





Chairmans Chat

Good afternoon, a warm welcome to you all and our visitors from Brackley. *****

In the last couple of programs I have been reviewing the club progress against our objectives for the season. It is the turn of some of the youth sides whose dedicated managers have taken a little time to provide these interesting updates:-UNDER 11's - In their first season of competitive football the Under 11's have had an excellent season to date. At the time of writing they are in second place in the league with 8 wins from their opening 11 games, this after losing their first two games of the season. They also gave League leaders Stratton Youth their closest game of the season, narrowly losing 2-1 after leading for much of the game (editor and beat them last weekl). This was probably the teams best performance of the season despite the result. A top five position is the ultimate aim in order that the team complete in the top division next season. Top scorer to date is Jonny Aitkenhead with 11 goals and he is also top of the players man of the match voting after some excellent performances. Special mention to the defence who, in the league have only let in an average of 1.27 goals per game, not bad for kids football! UNDER 12's - despite losing their opening match the U12's have now gone 13 League games unbeaten. There have been some personnel changes both coaching and playing, but this appears to have strengthened the teams position. After a very successful summer tour of the local 6-a-side tournaments we are improving with every game and playing some excellent football. Losing in the cup was a disappointment but it was one of those days. We had 80% of the play but a well organised Malmesbury side snatched it with 5 minutes remaining. Still, as all good managers say, we can concentrate on the League now, where we have a good chance of challenging for honours. Five of the boys are included in the Swindon and District rep side, and a few are being watched by Football League clubs. Future events include a match against Watford FC U12's and summer tour to Prague. UNDER 13's - Having a number of new players join at the start of the season we were unsure of how the team would gel together and our expectations for the season were as a result, fairly limited. However after a shakey start, the team put in a run of 5 wins on the trot (league and cup) with the front pairing scoring 21 goals between them, the number now standing at 33. Notable amonst these victories were a 6-3 defeat of Wroughton and a 6-4 win over Westside. At the moment, with four games to play, we stand third or fourth in the League, which is probably where we will finish. Overall we are very pleased with both the teams commitment and attitude and they are certainly the best squad of players we have coached.



Carl Wilkins (27) Keeper signed from Abingdon United in November. Has also turned on for Milton United.

Andrew Parrott (21) Versatile young player who is capable of playing in midfield o defence. Strong and aggressive with a good work rate. Previously with Banbury United Chris Jackson (19) Young defender signed in early February who started the season wid Southern League side Banbury United.

Jon Muttock (29) Signed in the summer from Witney Town. Vastly experienced centre hal who is good in the air and likes to get forward whenever possible. Previous clubs include Carterton Town and Oxford City for whom he appeared in the 1996 FA Vase Final.

Jason Allen (29) Usually a defender but can play up front from where he has scored severa vital goals for the club in recent seasons. Has also played for Buckingham Town and his hometown team, Bicester. A member of the Leagues Representative side.

Andy Parsons (26) A summer recruit from Division One side Ardley United. Midfielder who covers a lot of ground and has added some "bite" to the side. Has already shown his worth with several well taken goals this season.

Ben Milner (21) Very promising young forward who joined the club last season from Oxford Senior League side Ruscote Sports. Strong and powerful target man with an eye for goal. Was joint top scorer last season and definitely one for the future. Another member of the Leagues Representative side.

Darren McNamara (27) Another summer signing who has improved in stature as the season has progressed. Captain of the side who was a goal scorer in Oxford City's FA Vasc semi Final win in 1996. Has also played for Witney Town, Thame United, Chesham, Abingdon Town and Marlow.

Rhydian Purnell (25) Joined Brackley last season from Division One side Easington Sports, although he had also been with us on and off over the past few seasons. Aggressive young midfield player.

Cliff Cousins (35) Experienced defender who lists Swindon Town, Aylesbury United and Banbury United amongst his previous clubs.

Anton Sambrook (25) Another former Banbury United player who is in his second season with the club. Works hard in the middle of the bank but is equally at home in defence.

Darren Beckett (19) Local lad who broke into the first team last season. Has recently returned from a spell with Ryman League side Abingdon Town and has slotted into a full back role straight away.

Adam Beckett (20) Given his chance this season through injuries and suspensions and has put his case forward for a permanent place with several impressive displays and some vital goals.

Mark Thomas (35) Experienced striker who returned to the club from Ardley United in November. This popular player has a good goal scoring record with all his previous clubs which include Bicester Town, Abingdon Town, Witney and Oxford City.

