

Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Wokingham & Emmbrook

A warm welcome to Wokingham & Emmbrook who have made the journey along the M4 from Berkshire for this afternoon's Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. We hope all from Wokingham & Emmbrook enjoy their visit to our new ground and we wish them a safe journey home.

After promotion last season, when they were champions of Division One East, Wokingham & Emmbrook have had a tough start on their return to the Premier Division. Injuries have hit the side badly forcing them to field a number of youngsters. Currently playing their home games at Henley Town, Wokingham & Emmbrook have already played eleven league fixtures ahead of their trip to Ardley on Tuesday evening. Seven of those eleven games have been played at Henley where Wokingham & Emmbrook have yet to register a home win this season. The season opened with a 4-1 away defeat at Brimscombe & Thrupp. The first point of the season came courtesy of a draw at home to Milton United with neither side being able to find the net. It was tight again four days later when Longlevens visited Henley and left with the points courtesy of a solitary goal. Another midweek encounter at Henley saw Oxford City Nomads take the spoils, 3-1 the score in this one. It was three home defeats on the trot when Thame United visited, winning by the odd goal in three.

The first win of the season came in the midweek game against their former landlords, Bracknell Town. Knowing the pitch at Bracknell well Wokingham & Emmbrook hit three without reply to register the first three point haul of the season. Ahead of Tuesday those were the last points registered by Woingham & Emmbrook as they have lost five games on the bounce. A 3-0 away defeat at Lydney Town, was followed by a narrow Bank Holiday Monday defeat against local rivals Binfield, managed by former manager Roger Herridge. Despite the poor start to the season Wokingham & Emmbrook gave reigning champions Flackwell Heath a run for their money losing out by the odd goal in a seven goal thriller. This was followed by two more home defeats at the hands of Ascot United (0-3) and Brackley Town Saints (1-4) and a cup defeat, again at the hands of Ascot.

Previous Encounters

The two sides have met on three occasions previously and it is one win a piece and one drawn game. The two sides were both in the Premier Division in Season 2010-11. On 7th September 2010, goals from Jon Beeden and Sam Collier gave Wootton Bassett Town the three points at Rylands Way. The return took place on 15th March 2011 and neither side were able to find the net with the points shared. The one Wokingham & Emmbrook win came in the Subsidiary Cup at Rylands Way when they caught Bassett on an off night, winning 5-0.

Floodlit Cup v Fairford

A first half hat-trick from Steve Robertson a week last Wednesday did the damage on a night when we safely saw off a potential cup shock against Fairford. With so many connections between the two sides the game had the potential for a surprise result but those Robbo goals certainly settled any nerves and as good as ended the game as a contest by half-time. Fairford got one back in the second half but the first half performance had been enough to secure progress into the Second Round of the Floodlit Cup. The draw for the next round has again been reasonably kind as we will now be away to Tytherington Rocks, a side currently struggling at the bottom end of Division One West. We have had some good games over the years in the sixteen encounters with Tytherington and have had the better of things with eight wins to six for Tytherington, two games being drawn. Hopefully the lads will maintain our good record when we visit Tytherington on Wednesday 7th October. The Floodlit Cup is one that is winnable as a number of clubs tend to field weaker sides in the early rounds (including ourselves in previous seasons) and if you take the competition seriously from the start a potential final beckons. This season we seem to be treating the competition with respect and hopefully this will lead us to a cup final come the end of the season.



From The Dugout

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the management team and players from Wokingham & Emmbrook to the New Gerard Buxton Ground for this Uhlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. Wokingham did really well to win Division One East last season but are finding the Premier Division a tough proposition so far. However, do not be lulled into a false sense of security as I understand they have been decimated by injuries so far this season and when they start getting those players back I am sure they will start to climb the table.

Since my last notes we have played three games, winning two and losing our last outing away at Binfield on Monday night. The win against Fairford Town in the Floodlit Cup was very pleasing and another hat-trick from Robbo who is currently in a rich vein of goal scoring form. With so many of us having connections to Fairford it was one we did not want to lose and the lads did the business to see us safely into the next round. Our prize was a trip to Tytherington Rocks in Round Two.

