

Welcome to Highworth Town

A warm welcome to our near neighbours Highworth Town for this afternoon's Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. We hope all from Highworth enjoy their visit to our new ground and wish them a safe short journey home.

Last season will be remembered by Highworth for their terrific run in the FA Vase where they fought all the way through to the semi-final stage. Having tasted success in that competition last season I am sure all at Highworth will be looking to go one game further this season and make the final at Wembley.

In the two games between the sides last season it was honours even. In a game again played on August Bank Holiday Monday, Highworth left Cirencester with all 3 points following a solitary goal scored by Callum Parsons. The return at Highworth was just 4 days before the first leg of their FA Vase semi-final with North Shields and their mind would have been on other things as we triumphed 5-1 at the Elms. I am sure Highworth will be looking to avenge that heavy defeat as no-one likes to lose by that score line in a local derby encounter. In that last meeting Nathan Gambling helped himself to a hat-trick and there were further goals from Dan Bailey and Steve Robertson. All in all the two sides have met on 35 occasions when both sides have been in the Hellenic League with Highworth just edging it by 17 wins to 16 for Bassett, just 2 games ending in draws. So history indicates that there should be a winner here today.

Due to print deadlines these notes are being written ahead of the games at Lydney (on Wednesday) and Ascot (on Saturday). Apologies that the statistics and league tables will not be fully up to date, although the stats should include the midweek games including the Lydney trip, even if my notes do not.

At the time of writing Highworth had made a cracking start to the season with 5 wins from 5 games, including tough matches away to Bracknell, Ascot and Knaphill and home games against newly prompted Tuffley Rovers who have also made a useful start to the season nd Brimscombe & Thrupp. TJ Bohane has carried on from where he left off last season and currently leads the goal scoring chart with 7 goals to his name from those 5 games. Last season, and for the second season running, he scored 40 or more goals for Highworth.

Reserves

The Reserves narrowly lost their second game of the season away at Wroughton (2-3) and then lost by a solitary goal against Melksham Town. On Tuesday night they played their first league game here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground when Chippenham Park were the visitors and secured their first win with a 3-1 success. Two goals for Brendan Shaw and one for Rich Clark did the damage. This result lifted the Reserve side up into 7th place in the league table.

The opening set of fixtures for the Under 18 Floodlit side have now being scheduled. Paul Gerrish's side kick-off with a home game against Calne Town on Thursday 3rd September. From The Dugout

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to John Fisher and his Highworth side to our new home here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground. We hope you have an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home. I am expecting today will see us achieve what will be our biggest crowd of the season, even larger than the crowd of 121 we attracted for the Bracknell FA Cup tie a fortnight ago.

Due to Bank Holiday print deadlines these notes are being drafted ahead of Wednesday's visit to Lydney and the game at Ascot on Saturday. Hopefully by the time you read these notes we would have 6 more points to our name. After Saturday's heavy defeat we certainly need to get back to winning ways as soon as possible and this local derby against Highworth gives us the chance to put 3 more valuable points on the board. Whilst Highworth have started the season well anything can happen in a local derby game. Remember the last time that the two sides met we defeated them 5-1 although I will admit our visitors had other things on their mind back in March when we last met.

After Saturday's disappointing defeat I have decided that Flackwell are something of a bogey side for us and I'm not looking forward to playing them again. Last season, we were on a nine-match unbeaten run before they came to us and beat us and then this year, we were unbeaten in the league right up until Saturday when they beat us again. Opponents - History

Highworth Town • Club History

Highworth Town Football Club was formed in 1893. They joined the Cirencester & District League and it took them some time to record their first honours, until 1909-10 in fact, when they won both the Swindon Junior Cup and the local Advertiser Cup, a cup they were to capture again in 1912-13. After winning the Cirencester & District League Division Two Championship in 1931-32, Highworth moved to the Swindon & District League, where they completed the Third Division Championship and Swindon Junior Cup double in 1933-34.



The 1950s saw Highworth make a dramatic rise through the local football ranks. They won the Swindon & District League Third Division title again in 1954-55 and then the Division Two title the following season. One more season was needed to clinch the Division One title and also the Wilts Junior Cup. They then went on to win the Premier Division title in 1957-58, along with the Faringdon Thursday Memorial Cup and the following season saw them Premier Champions again, also winning the Advertiser Cup.

