HENLEY TOWN PREPARE FORTHE PREMIER DIVISION

Ground improvements to bring Henley Town's Triangle ground in Mill Lane up to Hellenic League Premier Division standard are well underway. The base for a 60-seater stand, with facilities for the disabled, has been laid and the main stand structure will be up before the end of June. Cabling for three-phase electricity has been brought to the ground from the other side of the railway line and floodlighting will be installed as soon as the season ends. Standing cover for at least 50 people will be put up and six foot fencing will enclose the ground. New pitch barriers are to be put up and a pitch irrigation system installed. The dressing rooms will be brought up to Southern League standard and alterations are also taking place to improve the bar area and clubroom. Most of the funding for the improvements has come from the Football Foundation, Henley Town Council and the South Oxfordshire District Council and the remainder from club functions. The Hellenic League side has applied to enter the FA Vase and the Youth team to join the Allied Counties Youth League for the 2001-2002 season.

Floodlit Cup Final

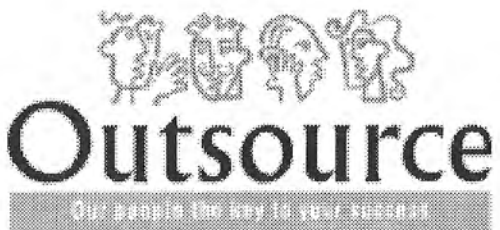
Thursday evening eventually saw the final match in this season's 'Norman Matthews' Floodlit Cup competition. On a bitterly cold April evening three intrepid League Officers, the Chairman, Referee Appointment's Secretary and the General Secretary visited the very much improved Swindon Supermarine ground for the final between the champions elect of the Premier Division in Swindon Supermarine and league new boys and champions elect of Division One (West) Gloucester United. The pitch was in reasonable condition although a little

bumpy in some areas considering the rainfall of recent months and the number of postponements due to the waterlogged state of the pitch. There were very few goal scoring chances for either team due to the defensive qualities of the competing clubs, especially the respective center backs, Pete Farrow and Mick Casey of 'Marine' and Andy Pritchett and Neil Long of 'United'. Most of the play was in the center third of the pitch with both sets of midfield players working hard. The only goal of the game came in the 7th minute of added time in the 2nd half when Gloucester goalkeeper Craig Barnfield, who had not made a mistake during the game, mishandled the collection of the ball and dropped it at the feet of Steve Davies who knocked the ball home from three yards. 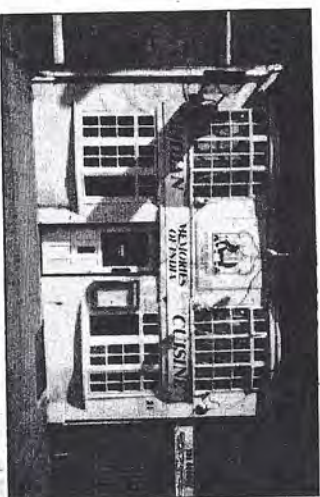

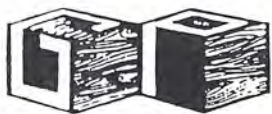

HELLENIC LEAGUE

THURSDAY EVENING eventually saw the final of this season's Norman Matthews Floodlit Cup competition.

Champions elect of the Premier Division Swindon Supermarine played league new boys and champions elect of Division One (West) Gloucester United.

The only goal came in the seventh minute of added time in the second half when Gloucester goalkeeper Craig Barnfield mishandled the ball and dropped it at the feet of Steve Davies who knocked it home from three yards. Supermarine retain the Floodlit Cup they won by beating Banbury United over two legs last season and look forward to another possible cup double.

Saturday's fixtures in the Premier Division of the Cherry Red Records Hellenic League saw victories for Swindon Supermarine with a Tate Hulbert goal after 78 minutes at Almondsbury Town, second-placed Brackley cleaned up in the Forest scoring five without reply at Harrow Hill through Sole, Parsons, McNamara, Milner and Dedman.

Carterton crashed at home to bottom club Milton United 3-0 and Highworth Town collapsed at home against Abingdon United. Graham Sunners scored for Highworth in the 41st minute but a pair from Kai Ridley and contributions from Tom Larman, Carl Henry and a Matt Shelton penalty secured the points for Abingdon.

Other Premier Division matches saw wins for Shortwood United at home to Bicester Town by 3-1 Matt Green scoring two with one from Richard Evans replying to a Paul Hammond penalty early in the game. Wootton Bassett edged out North Leigh 1-0 and Yate Town continued their steady progress up the table with a 2-1 win at Wantage Town.

The top game in Division One (West) saw second-placed Ardley United entertain third-placed Bishops Cleeve, a Tom Goldthorpe goal after 22 minutes secured the points for Ardley who have struggled of recent weeks.

Leaders Gloucester United were at home to Letcombe and scored eight without reply, almost certainly guaranteeing them the title in their first season in the league.

At the other end of the table Old Woodstock Town have been dragged into the relegation battle after facing Ross Town in what was virtually a 'six pointer'. Ross eased past Woodstock with a 4-1 win. Their goals came from Guy Brain (18th minute), a brace from Watkins and one from Gwynne, Woodstock replied with a Sam Rahmouni penalty just before half time.

Malmesbury Victoria played Easington Sports and shared the points. 'Digger' Gardner gave Easington the lead after 20 minutes, the equaliser coming in the 67th minute from James Rowe.

The Division One (East) champions elect, Henley Town, beat RS Basingstoke with goals from Nicky Nash, James Hollidge and Paul Lawrence. In form Harrow Hill Rovers went down 2-1 to Penn & Tylers Green while bottom club Aston Clinton visited Eton Wick and left pointless, score 2-0.
