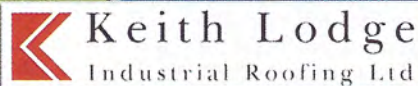

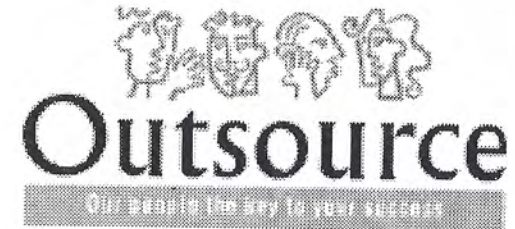

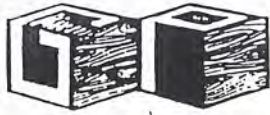

I am sure that those of you who were here on Saturday, and thank you again for your tremendous support, will agree that we made Swindon Supermarine work hard for the three points, and indeed a draw would have been a fair result. Given some of our recent lacklustre displays I was pleased with the overall team performance on Saturday. We frustrated them by not giving them time in midfield, and in turn managed to produce some half chances that could have brought the points our way. Seasons Extension

The League Management Committee has agreed a six-day extension of the season for completion of League matches. With a number of clubs facing up to three midweek matches towards the end of season the extra days to the 11th May will assist in the spread of fixtures and possible over tiredness of players.

With further inclement weather causing most of the midweek fixtures to be postponed a quorum of the management committee have agreed that all outstanding cup competitions will be decided on a one game basis on the ground of the first named in the tie. The fixtures will be played to completion with extra time and penalty kicks, if required. The Floodlit Cup Final will be played as a one off fixture this coming Thursday night when Swindon Supermarine entertain Gloucester United, the kick off is 7.30pm.

Southall Town Secure New Site

Southall Town learnt this week that Southall Borough Council has agreed to lease the club a five-acre site in Glade Lane. It is hoped to have the football facilities ready for season 2002-2003, the football facility will initially be built to 'Dr Martens' Premier Division standards. Once the ambitious plans are fully implemented there should be a Restaurant & Bar, Fitness Gym, Sauna, Squash Courts and a Swimming Pool on site.

Foundation Funding Flows In

Following the grant made to Henley Town last year the Football Foundation Stadia Improvement Committee have recently approved grants to Abingdon United and Swindon Supermarine. Abingdon United will receive £70,000 towards the cost of new changing and committee rooms as well as help with new team dug outs. Supermarine are due to receive a little over £30,000 for a new floodlighting system. Other bids from member clubs have been made to the Stadia Improvements Fund and news is awaited.

The place to be on Easter Sunday for all football lovers is Marriott's Stadium, Witney. The reason Witney Academy have organized a Charity Match between Witney Town Old Boys and Aston Villa All Stars, the game kicks off at 3pm on Sunday April 15th. I am informed that many stars of the past are due to play in this match that is to raise funds for Witney Community Hospital and Witney Academy Coaching Foundation. Added attractions are a Car Boot sale (1pm to 3pm), Bouncy Castle, Children's Rides, Half time Penalty Shoot out plus a raffle and auction of promises from many business's and football clubs. Well worth a visit.