Highworth continued to dominate the Swindon & District Premier Division in the 1960s, winning four successive titles from 1960-61 and another hat-trick from 1965-66 to 1967-68, making seven titles in eight seasons. They reached the final of the Wilts Senior Cup for the first time in 1962-63 and won it the following season.

There was a switch to the Wilts Combination League, where they finished as Runners-Up in Division Two in 1970-71. 1972-73 saw another Wilts Senior Cup victory and all this success prompted them to join the Hellenic League. They achieved their first honours in 1988-89, winning the First Division Challenge Cup and reached the final of the Wilts Senior Cup yet again.

They finally achieved Premier Division status in 1993-94 gaining promotion after finishing third in Division One. Since then they have been Winners of the Challenge Cup in 2011-12, Winners of the Wilts Senior Cup in 1995-96, 1997-98, 2008-09 and again in 2014-15, Winners of the Supplementary Cup in 1998-99 and Runners-Up in 2003-04, Runners-Up in the Premier Division in 1999-2000 and Winners of the the Premiership Title in 2004-05.

However, their greatest achievement to date was in reaching the Semi-Final of the FA Vase in 2015, where they were knocked out by eventual winners, North Shields in a closely fought two-legged tie.

Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents no longer competing, today's featured team is.....

Swindon Victoria

Swindon Town's Wembley Wonders of 1969 are quite rightly recognised as the greatest team the town has known. But, while Don Rogers, Roger Smart and company became the first side from Swindon to taste success in a national knockout cup, they were only the second side bearing the town's name to have reached the final of such a competition. Instead, the honour of being the first lies with the forgotten heroes of nonleague Swindon Victoria. And it was over 90 years ago that they ventured to the final of the FA Amateur Cup, where they lost 4-2 to Bishop Auckland at Middlesbrough's Ayresome Park.

Long since vanished from the local scene – the Victoria side merged with Malmesbury Town following the 1974-75 season, their journey in the 1920-21 season, despite ending in defeat, can only be described as remarkable. It began in the qualifying rounds, and unconvincing victories over Spencer Moulton (3-2). Chippenham Town (3-1) and Peasedown (3-1 in a replay) secured a place in the first round proper, where the Vics were drawn to play against Clandown at their Wootton Bassett home. This tie took place on New Years Day, and the Victoria side saw in 1921 in some style, thrashing the Bath-based outfit 8-0.

The second round gifted the Wiltshire League team a trip to the south coast where they would face the Royal Marine Light Infantry side at Gosport. The Vics once again dominated, but could only muster a single goal – from captain Billy Dawson. This though was enough to send them into the last 16 where the Swindonians were paired with Athenian League heavyweights Bromley - semi-finalists a season prior and winners in 1910/11. Sterling defensive play and a Poole penalty in the dying stages saw them through to the guarter finals though, where they were presented with the long journey north to face Northumberland side Willington. Another fantastic performance later and they were in the semis as Victoria snatched a 2-1 win, the goals coming from an own goal courtesy of the home side's keeper and Eggleton. There the Vics were drawn against Isthmian League Leystonstone, who had disposed of Oxford City as well as Wimbledon, in the semifinals. Going into the match - played on neutral territory at Reading's Elm Park - the Vics were not on their best form, and this seemed to have carried over as they trailed by a goal at the break having been completely outplayed. Yet, a fortunate equaliser from Cooper got them on level terms before a wonder strike from Rees put them ahead. Blunsden then capped off the comeback with a simple third.

History had been made as Victoria became the first team in Amateur Cup history to reach the final having had to negotiate the qualifying stages. But in their way in the showpiece stood the mighty Bishop Auckland - who made 18 trips to the final in all. After another lengthy trip up north - the team almost didn't make it to Middlesbrough due to a miners' strike - the Vics wilted in front of a crowd of over 25,000. A Roberts strike cancelled out the Bishop's second minute goal, but the eventual winners raced into an unassailable 4-1 half time lead. A Poole penalty offered hope late on, but it was not to be. Reaching the FA Amateur Cup final – in only their third ever appearance in the competition proper - should have been the beginning of something special for Swindon Victoria, just like Chippenham Town's run to the FA Vase final a decade ago.