Saturday saw us win away at Abingdon United. Another two from Robbo and one from Stephen Olphert, the Robbo goals taking him to the top of the Hellenic Premier goal scoring table, saw us in total control. Just when you look to the team to keep a clean sheet to see out the match we concede two silly goals. Down to ten and up against it. George has now been sent off twice already and it is one area of his game that he needs to work on. In the circumstances it would have been better not to have put the challenge in and let the striker have a shot. He could have missed; even if he scored we would have still had a full complement of players on the pitch. It is on these split second decisions that games can be won and lost. After going down to ten the lads did well to compete in the game and Sam Packer in particular was excellent on the night but we didn't really open up Binfield and create any clear cut chances. They scored a second when their player reacted quickest to a wonder save from Curtis and the game was over as a contest. It was particularly hard on Curtis who had been excellent al night and did not deserve to be on the wrong end of a 2-0 result. In the dying seconds the linesman flagged for something that Dale said and he also saw red. Not sure why they saw it necessary to inflict such punishment in the 93rd minute of a game that was already over and we will now miss Dale for a few games, as well as George. At the end we could not get out of Binfield quick enough and back on that long journey along the M4. A bad night all round the ramifications of which will be felt in a couple of weeks time.

Next week we make the trip to Windsor for the FA Vase but before that have an away game in Gloucester against Tuffley Rovers in midweek.

Please support the players this afternoon and help us get three more precious points to climb the table. Come on the Bassett.










Opponents - History

Wokingham & Emmbrook • Club History

Wokingham & Emmbrook Football Club was formed in the summer of 2004 by the merger of 2 long established clubs from Wokingham. We are looking to re-establish senior football back in Wokingham after an absence of many years, since Wokingham Town moved from their Finchampstead Road Ground in 1999. The first team are currently playing their home matches at Lowther Road in Wokingham.



In 2010 Wayne stepped down as First Team Manager and the club again looked internally promoting Roger Herridge to First Team Manager and Dan Bateman to Assistant Manager and enjoyed a strong finish to their first season in the Hellenic Premier League finishing 11th. Season 2011/12 saw more young local players progress through the Allied Counties team into the first team and saw the clubs first matches in the FA Cup in over ten years. A successful season saw the Sumas finish tenth in the league, reach the quarter final of the League Cup and win the Reading Challenge Cup at the Madjeski Stadium in May. In Season 2012/13 the Sumas were able to go a step further on where they had finished the previous season, because, as well as retaining the Reading Senior Cup beating Marlow United 2-1 in the final, the Satsumas finished in 8th place in the Hellenic Premier League.

The 2013/14 season saw Wokingham & Emmbrook FC returning back home to Lowther Road, playing in the Hellenic Division One East. Dan Bateman and Matt Eggleston took over the reigns as joint-managers in a season that ended up with Wokingham continuously climbing the table and ending up runners-up in the league. The Sumas also were able to retain the Reading Senior Cup for the third season running, beating local rivals Finchampstead 5-0 at Madjeski Stadium in the final.

The club continue to nurture young talent as the cornerstone to future development and success.

Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents who are no longer competing. Today's featured team is former Swindon

Ferndale Athletic

The first known games between Wootton Bassett Town FC and Ferndale Athletic were in the old Wiltshire Combination, with rivalries commencing in Season 1969-70. A Ferndale Athletic team had existed some years prior to that as a one George Hunt is shown in the history of Swindon Town FC as having joined Swindon from Ferndale Athletic in 1947. In the first encounter between the two sides Wootton Bassett had won 6-1 at Rylands Way with Toby Ewing firing a hat-trick and Roy Blackburn bagging a brace with one for Tom Gardiner. The return in Swindon finished one a piece. That season Ferndale finished in 9th place, 4 places below Bassett. It was a home win followed by a draw the following season, 5-1 the score at Rylands this time Roy Blackburn (2), Graham Reid, Derek Powell and Tony Russell the scorers for Bassett. The return saw the two sides share six goals, Derek Powell, Sammy Rose and Ian Sinfield on target for Bassett. Ferndale finished the season in 16th place with Bassett in 7th. The following season saw both sides struggling at the foot of the table but Bassett were able to record the double, the two sides meeting on consecutive Saturdays in October. John Culley 2, Phil Keep, Dave Clark and Derek Powell scored in a 5-2 home win and Powell. Clark and Bob Thomas scored in a 3-0 win in Swindon.

