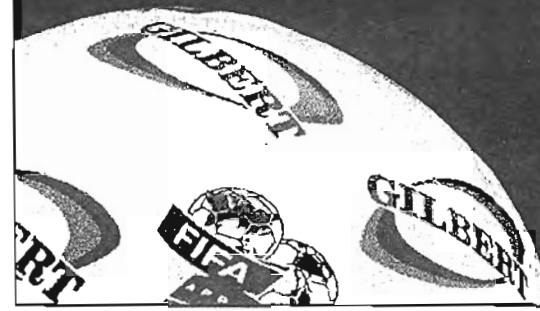

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to you all and our visitors from Fairford.

In Tuesday's Wantage program I began a review of the season to date and how we were doing against our objectives as a club. That article focussed on the senior sides, and in this I would like to look at the wider club objectives and success to date against them.

Following our promotion, a general objective was simply to ensure that as a club we operated at that level successfully and as professionally as possible. I think you can see with the addition of 'DD's refreshment bar, the marvellous new program cover (thanks go to Fred Doherty for this), and additional hard walkway around the ground, we have met this. This is all on top of the addition of the lights and seating through the summer, so it's fair to say we have not stood still. As a club though we are now keen to move on again, and the pitch and training facilities are getting particular scrutiny at the moment so that we can launch a project to improve these for next year.

We also set ourselves an objective as a club to plan the introduction of a ladies section for next season. However there is much to do yet on this, not least the additional pressure it creates for playing and training facilities. As the club grows in playing terms so must the infrastructure off the pitch to support it, and as for any other club, we need more help if we are to progress as fast as we all would like. That said on both the Commercial and Youth Development front we have done well, but with appropriate focus from individuals assigned to these tasks I know we could do better. Perhaps you can help, or know someone who might?  
Next program I will review the youth operations for this season to date.

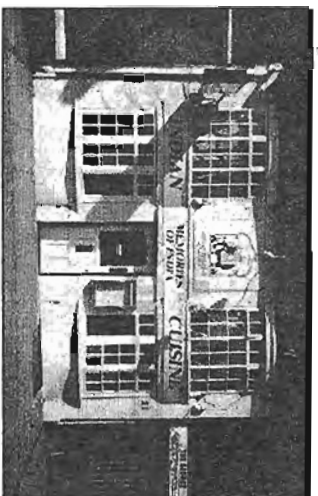

# Club faces action over Academy title

CIRENCESTER ACADEMY are on a collision course with the FA over their name - and legal action has not been ruled out.

Cirencester Town, in 1994, were the first club in the country to use the term 'academy' to describe their youth set-up.

Players from the academy have represented the town side in the Dr Martens league, but the Academy now has its own team in the Hellenic League Premier Division and has also helped Cirencester United in Division One of the Hellenic League.

But the FA have ruled that the use of the term 'Academy' must be limited to just Premiership clubs. Football chiefs have set up a three-tier system with Football League clubs being the only ones allowed to have Centres of Excellence. Non-League clubs must use the title of Development Centre for schemes bringing players through their ranks.

Cirencester are currently challenging the ruling that was brought in as part of Howard Wilkinson's *Blueprint for Football*. The club recently extended their set up to include a girls' section and have received backing from a number of people, including Sports Minister Kate Hoey, who has promised to look into the situation.

PEWSEY VALE still look favourites for the drop in Screwfix Division One despite a slight improvement under new manager Don Rogers.

With six points, and just the 3-1 win at Corsham Town to show for his tenure at the Recreation Ground, Rogers will

need to see his team to show the qualities which almost snatched a point against league leaders Keynsham Town last week in order to close the ten-point gap on their closest rivals, Chard Town.

LEAGUE newcomers Hallen Town have become the first Screwfix Division One club to reach the last sixteen of the FA Vase after their 2-1 home win over Borrowash Vics.

Hallen visit either Brigg Town or Billingham Town on February 10, while Taunton Town entertain 1994/95 winners Arlesey Town and last year's beaten finalists Chippenham Town travel to Cove or Coydon.

## BASSETT EARN PLACE IN THE SEMIS AFTER EXTRA TIME VICTORY

WOOTTON Bassett reached the semi-final of the Wills Senior Cup with a 4-1 win over local rivals Purton after extra time.

In a lively opening to the game, the two sides created several openings and there were goal-line clearances at both ends. Watkins and Wright missing early chances for Purton.