The Vics certainly seemed poised to go on to bigger and better things in the non-league game too. In addition to being Amateur Cup runners-up, they came narrowly close to reaching the first round proper of the FA Cup and went onto win both the Wiltshire County League and Senior Cup that same season. History also appeared to be on their side. The Amateur Cup honours board reads not only like a who's who of non-league

football, but also includes names such as Middlesbrough, Wimbledon, Wycombe Wanderers and Barnet. Yet the Vics were only to make two more appearances in the main rounds of the competition. before the decision to pay players - thus revoking their status as amateurs - saw them barred from entering From there on, the club suffered a slow and painful demise. Only a couple of seasons were spent in the Western League during the twenties before a return to local football and then the eventual merger, which was brought about primarily by their lack of a permanent







Bassett Legend - Paul Davis

Paul "PD" Davis falls into the true WBTFC legend status having been a member of the County Cup winning sides of both 1998-99 and 2000-01.

Paul had first joined Wootton Bassett Town as a 16 year old in Season 1991-92 having played 8 games for a Wootton Bassett Sports side managed by the Programme Editor who still remembers the day when Mick Woolford came to watch the Sports at the Comprehensive School and quickly followed in with the 7 day notice of approach.




PD was always going to be a player who would go onto great things as in the Wootton Bassett Sports End of Season Presentation Evening programme, in the Manager's unofficial awards section, it was noted that the "Biggest Disappointment of the Season" was "Losing Paul Davis" to Wootton Bassett Town"!



Paul was a player who never gave anything less than 100% from start to finish in a match and also expected the same from his team mates. If today's players think Dip gives them a hard time it is because he learnt from playing alongside PD. A towering centre-half who not only kept the opposition forwards at bay but also found the net regularly at the other end.

Paul made his final appearances in Season 2006-7, some 15 years after his debut for the Club. He then played for the Reserves before finally retiring and then taking over the management of the Reserves for a spell.

Still a regular spectator at Bassett games where he remains a true Club legend.



Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: If I remember rightly you never shied away from a tackle and am I correct in thinking you picked up a serious injury the following season (2006-7) that brought an end to your playing days at Bassett?

RU: Yes, that tackle still makes me cringe today. I like to think I played a hard but fair game. That tackle was disgusting. We were playing a London area team and I'd set up a couple of goals and was having a strong influence on the game. Their centre half was clearly trying to take me out of the game, elbowing me at headers and booting my legs out from under me on another occasion. My left foot was planted and I was turning over my right shoulder towards goal when he hit me flat out, on my blind side, wrapping both his



legs around my left knee. The resulting injuries were such that the surgeon didn't believe I'd done it playing football. Fractured tibial plateau, detached medial ligament above the knee, fully torn posterior cruciate ligament and ruptured popliteus muscle. The same injuries that are seen in a pedestrian that has been hit by a car. The resulting surgery and long recovery back to strength and fitness held some very dark days for me. I was lucky to have a great surgeon and physio.

MS: Did you play for anyone else after that?

RU: No, even once I was back to full fitness. I knew really that my playing days were over; I was slowing down and struggling to compete against the youngsters. I'm way too competitive to just go out and make up numbers and not just with the opposition but with myself as well. Also, I was about to move to Canada full time for the snowboarding and downhill mountain biking and didn't want to jeopardize that. The surgeon had warned me that I couldn't afford to injure that knee again.

MS: Did you ever play alongside and against your brother-in-law Paul Comer who, in my opinion, was one of the best goalkeepers to ever pull on the Number One shirt for Bassett and also a very good fullback?

RU: Yes, Paul was without a doubt one of the best goalkeepers around, he had tremendous passion and commitment (still does). He was dating my sister Debbie, so I really looked up to him. I'd grown up seeing him play at Bassett and Hungerford where the fans loved him. I remember them beating Newbury, which was a big deal, and there was a contingent of fans behind his goal just chanting away, "COMER, COMER" over and over. I played both with Paul and against him. He took me out to Wroughton and introduced me to the club for a preseason friendly. Somehow we ended up playing against each other. I latched onto a poor back pass as he rushed out, and I scored...I won't embarrass him and tell you how, but he was NOT happy with me! On another occasion we were playing together at Highworth, I think that too was a friendly. I tracked the winger all the way back from the half way line to the back post and as the cross came over I meant to flick the ball out behind the goal to safety, only I mistimed the header and put it in the top left hand corner, again, he was not happy...I think that was the last time he took me to another club!

MS: Your young nephew Dan is now playing for Bassett and was man of the match in the first two games this season. Any plans to come back over to the UK and watch Dan play at our new ground and catch up with old team mates?