Season 1972-73 saw Ferndale record their first win over Bassett, winning 6-2 at Rylands Way, Dave Clark and Toby Ewen with the Bassett consolation goals. Bassett had won the earlier away fixture 4-2 courtesy of goals from Toby Ewen 2, Dave Clark and Roy Blackburn. The two sides were in the same division the following season but unfortunately I have not been able to trace the results from this due to the lack of printed newspapers caused by the Three-Day Week introduced to save on electricity! Both teams struggled in the Combination with Ferndale finishing in 13th place, one spot above Bassett.

Season 1974-75 saw honours shared, Bassett winning 5-0 away from home thanks to goals from Benny Lehane 2, Phil Keep, Seppy Glasscoo and Dave Clark. Seppy and Benny were again on target in the game at Rylands but Ferndale won this one 5-3. Bassett finished in 6th place with Ferndale in 9th spot. Season 1975-76 was the last season of the Wiltshire Combination and once again the two sides struggled at the wrong end of the table. Ferndale had the better of the two games winning 3-0 at Rylands and the two sides drawing in the first encounter at Ferndale, Dave Clark netting in the one all draw.

The formation of the Wiltshire County League saw both sides start in Division One but Ferndale were to have a torrid season winning just one game all season and finishing way adrift at the bottom of the league. Bassett did the double winning 5-1 at Ferndale with Alan Turner leading the scoring with a couple and 4-2 at home, two for Tony Spiers and one a piece for Gary Dixon and Phil Keep. With Ferndale relegated to Division Two the two sides would not meet again in the league until 1978-79 after Bassett had also been relegated. That season the two sides fought neck and neck for the league title and promotion back to Division One, Ferndale eventually edging it by one point after the 26 league fixtures. It was honours even in terms of points in the two games between the sides Bassett had defeated Ferndale 3-0 on their own patch thanks to a Phil Keep hat-trick but Ferndale extracted revenge winning 1-0 at Rylands.

The following season Ferndale were able to finish in 12th place in the top flight but unfortunately Bassett were relegated back to Division Two. Ferndale won in Swindon and the two sides drew 2-2 at Rylands. Gary Dixon and an own goal for Bassett in this one. The two sides did not meet again until 1982-83 when Ferndale joined Bassett in Division Two. Wootton Bassett finished one place below Ferndale in the table in 9th place, this despite doing a 1-0 double over the Swindon side. Neil Timbrell scoring in the game at Ferndale.

The following two seasons were very poor for Ferndale Athletic as they finished bottom of Division Two for two consecutive seasons. In Season 1983-84 a Dougie Gee goal in November was enough to give Bassett the points and in the return at Rylands in January from Kevin Bishop and Graham Smedley ensured a double for Wootton Bassett. It was a similar story the following season, although Bassett made hard work of defeating a side who were to again finish bottom of the pile, winning 2-1 in both games. Roger Smith and Gary Dixon scored in the first game at Ferndale, with Dixon again on the score sheet in the return at Rylands along with Dougle Gee. With Wootton Bassett winning the league and being promoted to Division One and then up to the Hellenic League three seasons later these were to be the last two competitive league fixtures between the two sides.

In their later years Ferndale Athletic played on the County Ground Extension but like so many of the old top Swindon sides were eventually to fold. These days the Ferndale name partially lives on in the shape of the thriving young club Ferndale Rodbourne run by the Morgan family but there is no longer an adult side with the name Ferndale Athletic.

The Under 18s team, which will be managed by Paul Gerrish with Rab McLeod as his assistant, replaces the Development side, whose place in the Wiltshire Football League Premier Division has been taken by the Reserves.

The re-introduction of the Under 18 Senior side marks a return to the Floodlit League, which Bassett withdrew from following the 2011/12 season when they finished as runners-up in the North Division. A year earlier, under the stewardship of Danny Groom, Bassett's Under 18 side comfortably won the competition, while also reaching the Wiltshire Youth Cup final.

Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: Towards the end of your career you played under Burkie who you had also played alongside previously. If you were to describe Paul the player in one word and Paul the manager in one word what would those two words be?

PD:. Burkie the player in one word is pretty difficult but I think I would have to go with tenacious, as a manager the one word would have to be committed. In all seriousness Crazy was a great player and it was always much better to have him on your team rather than against you! And as a manager you knew exactly what was expected and Crazy was always happy to tell you when you weren't doing it!

MS: You also played with Woody as well as Burkie, controversial question, which one was the better player?

PD: Putting me on the spot here, both different players altogether, Woody was a much more defensive player than Crazy. Bryan would be consistent week in week out but Burkie would have the inspirational moments and goals (although I am sure he thinks it was every game!). I will have to be completely diplomatic and say they were both great players at Bassett for different reasons.