On 24 minutes, Purton took the

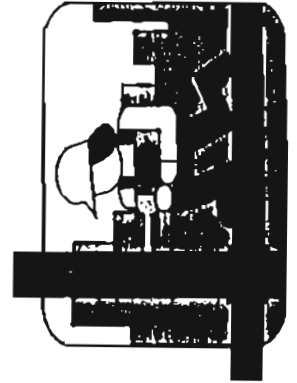

## Fairford Town Football History

### HONOURS & BRIEF HISTORY

Fairford Town F.C. was formed in 1891 and for many years played in the Cirencester & District League against local teams with varying degrees of success.

After the second world war the club joined the Swindon & District League, winning the Premier Division in both 1964/65 and 1968/69, also winning the Advertiser Cup in the same years, and in 1962/63 won the Gloucestershire Junior Cup.

Success in the Swindon & District League was followed by election to the Hellenic League in 1970, only missing promotion from the first division on goal average at the first attempt, the club were also beaten finalists in that year's division one Challenge Cup.

The following year, 1971/72 saw Fairford win the Hellenic first division and division one Challenge Shield, whilst the reserve side won the Gloucestershire County Minor Cup, the Advertiser Cup and finished runners-up in the Swindon & District division one

The successful run continued and Town were the beaten finalists of 1972/73 in the Premier Division Cup, only to be relegated back to division one in 1973/74.

Fairford Town were again promoted in 1975/76 and steady progress led to the Premier Division runners-up position in 1978/79 and 1979/80, also winning the Premier Division Cup in 1978/79

This Club were winners of the Gloucestershire Challenge Trophy in 1979/80 and 1998/99 and Runners-up in 1982/83 and 1994/95. The most recent league success has been Premier Division Runners-up in season 1994/95 following a similar position in season 1990/91.

The club has also achieved numerous wins in the Arthur Shipway Cup and Fairford Hospital Cup.

"Sides from Wiltshire are leading the way in the Hellenic Premier Division with Swindon Supermarine currently top and Highworth chasing them in second. Supermarine are applying to go up to the Doc Martens and although I admire their ambition I find it very hard to see how they will cope if they are successful. The attendances at Supermarine are very poor and you do need fans/money coming through the turnstiles to help support football at that level. Also is their current squad strong enough to compete regularly at that level as it is a big jump with the week to week grind the division and extra travelling brings. Are there the quality of players to play at that level in this area? It would be sad to see them as another Cinderford who struggle every week. Rumour comes from Highworth that Manager Gary Goodwin is stepping down at the end of this season, will he finish on a succesful note? Rumours have been rife about the playing budget at the Rec and I feel that if the rumours are true there really should be some silverware in the cupboard at the end of the season to make paying that money worthwhile. I also question whether playing Former Swindon manager Jimmy Quinn is worthwhile, he has played for numerous clubs this season, a real whose who. However, the higher he has played he has done well but the lower he has played where you would expect him to shine he hasn't. I saw him in the recent game against Supermarine and he was non-existent, is he really that bothered, is his heart really in it? I have my doubts. I would have thought it better to save some money and play someone who has the desire to succeed and put the effort in for his local club. Fairford under Mark Webb are also doing well with probably a lesser budget than Highworth or Supermarine and Webb deserves a lot of the credit for this I think, as over the previous couple of seasons the side have been in the bottom half of the table. Wootton Bassett in their first season in the Premier division have surprised everybody, myself included. I had predicted that they would be in the bottom three of the division but the whole club has worked hard and currently lie in 7th spot. All local managers must be wondering Barry Giles secret as it has been achieved with a budget of £0.00!!!

In Division One its not such good news for Wiltshire sides with Malmesbury lying in 13th spot and Purton in 14th spot. Malmesbury under Lester Foxhall came up from the Wilts league and started well but have slipped away. Due to the bad weather and the fact that their ground is right next to a river they have a big fixture backlog. They may catch up on points with the teams above them with games in hand but I actually feel it may work against them playing so many games in a short space of time. One rumour I did hear was that they wouldn't switch their game with Purton to the Red House and therefore play, this I feel was short-sighted. Surely it makes more sense just to get games played as I can't see that playing at home is that much advantage at this level of football. Purton had a very poor start but have picked up and recently won team of the month, however Keith Skinner still struggles to attract better quality players to the club with no budget and the side near bottom."

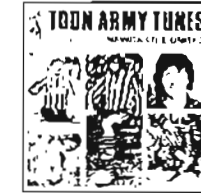

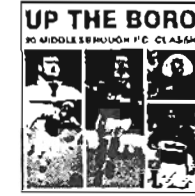