RU: I would love to be there today to see Dan play and catch up with all the old Bassett and Highworth folks! I am not surprised at all that Dan has been Man of the Match twice already. I was blown away at times by his talent as a youngster, he could kill a ball dead, first touch with his left or right foot and play really quality passes through the midfield. I thought I could play a bit, but Dan is twice the player I was. I really admire him...actually I think I might be his biggest fan...after Paul! I'm hoping I'll make it back before Christmas this year. It'll have been 4 years. It's really hard being this far away from the family and missing out on these kinds of occasions. You don't need me to wish you luck today Dan, just do what you always do.

MS: Finally I ask everyone this question. Bassett bobble at Rylands Way – fact or just an excuse used by players with poor ball control?

RU: Come on Mark...FACT! My touch wasn't that bad! Actually it was, I heard it a few times over the years, particularly from the Highworth boys that my second touch was usually a tackle. I do remember the "Bassett bobble" working in my favour for one of the first goals I scored at Rylands Way. I got onto a through ball one on one, the keeper rushed out and as the ball rolled through it suddenly "bobbled" up for me and I lobbed it over the keeper's head....lucky for me, because if I'd had to hit it off the ground it would have ended up in the tennis courts.

MS: Well this has probably been the longest interview yet and some really cracking answers to my questions, so thank you for taking the time to do this for the programme. Roger is never going to believe me that you mentioned his perm without any prompting from me as I had asked Stevie Thomas about it when interviewing him earlier in the season! Thanks again Rich, and all at Bassett look forward to seeing you later in the year.

RU: Thanks Mark and great job, I really enjoyed answering those questions.

Five star Bassett give Highworth a hiding

The Elms, 17th March 2015

Nathan Gambling scored a second half hat-trick as a rampant team display delivered Wootton Bassett Town an emphatic 5-1 derby victory over Highworth Town.

Thirteen years had passed since Bassett last tasted victory at The Elms, and this victory was made even sweeter as the three points lifted the team into eleventh, above Oxford City Nomads. And with five games – all at home – now remaining in this season, there's a great opportunity to ensure a record high finish in the Hellenic League Premier Division. Highworth, also have their eyes on a record, that being a place at Wembley in the FA Vase final. With the first leg of their semi-final on Saturday, it was therefore little surprise to see John Fisher field a rotated team. It was by no means weak though; the presence of 'keeper Gary Stevens and top scorer TJ Bohane, two of the main heroes of their superb Vase run, in the starting eleven attested to that. That selection may have been intended to frighten Bassett. But the visitors were in no way cowed and were on their game from the opening whistle.

With less than two minutes on the dock Bassett were ahead. James Skinner played a short free kick from the left wing to Dan Bailey and the midfielder struck a daisycutter from the edge of the area that Stevens got a hand to but failed to keep out. It should really have been two in the sixth minute when a blocked Callum Wright effort fell to Gambling, who had just the 'keeper to beat. But Stevens redeemed himself and parried away. In a rather frantic opening, Highworth – whose play was sharp in the final third – carved out two chances. The first saw Darren Smart arrow a low shot from twenty yards just wide of the left post before Bohane rose to head a Liam Edmondson cross onto the bar. Bassett quickly re-established authority though. Gambling was soon again denied at point blank range by Stevens as he flicked a shot towards goal following a driving run and cross from Dale Richards.

Then just before the half hour an expertly worked move doubled the lead. Steve Yeardley picked up possession on the right and burst inside before playing a pass into Gambling. With this back to goal, the forward steered a neat pass around the corner to strike partner Steve Robertson, who struck firmly into the bottom right corner. Again the advantage should have been extended further, but once more Stevens kept his side from being dead and buried before the break with a pair of saves at Robertson's feet. That meant that, although in a commanding position, Bassett were one wobble away from an uncomfortable half time team talk. They duly suffered one, their grievances with Olly Ballinger – who dished out five yellow cards to the visitors as half time approached – serving to distract them from the task in hand. And Highworth made their pressure count as James Skinner handled from a corner and Bohane sent Kurtis Sharkey the wrong way.

With a handful of players one misstep away from an early shower, it was imperative that Bassett refocused once the whistle to start the second half was blown. To their credit, they returned to the field sharp and determined to restore their two goal lead. In fact, a quick-fire double from Gambling made it 4-1 by the hour to effectively decide the outcome. His first came after a stunning, ruthless counter. Bassett broke decisively from a Highworth corner that failed to beat the first man. Yeardley clipped a diagonal ball for Skinner to race onto. He then threaded a pass through to Gambling, who buried beyond an exposed Gary Eggleton, a half time substitute.