Adam Dedman (19) A young defender who joined the club back in November. Was previously on Northampton Towns books for a number of years. Has also played for Buckingham Town.

Phil Rodney (32) Striker with a proven track record who joined the club from Carteston Town in January. Previously with Abingdon Town and Ardley United. Also played for Brackley in the late 80's.

Nigel Jenkins Striker who has returned to the club at the end of January after a season and a half with neighbours Bicester Town

Peter Foley (Manager) Took over from Terry Muckelberg in November. Peter was Oxford United's top scorer of all time until John Aldridge broke his record. Former Manager of Oxford City, Marlow and Ardley, he took Marlow to the FA Cup 3rd round, reformed Oxford City by winning three league titles in four seasons and won the Hellenic League Division One three years in a row with Ardley.

BRACKLEY TOWN FC

A BRIEF HISTORY

The first records of Brackley Town Football Club can be traced back to 1890 and around the turn of the century they were a prominent side in the South Northants / North Oxfordshire area. At one time the name of Tottenham Hotspur appeared on their fixture list, London being just a short journey away on the newly opened Great Central Railway.

The club then slipped into relative obscurity, competing mainly at a very Junior level. Most of the time before the war was spent in the Oxfordshire League, their games being played in Manor Road, before they transferred to the North Bucks League in the post war years. Here they stayed until 1968 when they took what appeared to be a step down the ladder by joining the Banbury and District League. During this time they had moved their ground to the Buckingham Road with the changing facilities and headquarters situated in the Plough public house.

In 1974 they moved back to the North Bucks League and this coincided with a move to their current ground in Churchill Way. A small clubhouse and changing rooms were built and within 3 years they had made the major step up into the Hellenic League. They stayed in Division One until 1983, winning the KO Cup in their final season. They then made the move into the United Counties League, winning the Division One title at the first attempt. Promotion into the Premier Division followed and as a result of this the club

achieved Senior status.

After finishing in the bottom half of the league for the first few seasons, the club then experienced their most successful season ever in 1988/89 when they were runners up in the League and Northamptonshire Senior Cup. On the way to the County Cup Final they had beaten Conference side Kettering

Town under the newly erected floodlights.

As invariably happens, the side then broke up and there followed several years of real struggle at the foot of the League with the survival of the club in real doubt at times. The 1992/93 season ended with them having the worst playing record of any Senior side in the country. It was only the fact that the title winning sides in Division One did not have the required facilities for elevation into the top section that saved them from relegation.

Drastic action was obviously necessary and accordingly the club was restructured and became a Limited Company. In 1994 they moved back across the pyramid into the Hellenic League. A move prompted by their geographical location. After a mediocre first season, things improved dramatically during the 1995/96 campaign. Phil Lines, who was Manager of the successful side in the late eighties, took charge again and a runners-up position was achieved in his first season, 1996/97 saw them go one better and win the Premier Division title.

With the decision already taken to aim for promotion, minor miracles were then performed in a short space of time in order to make the grade for elevation into the Dr Martens League.

The nucleus of the previous title winning side together with some astute signings saw the side finish a respectable 13th in the Midland Division.

The job now was to consolidate and build on what had been achieved in such a short space of time. However, events then seemed to conspire against them during the close season with the resignation of Lines and the departure of almost all the side he had assembled. With the new management team then assembling a team to compete in the Midland Division again the unfathomable decision to move the club into the Southern section of the League was broken to the club just one week before the AGM. A move which would stretch finances and player availability to the limits. Protests fell on deaf ears and there followed a season of real struggle as the predictions of doom came to fruition. Joint Managers Jon Blencowe and Bob Raynor found it impossible to field a side capable of competing at this level with the finances available to them. The cost of travelling to such far flung outposts as the Isle of Wight and Margate proved too much and the club went into voluntary liquidation in February 1999 with debts of over £100,000. The club survived at the last minute as Mike Bosher and Ray Styles stepped in to buy the assets and ensure that the season was completed. Having in no small way helped to bankrupt the club, the Southern League then added insult to injury by deciding that the "new" club was not the one that was accepted at the start of the season and they were therefore demoted back to the Hellenic League. Not their first choice but there was no option.

Former player, Terry Muckelberg, was appointed Manager at the start of the 1999/2000 season and made an excellent start in trying to guide the club back to its former heights. The experienced Peter Foley took over from Terry in November 2000. With a thriving Youth coaching scheme in operation, work recently finished to extend and improve the social facilities, and the club once again back on a stable financial footing, sights are now set on a quick move back up the Pyramid..


Club News/Requests


