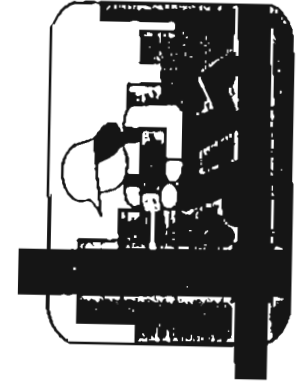

North Leigh FC can hold their heads high after two tough games against Ryman's League Division One title challengers Thame United. Despite going out to an 87<sup>th</sup> minute winning goal in the semi final replay of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup played at Thame's Windmill Road ground, (the clubs tossed a coin for venue and Thame won) North Leigh did the Cherry Red Records Hellenic League proud. In the build up to the match Thame manager Andy Sinnott is quoted as saying, "North Leigh cannot be taken lightly, they are a quality team with players capable of coming at us. We shall have to be up for it physically and mentally if we are to have a chance of reaching the final". After the match a Thame club member told Barry Norton, North Leigh's Press Officer, "North Leigh have given us as difficult a couple as any team we have faced in the Ryman's League this season". 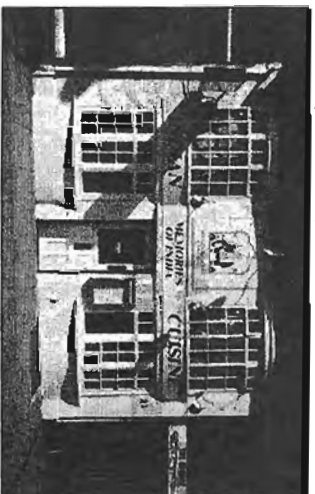

## North Leigh Football Club

North Leigh were formed in 1908, but it was only following the Second World War that they started to make their mark in the Witney and District League.

They won the Witney and District League Premier Division title seven times in the 1950s and also enjoyed success in the Oxfordshire Senior Cup. In the 1980s they resumed their trophy winning habits with five successive Witney and District League titles earning them a place in the Hellenic League Division 1 for the season 1990/91.

They enjoyed a good first season in the Hellenic League, finishing in 4<sup>th</sup> position and being the Division's highest goal scorers apart from Champions Cinderford Town. In their second season they again achieved 4<sup>th</sup> position, averaging two points per game, scoring 84 goals in the process.

In their third season, they finished runners up to Tuffley Rovers in Division 1 and so took their place in the Hellenic League Premier Division along with the Champions.

Their first FA Challenge Vase campaign in the 1992/93 season saw them progress to the second round by defeating Flight Refuelling, Fairford Town and Bristol Manor Farm, before losing 3-0 to Cranleigh. 1993/94 also saw them progress to the second round as they defeated Wessex League opponents Swanage Town and Christchurch before losing 2-1 at Thame United.

In 1997/98 they reached the second round of the FA Vase for the third time before losing to Elmore. They finished the season in 4<sup>th</sup> place in the Hellenic League Premier Division, and capped their season off by reaching the final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup where they were only narrowly beaten by their West Oxfordshire rivals Witney Town 1-0 after extra time.

During North Leigh's history, they have also won the Oxfordshire Junior Shield, the Oxfordshire Charity Cup and the Oxfordshire Youth Cup twice.

Improved facilities at their Eynsham Park ground include floodlights, a stand incorporating approximately 150 seats, and for the start of season 1998/99, a £100,000 changing room block including a committee room, kitchen and public toilets.

This will hopefully help this progressive West Oxfordshire club to consolidate their status in senior football.

**Stuart Huxley** - Product of the club's youth policy. Very quick and skilful player. Fine prospect for the future.

**Tony Grant** - Joined the club last season from local league side Enstone. Strong tackling defender who likes to go forward.

**Mark Jackson** - Defender/Midfield - Recently re-joined the club after a working holiday abroad and laterally with Thame Ltd. Very quick, skilful and hardworking player. Product of the club's youth policy.

**Sean Batt** - Midfield and Captain - Re-joined the club last season for a 2<sup>nd</sup> spell and ended up among the league's leading goal scorers. Huge influence in midfield.

**Nick Hughes** - Midfield - 3<sup>rd</sup> season with the club following his signing from Clacfield. Tireless worker and strong in the tackle. Scorer of vital goals.

**Darren Malsey** - Midfield - Re-joined the club towards the end of last season after a spell with Brackley Town. Strong tackling player and another who is a big influence on the team.

**Joe Burnell** - Defender/Midfield - Joe is a current member of the club's very successful Allied Counties Youth team. Plays wide right. A tireless worker who has a great future with the club.

**Janle Jackson** - Midfield - Also recently re-joined the club after a time abroad and a spell with Thame Ltd. A playmaker and tireless worker in midfield and another fine ex youth team product.

### Craig Pearman

**Midfield/Forward** - Recently re-joined the club after a spell with Brackley Town. Craig was a member of the club's highly successful Youth Team in 98/99 and an ever present in the first team. Strong running, skilful and versatile player who scores vital goals.

**Andy McCabe** - Another former youth team player who secured a regular first team place in 98/99. Excellent left foot and loves to run at defences.

**Wayne Bowles** - Defender/Midfield - Recently re-joined the club from Witney Academy and prior to that a lengthy spell with local side Bampton Town after his earlier time at North Leigh. Strong tackling player with excellent all round skills who normally plays on the left side of defence/midfield.

Three games to report since the last programme, away to Milton United Reserves and Kidlington Reserves and last Saturday's second round cup fixture against Highworth Town Reserves.

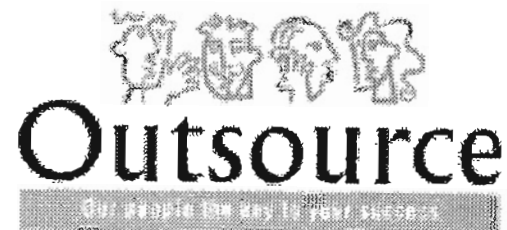
I am pleased to say that they have continued their unbeaten run for the season and have a semi-final to look forward too.

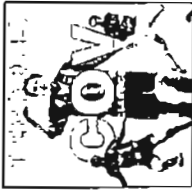