Almost immediately from kick off Highworth conceded possession, and to compound matters for the hosts, Robertson was wrestled to the ground inside the box by Gareth Davies, who received his marching orders. From the spot Gambling coolly stroked home. With the extra man, Bassett pressed high against a Highworth

defence who were forced into frequently giving the ball away. Using this extra possession, the visitors stroked the ball around with further confidence, and numerous attacks could, and perhaps should, have made it five much earlier.

In the end it wasn't until the final kick of the game that Bassett made it a handful of goals for the evening as a poor touch from Eggleton when receiving a backpass was seized upon by Gambling and he completed his hat-trick by slotting in from a tight angle. Bassett – five games unbeaten in the league – are now rolling. The goal is now to keep that momentum going right until season's end.

Man of the Match: Nathan Gambling – the forward hassled the Highworth defence all night, took his three goals well and played a delightful measured pass to set up Steve Robertson. Were it not for some fine saves, he could have finished the night with more than just a hat-trick too.



Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: You obviously got to play with Paul Harrison back in the 1980s but did you also get to play against him and if so what do you recall from those encounters?

RU: It would have been in my very first season with the reserves which I think was 1986 or 87? I was a pretty skinny, shy kid and there were all these older established players around me that intimidated me, Paul included, so my memory of that time isn't great. It would have probably been towards the end of Paul's career, but I'm not 100% sure. I'm pretty sure I didn't play against Paul other than in training though!

MS: What is your fondest memory of your time with Wootton Bassett Town?

RU: It's difficult to pick out any one moment in my time at Bassett. I have many fond memories, from being a young kid and watching from the touchline, dreaming of being out there, to then being there alongside those players you looked up to and becoming a part of the club. It's not just the camaraderie of the team itself. It's the club and the people that make it work and the characters and banter around it that give me fond memories. I coach a bit here in Rossland and I'm on the club's youth committee with some very passionate Canadians. I try to explain the above to them to give them a sense of what it's like at a club in England, but they don't really get it because they've never experienced it.

MS: Rod Carter and Roger Williamson have served the club tremendously over the years what are your earliest memories of the two?

RU: I remember seeing Roger playing at Rylands Way in the early to mid 80s. It was his mop of curly hair that first caught my attention and reminded me of one of my heroes of the day, Graeme Souness...minus the moustache! Then later on I'd always see Roger Saturday mornings tolling away on the pitch. I think Rod was reserve team manager, or assistant manager when I started out and later secretary and he was always cheerful and chatty. Rod won't know this, but he had a calming effect on my pre-match nerves with those encounters. I just remember that both Roger and Rod ALWAYS seemed to be at the club and there was usually some funny banter going back and forth. Like you said Mark, they've both done a tremendous service to Wootton Bassett Town FC over the years.

MS: Who do you view as the best player you played alongside and who has been the best player you have played against in your career?

RU: It would have to be Wayne Hatswell on both counts. I remember playing against Supermarine for Highworth on one of those cold wet mid week cup games. I think Wayne was playing left back and I was playing either right back or right mid-field, so we came into contact early on in an explosive fashion and we battled it out for 90 minutes, fair but hard and physical. I remember thinking, who's this young kid that's giving me such a hard time and matching me blow for blow!? We later became friends through work and ended up playing together in central defence for the Deer's Leap. I felt really sorry for the opposition! Wayne went on to play for Oxford, Kidderminster Harriers and Chester, great player!

MS: It was a fellow Liverpool fan Burkie who brought you back to Bassett. How did that come about?

RU: Actually I think it was Danny Groom that brought me back to Bassett. He and Kenny Regan were managing the reserves. I was back from my snowboarding trips to Canada and wasn't going back that winter as I'd applied for residency and needed to work and save money. Danny talked me into playing for him that season. I was still pretty fit and must have been doing a good job because Burkie gave me a run out in the first team and I managed to hold down the central midfield position. I've got to say I felt a great sense of accomplishment on a couple of levels. At 37 and having not played competitively for 6 or 7 years, I thought I'd be happy to hold down a reserve team place, but first team was beyond any expectation. Years earlier I was really disappointed not to break into the first team at Bassett, so I eventually left and ended up at Highworth, and the first team there. I'd like to thank Burkie for that opportunity, it meant a lot to me.