MS: You were briefly manager of the Reserve side. How did you find the transition from playing to managing the side?

PD: Very difficult to be honest. Running a reserve side is the hardest job in non league football because you never really knew who was with you until Friday night or Saturday morning, I remember one Saturday going to Rayners Lane and Danny, myself and Steve Thomas all had to be on the team sheet. Having Danny Groom assist me with this was a godsend though and we did a really good job together but the commitment that anyone has to give is phenomenal and it wasn't something I was able to sustain due to job commitments.

MS: Would you consider going back into management in future?

PD: I don't think I would anymore, football has changed so much at this level over the last few years that I would become frustrated far too easily with it.

MS: Finally on football, I ask everyone this question. Bassett bobble at Rylands Way – fact or just an excuse used by players with poor ball control?

PD:. There is only one answer to this and anyone that says anything different is wrong – it's a fact!

MS: Finally I know, like Burkie and myself, you are a big Swindon speedway fan. If you were to pick your top 3 Swindon Robins of all time, who would they be and also do you think Swindon can still win the play-offs despite the loss of Darcy Ward?

PD: Firstly what a horrific injury Darcy has suffered and i hope he is able to recover some mobility in his legs, it just proves what a dangerous sport speedway it is. In terms of my top 3 – the greatest rider has to be Leigh Adams – again what a travesty that he rode for so many years with no injury and then within six months of retiring he had a crash on a moto cross bike and again was paralysed. At number 2 it would probably be Phil Crump and finally it would be Lee Richardson who was unfortunately killed during a meeting in Poland in 2012. Watching Lee and Leigh ride in heats 13 and 15 at the Abbey was always a great moment. In terms of the playoffs I think we are seriously struggling following the first leg, I know Rosco will do what he can to get the team up but i just feel 15 points is too big a gap to get back.

Cup thumping leaves only one thing to play for

Wootton Bassett Town now have only their Hellenic League Division One West promotion push to concentrate upon following a heavy 5-0 defeat against Wokingham and Emmbrook in the Supplementary Cup second round.

Without seven first team regulars, Dave Turner was forced to field a young, experimental side. And against a team riding high in the Premier Division, Bassett were simply overpowered.

As soon as the opening whistle blew Bassett found themselves camped deep inside their own territory as Wokingham created a plethora of chances.

Initially Luke Sharps' (pictured) goal led a charmed life as Callum Eagle twice wasted headed opportunities.

It appeared to be just a matter of time before the deadlock was

broken though, and the opening goal eventually came on the quarter hour. With the hosts' defence sucked over to the left hand side, the visitors exploited the gaping hole on the right. Nick Bateman was fed an incisive pass and should have done better with his drive which Sharps parried. But Matt Jones was there to swivel and slot the rebound into the bottom corner.



Although Steve Yeardley (pictured) came close following a rare Bassett foray forward, forcing Gary Aulsberry to awkwardly tip over, Bassett quickly found themselves two behind when Elliott Rushforth beat a hesitant Sharps to a long ball and poked home.

On the stroke of half time it was three when Danny Horscroft's precise free kick left the keeper no chance and nestled in the left corner.

Following the restart Wokingham scored twice inside the opening ten minutes. Bateman got both of them, confidently dispatching a penalty before reacting quickest to a headed effort that had struck the bar.

Bassett put up something of a fight in the latter stages, the half time introduction of Matty

Bennett adding a spark that had been desperately lacking before the break. But Aulsberry was not to be beaten, producing two composed saves. The first directed Bennett's powerful strike over before he parried at the feet of Andy Brien (pictured) following the Bassett assistant manager's solo run.

Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: How many seasons in the end did you play for the Town and what was your reason for leaving when Pete Yeardley took over from Barry Giles as manager?

PD: I honestly can't remember Mark, I think in total it was probably 15 seasons either side of a short stint away at Pewsey, Calne and Purton! I also don't really remember the reason for leaving, I think I became slightly disillusioned with the number of new faces coming into the club and the fact that the old Bassett team spirit didn't seem to be as prevalent as the previous few years.

MS: You didn't stay away from Bassett too long, what was it that brought you back to the club?

PD: Again the memory doesn't do me any favours here, I think I just realised that I loved playing for the club and wanted to finish my career here

MS: Having made so many appearances for the club you must have played with a number of Bassett legends. Who do you consider to be the best player you played alongside and why?

