side from a higher division, saw us reach the Semi-Finals of the George Thomas Memorial Cup.We started the game strongly, with 4 goals in the first half, from Steve Davis (2) (one which many disputed to be an own goal, however Steve 'nearly' got there!!), Neil Clark with a 30 yard 'scuff' which caught the keeper unawares due to a nasty divot, and Barry Taylor, following excellent work from Mark Hull. The second half saw us score early on with a bullet header from Paul Roberts. We then seemed to lose our shape for 20 minutes, following a couple of substitutions, and left Croft back into the game. Fortunately, they were unable to capitalise on the numerous chances they had, only scoring the one, in a passage of play that could have made the game closer. We eventually regained a stronghold and Barry Taylor scored twice to complete his hat-trick, his final goal an excellent 30 yard chip over the keeper. Overall an excellent performance, with particular mentions for the two Simon's (Jones and Slade) who controlled the game from centre midfield and allowed us to build a strong platform from which to play.



Good afternoon and welcome to Rylands Way for today's County Cup 2nd Round fixture. This afternoon we welcome the players, officials and supporters of local rivals Purton. We hope they enjoy their visit and that they will join us in the bar after the game. We also wish them a safe return journey. We wish all our supporters and visitors a Happy New Year and to hopefully some prolonged Saturdays of football till the end of the season.

Since our last home fixture back on the 18th November we have played three fixtures. At Wantage Town on an unplayable pitch we went down 3-2 with both goals coming from Lee Stoddart, Paul Davis was taken to hospital following an horrendous tackle, but thankfully no bones broken. The Tuesday evening before Xmas 'we traveled to Carterton to take on the fourth in the table side. Up stepped Lee Marshall with a 30 yard thunderbolt which the keeper could only watch go bye him into the top corner. A Mickey Goodwin free kick almost won us the game in the duing seconds after Jon Davis had been brought down.

Back to today's task we must maintain our level of performance as we have been doing in the Premier Division. Purton I am sure are looking for a scalp in a season that has seen them languish in the bottom three of Division One for the majority of the season. Last season in Division One saw the sides share the spoils Purton winning at the Red House and Bassett here at Rylands Way. Should the scores be level at 90 minutes then 30 minutes of extra time will be played. Should the scores remain level then there will be a replay next Saturday at Purton. K.O. 2p.m.

Next Saturday we entertain Yate Town in a Premier League fixture and Kick Off reverts back to 3p.m

Dug Out Views

Good afternoon, and a belated happy new year to everyone. Today we welcome Purton to Rylands Way for our first home game of 2001. We have a number of games to catch up on since my last program notes.

The first was away to Wantage on the 16th Dec, our first game for a month due to the weather. On a boggy surface that should have seen the game called off it was impossible to get the ball down and pass. After going a goal down early on we equalised just before half time through Lee Stoddart, and could have gone in at half time in front, but Paul Harper's free kick came back off the post. Within two minutes of the re-start the points were lost as we ball watched and suddenly found ourselves 3-1 down. Despite a late rally which saw Lee score a fine volley, we couldn't quite get the equaliser. The game was marred by a terrible tackle on Paul Davis - thankfully despite needing a pre-cautionary check at hospital Paul is okay.

On the following Tuesday we travelled to Carterton with some seven first team players unavailable. The game started with us on the back foot and Carterton had most of the possession, but we kept the goal scoring chances to a minimum and slowly worked our way into the game. Goalless at half time, we frustrated them for much of the second half and threatened on the break, but fell a goal behind with 15 minutes remaining. Credit must go to the lads though, as we kept at it, and the work rate and commitment paid off with a last gasp equaliser from Nathan Hall. The players that came in that night were absolutely brilliant, and after a performance like that it is hard to pick anyone out for special mention, but Nathan was outstanding up front, and 'H put a lot of younger players to shame with his fitness.

Sat 7th Jan saw us away at Abingdon, and another battling performance saw us come away with a 2-1 victory. We fell behind through another slow start, but responded with two goals for Lee Stoddart in as many minutes. We gave possession away to cheaply in the second half and put pressure on ourselves, but resolute defending meant we grabbed all three points.

Last week we were away at Tuffley Rovers, and again found ourselves a goal behind at half time. We raised our game in the second half and equalised through a superb Lee Marshall strike, and finishing the stronger probably could have nicked the winner. Once again good character and resilience earnt us a point.

Today sees a break from the League action as we take on Purton in the Wilts Senior Cup – another tough encounter following our recent travels. Although it's an important game for us, cup success is a bonus in a season where establishing ourselves in the Premier division is the priority, with a tough trip to Didcot next up.







The match itself proved to be the highlight of the day for all associated with Highworth Town (the 1st team were 'stuffed' at Brackley) as 'Scouse' scored 3 times in a 6-2 win. He's back and he's worked like a Trojan to do it - there will be bad times ahead but let's hope many more good ones he deserves it.

ARDLEY UTD

Former Purton Goalkeeper and Player of the Year Steve Hale has been appointed Assistant Manager to Paul Spittle at Ardley Utd. Hale who was also player of the year last season at Larkhall Athletic from the Screwfix Western League broke his arm playing Sunday football which has sidelined him for the rest of the season. Steve has also agreed to take on the vacant position of Press Officer at the club.

HAYDON LEAVES WITNEY ACADEMY