MS: Burkie could talk for England which is why it took him so long to collect the milk money on his round at the end of the week. What were his team talks like and any funny moments you can recall?

RU: .Unfortunately Mark there's nothing that I can recall in particular...again the memory lets me down. I know there was a lot of very funny, very dry banter as you would expect from Burkie. When it was time for the team talks though, Paul got pretty serious. He took it personally when things weren't going well, a testament to his love of the club and the game I think.

MS: There were some characters in the dressing room that season; I am thinking Dwayne Quinn, Steve Bunting, Ben Gascoyne and Stu Hemsley. Did nights out in Old Town (your favourite nightspot according to your player profile in the programme for the game against Cricklade Town on 21st January 2006) get messy?

Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

This week with Richard Unwin

MS: Rich, thank you for agreeing to be interviewed for the programme. Facebook can be very useful in tracking down ex-players, especially those living overseas. I understand you are living in the Canadian mountains in Rossland, British Colombia - the Mountain Bike Capital of Canada. What was it that brought you to Canada?



RU: Hi Mark, it was great to hear from you after all these years and thanks for asking me to do the interview. It was actually the winters that drew me here. As well as the mountain bike scene. Rossland has a world class ski hill 3km up the road. I'd been away travelling for a while and afterwards spent a summer coaching football in the southern USA. I'd always wanted to improve my snowboarding and so came up to Canada to spend a winter here. One winter turned into four with trips back to England for the summers to work and I finally decided I had to move here.

MS: You are one of a number of players who have played for both Wootton Bassett Town and Highworth Town over the years; others include Dave Terry, Sean Terry, Steve Yeardley and current Highworth players Richie Saunders and Jonny Aitkenhead. As a Bassett boy how did you come to play for Highworth? Was it Mr Tanner the PE teacher at Bassett Comprehensive who introduced you to Highworth?

RU: No it wasn't actually. I hadn't seen Mr Tanner for years and didn't even know where he was until my debut at Highworth when I saw him with Mrs Tanner on the touchline. It was Rohan Haines that approached me after the Highworth 6-A-side tournament and asked if I was interested in coming to pre-season at Highworth

MS: I played for the youth teams of both Wootton Bassett Town and Highworth Town at the end of the 70s and early 80s and played a small handful of games for the first team of both clubs. When I progressed to adult football I made the decision to stay with Highworth mainly because of how I was treated by the people there. I am thinking here mainly about Rod Haines and, in particular, Dave Haines who in the early days used to drive over from Highworth to pick myself and Billy Wheeler up for training and matches and then take us back to Bassett afterwards. Nice people and true football people. What are your memories of Rod and Dave?

RU: That's amazing, and not surprising at all. I remember Rod always being there, helping out behind the scenes and I think working the bar too. I'm racking my brain to remember Dave though? The season I signed. Rohan Haines had taken over as player manager, with Tony Garland running the show from the touchline. I had a very similar experience Mark, everyone was so welcoming and I was instantly accepted into the fold at Highworth, not just by the management, but by the players and fans too. There was a very real sense of family where everyone socialised together and stuck around for drinks after the game, which, win or lose, was preceded by a rendition of American Pie led by Robbo (Sean Robinson) swinging from the rafters.

MS: The pitch at Highworth is notorious for the slope and the higher "top end" in one corner but once you have played there you get to know how to play that "top end" to your advantage. In my younger days I remember we had Kevin Higgs and Mickey New who used to play it brilliantly. In your time with Highworth what are your memories of the slope and who were the players in your day who took advantage of it?

RU: As a Highworth player you got used to it very quickly and it became an integral part of your game. Using the slope became subconscious, and you only become aware of it again when the opposition started moaning about it during the game, or on arrival at the ground. It was great for me because I wasn't the most skilful player and I could over hit long balls towards the club house knowing that it would hold up for Dave Toomey on the wing, or Stuart Gould on an overlap from full back to get on the end of. They both had frightening pace.

MS: Who were your colleagues at Highworth and did you get to play with the next generation of Haines', as, if I recall, Paul and Rohan became key players at Highworth?

RU: As I mentioned earlier, I came in on the tail end of Rohan's playing career and was fortunate enough to play alongside him and Paul. Rohan hung up his boots after a few games as player manager, but Paul carried on playing. It's such a long time ago now I struggle to remember all the names. Some memorable ones alongside Rohan and Paul would include Stuart Gould, Danny Yale, Dave and Jamie Toomey, Robbie Newnham, Rick Casey, Sean Robinson, I know there are more!?...sorry boys if I missed you out!