PD: Really tough question, I played with so many good players that I would need two pages to list them all out, a few that I consider great players though are Scott Vincent, Alan Wilson, Steve Yeardley, Roger Frost, Nutty Newton, Robbie Newnham, Neil Timbrell, Paul Dowding, Kev Moloney, Steve Thomas, Dave Hawkins but the best player was probably Lee Stoddart – he had phenomenal pace and also knew where the net was, I think he may well have been top scorer in the Hellenic League on a couple of occasions. I don't think we ever really replaced him when he left the club.

MS: On a similar note, you must also have played under a number of managers in your time at Wootton Bassett, I'm thinking it would have been Mick Woolford, Barry Giles, Kevin Moloney, Dave Warren, Pete Yeardley and Burkie. Who do you rate as the best manager and why?

PD: All of these are totally different managers and each had there own ways of doing things but I think the best manager I played under was probably Mick. Every player had the greatest respect for him because he had played a decent level and was able to bring us together as a team and play in the exact style and manner he wanted. He wasn't really a manager who shouted and screamed at you but encouraged more, however there were a few moments where he did lose it in the changing room and these were always well deserved. You also always knew where you stood with Mick as he would speak to you regularly and let you know how you were doing and what you could do to improve things.

MS: What is your fondest memory of your time with Wootton Bassett Town?

PD:.I would say the club spirit, I remember going to Rylands Way when I was 10 or 11 and watching the senior teams that included the likes of H, Danny Groom, Steve Thomas and many others and thinking that I wanted to play for this team. The club has an amazing history and the people behind the club have remained the same for so many years — I can't imagine where the club would be without the likes of all the volunteers over the years but in particular Rod and Roger who have given so many years through all the different managers and committees that have steered the club to where they are now.

MS: Paul Harrison was Chairman during the majority of the years you were playing for the club. Did you ever play alongside Paul and what are your first memories of H?

PD: I did have the pleasure of playing with H, first memories were the number of bandages and strappings he put on before every game!! H was a great player, one of the fittest I played with who could control a game from the centre of midfield.

MS: As a centre back you will have had many tussles with tough centre forwards. Which opponent do you feel you had your biggest battles with and which forward did you respect the most in your playing career?

PD: I played against a few, one of the hardest centre forwards I played against was Sean Clark, I had many battles with him over the years on both Saturdays and Sundays. I remember one particular game at Lambourn when I didn't really know him and he was keen to let me know who he thought was boss but I managed to pretty much mark him out of the game. I also had a few tussles with many others but I can't remember the names, I wasn't really bothered who I played against, I just tended to try and mark whoever it was out of any game I played in!!

Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

This week with Paul Davis

MS: Paul, thank you for agreeing to be interviewed for the Match Day programme. Everyone who I have asked so far has enjoyed doing this and I hope this interview will be no different. I normally ask how players came to play for Bassett but I more than anyone know how you came to play for Wootton Bassett Town as you for playing for me at Wootton Bassett Sports in Season 1991-92 when Mick Woolford came up to the School to watch you play. Within the week we had the 7 day notice of approach and you left followed shortly afterwards by Dominic Machell. What do you remember of those events and I have to ask, any truth in the rumour that Mick offered you a new pair of boots to go to Bassett Town?



PD: If only, I don't even think I was offered a can of coke or packet of crisps as part of the deal!!! All I remember is playing a few games for the Sports and really enjoying senior football, I then remember Blower having a chat with me and saying that Mick was interested in trying to get me down to the Town to play – I didn't have a clue who Mick was at the time but I think on the day he watched I had a pretty decent game and as you say the 7 day followed shortly after.

MS: I still have the Wootton Bassett Sports End of Season Programme for Season 1991-92 and it shows you played 8 games for the Sports before coming over to the Town. The write-up on the season also refers to a game against Salisbury Manor when you were kicked in an off the ball incident by their centre-forward and had to go off with stud marks all over your knee. Don't suppose you remember that game?

PD: I do remember the game but not just for the off the ball incident — I was having a real battle with the centre forward who thought he could probably push me around and try to dominate my game because I was quite young, I wasn't having that and think I pretty much gave as good as I got. We were having a few verbals and I remember him just booting me, I think I had a few cuts where it happened. The only thing I remember after the incident was Dave Alstowe and Mal Little trying to take retribution on the centre forward for me — I think I realised then how important it was to have team mates who would get stuck in and stick up for each other

MS: You played for Bassett for many years and were part of two Wootton Bassett Wiltshire Senior Cup winning sides in 1998-99 and 2000-01, which of those two wins gave you the most satisfaction?

