Information was given to me last Saturday that Almondsbury Town lost regular supporter Mike Carroll on the evening of Thursday 19 th April. Mike had attended the reserve fixture that his son Anthony played in against Milton United and suffered a heart attack in the club car park, despite efforts by Para-medics they were unable to resuscitate Mike who was in his mid fifties. The leagues condolences go to Anthony and his family at the time of this sad loss.

Five-Decade Record

Former General Secretary Trevor Cuss achieved a unique and probably never to be bettered milestone last Saturday when coming on as a substitute for Clanfield in the Reserve Division Two (East) fixture at Brackley Town. Trevor has now played Hellenic League football in five decades, this a second milestone for Trevor who very much cherishes the date of 20 th April 1996 when he lined up with his sons Giles and Lewis in a reserve match playing for Clanfield FC against Yarnton FC. Well-done Trevor.

Middle Barton regular Keith Harrison suffered a serious injury last Saturday from an innocuous challenge. The injury, a severed Achilles tendon, resulted in a lengthy operation on the Saturday evening to repair the damage. Returning to The Premier Division

Henley Town's win at Harrow Hill Rovers on Thursday evening has almost certainly secured the clubs promotion back into the Hellenic League Premier Division after a break of 30 years. Thursday's points guarantees at least runners-up spot with only Quarry Nomads mathematically able to attain more points. Henley, who rejoined the league through last year's merger with the Chiltonian League, had to resign from the Hellenic in 1971 when their Reading Road ground was sold for industrial development by the landowner.

Academy Partnership

Swindon Supermarine Football Club and New College Swindon announced this week their intention to form a football partnership for next season.

New College had previously run the Academy in partnership with Forest Green Rovers but this agreement was terminated recently. Through the Wiltshire CFA, New College was introduced to Supermarine and both parties have agreed to work together to form a new football partnership. Swindon Supermarine player/coach Tom Jones (formerly Swindon Town Youth manager) will be the Director of Football and he will oversee the coaching development of around 30 young players 16-18. Last Monday evening Swindon Supermarine FC club officials and New College representatives met with parents and players to launch the new partnership. 'Marine' Club Chairman Steve Moore said, " We were delighted to be approached and are thrilled that we are New College's partners in the development of these young players. We anticipate that the players will represent us in the Wiltshire County Youth League as well as our Hellenic League sides" Wiltshire FA Development Manager Barry Stephens commented that this arrangement was a major boost for Wiltshire football and if the partnership proved a success then the Wilts FA would look to develop further similar schemes throughout the County