MS: I remember you playing for Wootton Bassett Town under Burkie in Season 2005-6 but you had obviously played for Bassett before then. How many seasons did you play for Bassett in total?

RU: Now I think about it after all these years, if I include the season in the U17/youth team. I think I only played for four or five seasons in all, seems way too few though! Maybe you have the actual records?

MS: Unfortunately we do not have appearance records only really goalscorers. Who were your team mates at Bassett in those early days?

RU: Some of the team mates that really stick out for me would have to include Danny Groom, Stevie Thomas, Dave Terry, Gary Dixon and Kenny Regan. I'd grown up watching those guys play and was a bit in awe of them. I'd seen Danny around Bassett since the early 80s and knew who he was and he struck me as being pretty cool (all the more so because he had Sue Costin on his arm!). When I began playing for the reserves as a teenager. Danny took me under his wing and looked after me and it was the start of a great friendship.

RWBTFC History On One Page

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the champion-ship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

Goals, no goals

DON'T get me wrong, I enjoy a good 0-0 draw. Defences on top, star strikers in back pockets, keepers smiling with their clean sheets.

And there's something beautiful about an organised 1-0 away win. You know the ones. Where a team shows zero ambition, plays one up front, defends superbly, frustrates the opposition by slowing the game down and then nicks a winner from their only foray into the opposition penalty box. I love those games. It shows all the discipline and nous required to win a game of football and get three points. But most of the time it's great to see an attacking team tear the opposition apart, pull them all over the pitch and bang in a load of goals.

A few Non-League strikers have been filling their boots already this season. Defenders best look away now, because what better place to start that Winchester City hot-shot Warren Bentley. After their opening two games in the Evo-Stik League Southern South & West, the 24-year had scored nine goals. That's NINE goals, in TWO games. Just 42 minutes into the new season, Bentley had five as the greedy goal machine helped his side batter Bridgwater Town 7-2. The following Tuesday he clearly let his level drop, managing just FOUR against Wimborne Town. Clearly the concept of defending had been abandoned altogether with Winchester running out 6-5 winners. You won't be surprised to know he'll soon be re-setting his 30 goal target if his ratio keeps up.

Then there's Gosport Borough's Justin Bennett. He's also seemingly decided hat-tricks are so last season. The top scorer in the Conference South last season, Bennett hammered four past Weston-super-Mare last Tuesday.

It's caught on in the FA Cup. AFC Liverpool's Steve Jones hit five in their 9-2 demolition of Chadderton in the extra preliminary round. He wasn't the only five-star show with Melford Simpson helping himself to the same number as Shoreham brushed St Francis Rangers aside 8-0. And Luke Barlone fired in four as Coleshill steamrolled Ellesmere Rangers 11-0. At the same stage last year, the Midland League side also racked up double figures. Add in two half-way line strikes from Oxford City's Bradley Bubb and Ashton Town's Danny Coid, who got his against Widnes after just three seconds, and this season is already a goal feast.

But someone scoring nine goals in two games doesn't happen all that often so we sent The NLP cameras along to get some snaps of Bentley with his Winchester City team-mates before Saturday's game at Yate Town. The final score? 0-0. Of course it was. Bet it was a good game though.






Division One East



Flackwell firepower leaves Bassett shell-shocked

Wilks Park, 22nd August 2015


Twenty torturous second half minutes set the stage for a crushing defeat for Royal Wootton Bassett Town as Flackwell Heath's four goal salvo in that period helped the classy reigning champions on their way to a 7-2 victory.

That spell, in which the Buckinghamshire outfit ruthlessly exploited the left side of Bassett's defence, ensured it was a country mile separating the teams at full time, rather than the width of a cigarette paper which could have been placed between the sides an hour earlier at the culmination of the game's opening period. At the stage Flackwell held a slender 2-1 advantage, an entertaining and relatively even opening period having produced opportunities at both ends. The Heathens were their typical selves, seeking to switch play at every available opportunity to bring dangerous wingers Dan Rapley and Seb Bowerman into the fray, with frontman Dan Burnell lurking between the lines to try and drag the Bassett defence out of shape. Largely though the visitors coped with what their opponents threw at them. Indeed, were it not for two instances of Bassett's defence switching off, and with a bit more luck for frontman Steve Robertson, it could even have been the visitors who went into the break in front. Saying that is pure conjecture though, and likely wouldn't have prevented the battering Bassett later took.