PD: I think the one in '99 was the best game for me, I was captain and the game was played at the County Ground in front of a few hundred people, it was lousy night weather wise but we played some great football and made the most of playing on a pitch without the infamous Bassett Bobble! It was also a game in which I scored (a diving header no less) and also had the chance to lift the trophy, although I do remember the floodlights being turned off just as I was handed the trophy!

MS: Swindon were having financial trouble and I guess it was part of their cost management. If I recall we never got our share of the gate receipts from one of those finals due to their problems. Thinking back to those two nights at the County Ground, of those two cup winning sides which do you think was the stronger side and why?

PD: I think the side in 99 was the stronger side; we didn't really have any superstars in the team (although Micky Goodwin thought he was!) and had a great team spirit. We had one of the best centre forwards in the league in Lee Stoddart who we could always rely on to grab a load of goals each season. We always thought that we would win games and wouldn't worry about who we were playing

MS: If I remember correctly the side at that time included Paul Harper who had an enormous throw-in which was often used as an offensive weapon. What do you remember of Harps and that throw and did you ever get on the end of any of his throw-ins to score?

PD:Harps was a great player and I had a great relationship with him on the pitch. His throw was huge and quite regularly myself and Marshy would be chucked up top for them. Any time we had a throw that was just inside the opponents half we saw as an opportunity, we scored a few goals as a team from it but it tended to be others as we were there to win the initial flick on. I also remember that Harps had one of the hardest shots in local football so he was pretty useful at free kicks also!!

RWBTFC History On One Page

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the champion-ship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.



Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2008-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

Player Profile - Steve Yeardley

Steve Yeardley - Defence



A Bassett stalwart gradually approaching 400 appearances, Yeardley is entering his eleventh season, split across two spells, with the club. He has played in every position on the pitch, including 'keeper, for Bassett, though is most comfortable playing at full back or in central midfield. Yeardley made his debut with Bassett back in the 2002/03 season as a 17 year old in a 2-0 Supplementary Cup victory against Clanfield. He would go on to make 23 further appearances that year, only a few of which came from the bench. Establishing himself as a regular at full back, he played 42 times a year later. He grabbed his first goal for the club during in 2004/05, the year Bassett were relegated from the Hellenic Premier, hitting a dramatic late winner

away against Milton United in January before adding three more before the end of the campaign. That season he exceeded the century mark for appearances, playing 46 times in total.

New manager Paul Burke appointed Yeardley as captain ahead of the 2005/06 season. Featuring largely in defence, he helped pilot Bassett to a fifth place finish, only narrowly falling short of an immediate return to the Hellenic Premier, while he scored five goals in 36 games along the way. He would also feature in goal, helping preserve a draw in an eventful FA Vase clash with Christchurch after an injury to John Haines. Yeardley's efforts that season saw him win both Manager's and Players' Player of the Year awards. His goalscoring prowess continued to flourish a year later when he featured 39 times and finished joint top scorer with Matt Bennett on 11 goals, Yeardley's haul including two in the FA Vase and a pair of penalties in a 3-0 away win at Purton. He also produced a man of the match display in a Wiltshire Senior Cup tie against Calne Town that went to penalties just days after having completed the New York Marathon. In 2007/08 Yeardley was Bassett's leading appearance maker, playing 40 times and scoring six goals. In what was an otherwise underwhelming campaign, Burke's team did enjoy a fantastic run to the FA Cup First Qualifying round that year, and his captain was a large reason for that, scoring a brace in the shock 2-1 victory against then-Southern League Bracknell Town at Rylands Way.