In the game's fourth minute, home 'keeper Dan Weait, attempting to deal with a woeful James Tripp backpass by sidestepping a pressing Sam Packer, presented Robertson with an open goal. but the forward blazed over from the edge of the area. Minutes later the hosts were in front. Receiving Joel Jacobs' short corner, Dan Burnell curled a low effort towards the far right corner, where Chris Hurst - his run unchecked - was on hand to ensure the ball wound up in the back of the net. However, after surviving a brief period of Flackwell dominance in which Curtis Meare expertly repelled a rasping Liam Tack drive, Bassett soon restored parity. Seizing on the Heathens' failure to clear from a throw deep in their territory, Dane Moulden stole possession on the edge of the box. Showing some guick feet, he shuffled the ball out to Robertson, who thrashed a stunning left foot drive from an angle into the roof of the net. Having survived scares as Rapley flashed an instinctive strike across the face of goal and Hurst snatched at a header from close range, it appeared as though Bassett were on course to go into the break on level terms. Another lapse in concentration put paid to that though. When the majority of the home side went up appealing for a penalty for an alleged Adam Corcoran handball, the Bassett defence stopped in their tracks. Hurst didn't though, and from a narrow angle on the right he arrowed into opposite corner.

While disappointing to be behind, there were plenty of positives Paul Braithwaite's team could take from their performance in the opening period. How quickly that was undone, however. Flackwell's decision to swap Rapley, perhaps the Hellenic League's preeminent performer, from the left wing to the right proved inspired and paid immediate dividends. Within three minutes he had the ball in the back of the net. Burnell clipped a through pass into the right channel for Rapley to run onto as he breezed beyond Dale Richards. Initially it appeared as though the winger would not make it, but, outstretched, he was able to guide home beyond Meare. That sparked a goal-rush. With 55 minutes on the clock, Rapley and Burnell exchanged passes to unlock room in the right corner and the former cut back for the onrushing Mitchell Woodward to steer in for the hosts' fourth. Flackwell's tally for the afternoon soon became five: Rapley whipped in a cross from the right, which Corcoran was unfortunate to slice into his own net. Their sixth then came from a lightning fast counter. Kalum Youngsam had got in behind the Flackwell defence only to see Weait smother at his feet. Less than thirty seconds later, play was at the other end, Hurst racing through the middle, rounding Meare and slotting home. Robertson stemmed the bleeding with quarter of an hour to go, diverting Packer's mishit long range drive beyond Weait. But Burnell made certain that his side's margin of victory was five, scoring with an outrageous arcing chip from 25 yards after having shrugged off the attentions of Moulden.

Man of the Match: Sam Packer – his displays so far this season have been positive and this one was no different for the creative midfielder. It was playing through Packer, wise and clever on the ball, that Bassett appeared to threaten most.

Player Profile - George Drewitt

George Drewitt (Defender)



Double first team Player of the Year award winner in 2014/15, Drewitt enjoyed an outstanding first full season with Bassett's first team and will be looking to carry his high level of play into this campaign.

A good reader of the game, comfortable on the ball and strong in the tackle, the centre half grabbed the opportunity given to him by manager Paul Braithwaite with both hands, playing 36 times, scoring once and leading by example as Vice-Captain. His lone goal was an important one too, putting Bassett ahead in a key victory against Newbury, which helped spark Bassett's late season charge.

Drewitt is a home town player, who began with the club's youth section as an Under 8 (pictured right, front row left at the County Ground with arm in air), captained the Under 18 Floodlit League team in 2008/09 and played for many seasons with the club's Reserve team.

He made his reserve team debut in 2007/08 before making his first team bow in 2009/10 in a narrow Floodlit Cup loss at Ardley United.



Injuries had limited his chances that year, but he became a regular fixture in the Reserve team in 2010/11, and also made a couple of appearances as a substitute with the first team.



Drewitt was the reserve team's captain and leading appearance maker a season later, and his eight goals helped guide Simon Paish's side to a fourth place finish — the second string's best performance in a number of years. His play was enough to earn recognition from his peers as he was awarded Players' Player of the Year.


Again captain in 2012/13, he helped his side achieve another top five finish. He then enjoyed his most successful season with the second string two seasons ago, scoring four goals as the team finished third in Division Two West and reached the semi-finals of the President's Cup.