The consistently high level of his performances have regularly led to interest from elsewhere. But, despite a change in manager in summer of 2008, Yeardley continued to resist those overtures in order to remain with Bassett for Dave Turner's first year in charge. Employed largely in midfield, he once again had a fine season in front of goal, finishing joint-second top scorer with 12 goals in 39 games. That included another two goals in the FA Vase in wins against Buckingham Athletic and Henley Town. After again narrowly missing out on promotion with Bassett, who finished fourth, the lure of Hellenic Premier Division football was too much to turn down and Yeardley moved across to Highworth Town in the summer of 2009. In his first season with the Worthians he quickly established himself as one of the first names on the team sheet, featuring 39 times and scoring seven goals. He was again a crucial part of the side that went close to winning the title a year later. Yeardley led the Worthians in appearances with 51 in all competitions – only two of which came from the bench – and grabbed three goals. Though Highworth's title challenge faltered in 2011/12, they would go on to win the Hellenic League Challenge Cup, with Yeardley grabbing a goal in a 6-0 demolition of Binfield in the final. In total during 2011/12 he played 46 times – a number of those spent wearing the captain's armband – and grabbed a pair of goals.

With Highworth boss Dave Webb moving onto Supermarine that summer, Yeardley returned to Rylands Way in 2012 and skippered the side to promotion from Division One West. He made the second most appearances out of any player, playing 37 times and scoring 8 goals. Half of those strikes came in the first month of the season. Yeardley netted Bassett's first goal of the campaign at Malmesbury before sealing victory against Calne in the FA Cup following a man of the match performance. He grabbed another FA Cup goal in the First Qualifying round win against Highworth, netting the equaliser. His final goal of the season came on Boxing Day at Purton after just 17 seconds.

Yeardley kept the captain's armband in Jeff Roberts' lone season at the helm. Featuring primarily at full back, he failed to improve on the 38 goals he had scored in Bassett colours. Last season, which he split almost evenly between centre midfield and full back saw him return to goalscoring ways to take him beyond the half century mark. Yeardley scored ten times, including a brace in a doomed comeback attempt against Ascot United and a match winning penalty in the County Cup against Wroughton. That haul came in 40 total appearances, which continued to move him closer towards the club's all-time appearance record.

The Simulation Game

WELLING UNITED striker Sahr Kabba could end up winning you a few bob in the future if you're a regular at pub guizzes.

The foolish forward became the first player to be charged by the Football Association for 'allegedly exaggerating or feigning an injury which directly led to an opponent being dismissed'

Diving, simulation, cheating. Whatever you want to call it, it's the latest epidemic to invade our game and it has slowly started making more of an impact over the last decade.

While it has mostly been reserved for the top level and the overpaid mercenaries in the Premier League, it has started to trickle down. Much faster than the Premier League's billions have, that's for sure!

Of course we all like to think our grass-roots game is immune and sacrosanct but this unfortunate incident has proved it isn't.

Going down in the fashion Kabba did was risky to begin with but knowing the game was being shown live on BT Sport? That's tantamount to sporting suicide.

Ritchie Sutton's 'elbow' was neither dangerous nor enough to send a grown man flying to the floor holding their face. Especially seeing as it was nearer his chest.

Tranmere Rovers fans have rightly had their say on social media. You can't say for certain they would have held onto their 1-0 lead if Sutton had rightly remained on the pitch.

But you can definitely say it can't have helped. It gave Welling impetus and those two points could end up being vital come the end of the season.

Justice has been done - well as much as it can - with Kabba receiving a three-match ban and a fine of £250 after Sutton's red was rescinded.

Under the FA's new policy 'If the dismissed player is successful in overturning his sending-off and it is clear that the opposing player had not, for example, been struck as implied/claimed or at all. then a disciplinary charge may follow'.

Wembley chiefs get a lot of stick, and some is definitely warranted, but hats off to them for trying to stamp down on Kabba's kind of acting that is more suited to the stage than the football pitch. It will be interesting to see, however, how long it will take for a Premier League player to receive the same charge.

When reading the initial news I also had to spare a thought for referees. Yes, referee Craig Hicks was obviously wrong in sending Sutton off. Assistant Ian Parsons had even advised him about the 'elbow'.

Officiating is not an easy job and with the amount of cameras seemingly fixated on every game up and down the country, it's become easier than ever to lament poor decisions. But players trying to fool them only makes their jobs harder.

Reputations are quickly made, though, and who will Kabba and the Wings have to blame if referees are a little less willing to point to the spot in the future with the Tranmere incident so widely talked about?

It's a shame for the talented Kabba, who has now become a quiz question answer. But it's also a great shame for the young and energetic Wings - who continue to pluck talented players out of nowhere - and 19-year-old captain Sam Corne.

His stunning equaliser was good enough to feature at the very top of the game - and that's the sort of thing we should be talking about.





Match Reports

Seeing red

Hill Farm Lane, 22nd September 2015

George Drewitt and Dale Richards both saw red as Royal Wootton Bassett Town slipped to a 2-0 defeat away at Binfield on a hugely frustrating for Paul Braithwaite's team. Drewitt's dismissal, which led to the opening goal from the penalty spot after just half an hour, proved to be the game's turning point. Gifting the hosts both a man and one goal advantage, thereafter there was only likely to be one winner in the game despite a valiant display from the visitors throughout the contest.





Bassett rescued by another Robertson hat trick

Northcourt Road, 19th September 2015

Steve Robertson just can't stop scoring. And after nearly seeing a 3-0 advantage slip away on the road against Abingdon United, Royal Wootton Bassett Town are more than thankful for that as the frontman's third hat trick of the season – and his second this week - secured an anxiety inducing 4-2 triumph against the early season strugglers.

Ideally his three-timer would have been the focal point of this encounter. But Paul Braithwaite and his team will need to concentrate on how what should have been a comfortable triumph turned so quickly and, from the visitors' perspective, so disappointingly into a close run affair. Bassett certainly weren't at their best on this afternoon. Yet, from the evidence of the first half, nor did they need to be. Abingdon's youthful side offered little end product in the opening period with Dom White labouring fruitlessly on his own up front. It appeared as though the Bassett back four were therefore set for an easy afternoon. In addition to that lack of threat, the home side were also rash and undisciplined during the opening period, resulting in a trio of yellow cards being picked up for late challenges. That combination allowed Bassett to cruise to a 2-0 half time lead.

They took the lead twenty minutes in thanks to a well worked goal. Nathan Hawkins sprayed a diagonal ball out to Dan Bailey on the right wing, and he burst past Cameron Hawtin before eventually squaring for Steve Olphert, who swept home with precision from twelve yards. The midfielder's finish made up for an earlier miss when he squandered a one-on-one opportunity having made a clever run to latch onto a Robertson flick. And when Robertson bagged his opening goal just before the half hour, he too made up for passing up an earlier chance that he snatched at. As ever though, when he did find the net, he did so in some style. Olphert's deft header set him through, and after shrugging off the attentions of the last defender by cleverly shifting onto his right foot Robertson buried the ball into the bottom left corner from the edge of the area. He could quickly have added the team's third and his second as he raced onto Harvey Scholes' defence splitting pass before rounding 'keeper Jack Griffiths, but his attempt to slot home from an angle was cleared off the line. Despite that near miss, Bassett's two goal lead still seemed rather secure as the sides went into the break.

And, although starting shakily after the restart, the visitors bolstered it further after the hour when poor defending from the hosts allowed Robertson to slip in unnoticed, collect George Drewitt's clearance and blast beyond a helpless Griffiths. However, Bassett soon found they had a game on their hands. Really Abingdon should have been dead and buried and offered no hope of salvaging something from a lost cause. But the hosts, and in particular wingmen George Reid and Jordan Jeacock, sparked into life. Combined with a complacent approach to proceedings from Braithwaite's side as they appeared to go through the motions, the game's outcome was soon in doubt. Arguably the warning signs early in the second period should have been heeded, but Robertson's strike only seemed to reinforce the sense that the points were in the bag. How dangerous that was. Adam Bowerman soon forced Curtis Meare into an uncomfortable parry, before, having survived a double Dan Bailey chance. Jamie Essex cut into the deficit with a glancing header from a corner. With guarter of an hour to go he grabbed his second. Reid did the legwork, skipping down the right and taking on Dan Comer before squaring to his captain, who steered in confidently. By now, you got the impression that the team who got the next goal would go on to win the game. And the way momentum had swung so heavily in favour of Abingdon, fear crept in that perhaps Bassett were about to capitulate completely. They breathed a sigh of relief when Reid failed to find the target from range having cut in from the right and twisted his way past two challenges. Eventually though, in the game's final minute, Robertson completed his hat trick to extinguish any concerns. Again the goal came from a Drewitt clearance over the Abingdon defence, which Robertson charged down. Then, from an angle on the left edge of the box that he really had no permission to score from, he thrashed a low arrowed drive that bounced just in front of Griffiths, over the 'keeper's outstretched palm and into the opposite bottom corner. Albeit way after they should have been, the points were finally safe.

Man of the Match: Steve Robertson – again Bassett were indebted to his lethal finishing abilities. All three of Robertson's goals were well taken, with the third, and most important, the pick of the bunch.


