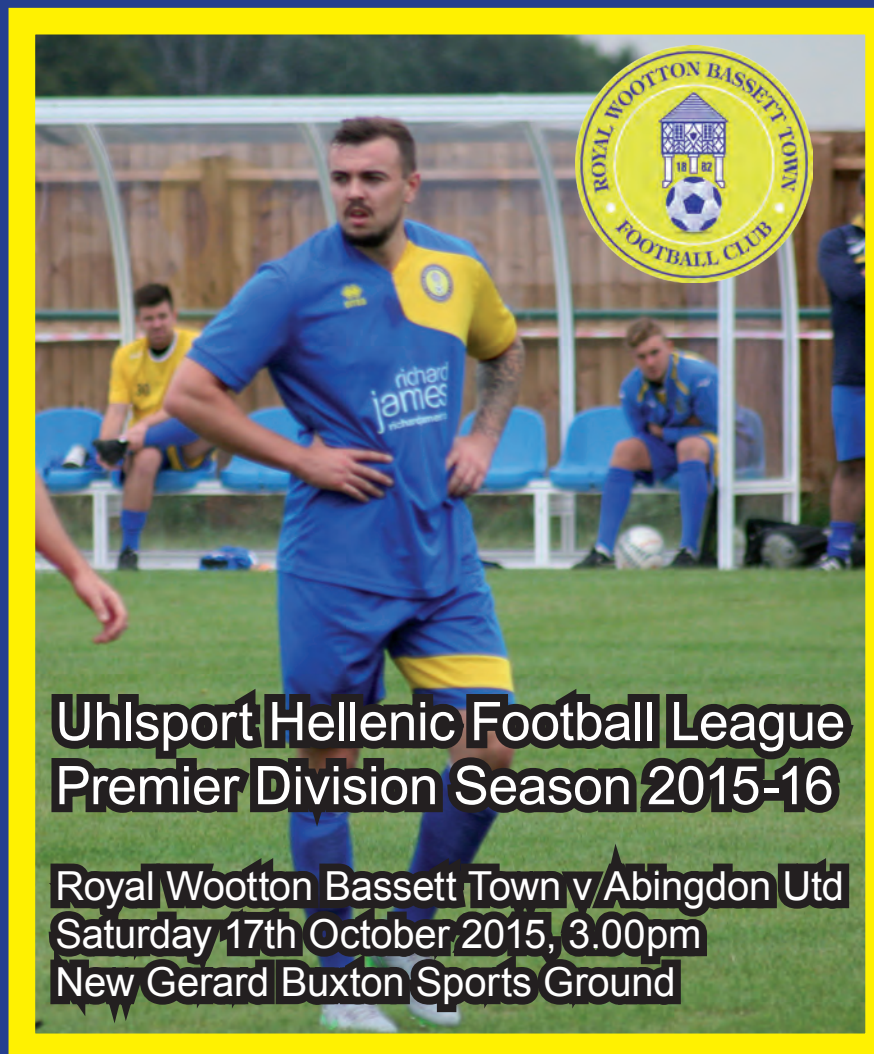

Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Abingdon United

A warm welcome to Abingdon United who have made the journey up from Oxfordshire for this afternoon's UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. We hope all from Abingdon enjoy their visit to our new ground and we wish them a safe journey home.

The two sides have met once already this season in the league at Abingdon with Bassett securing all three points courtesy of a 4-2 win. Robbo, currently the league's top scorer, fired a hat-trick that day and was the difference between the two sides. Whilst we looked comfortable at 3-0, two defensive lapses let Abingdon back into the game and at one point looked like they might take a point from the game until a long range shot from Robbo restored the two goal advantage and secured the points. Abingdon were a young side that day and played some nice football and I can see them winning a lot more games before the end of the season.

Abingdon started the season with six straight defeats, including an early exit from the FA Cup at the hands of Brimscombe & Thrupp. The next six games saw a marked improvement with two wins and two draws and just two defeats, one of which was the game with Bassett and the other an FA Vase defeat at Lydney Town. Four straight defeats followed before last week's excellent 2-0 home win over bottom of the table Wokingham & Emmbrook.

As has already been seen this season, on their day everyone is capable of beating everyone else in the Premier Division this season so we will need to be at our best if we are to get anything out of this game. I know this week we have a number of players missing due to injuries and suspensions as we pay the price for some of those decisions in recent games.

Last season the two sides met three times. Both league games were drawn, 2-2 at Abingdon and 1-1 back at Cirencester. The two sides also met in FA Vase with Abingdon winning 3-2.

Wiltshire Cup Success

Last week saw us safely through to the next round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup against Wiltshire League opponents Ludgershall Sports. It is always difficult to lift the players for these First Round games against Wiltshire League opponents and on the day I thought Ludgershall played very well. Before Saturday they had only lost one game all season, they played some nice football on the floor and you can see why they are generally near the top of the league. In the end our massive pitch took its toll and a few of their players were really blowing. Elsewhere in the competition there were no real surprises with the Wiltshire League sides generally going down to those from the Hellenic, Western and Wessex leagues. The last sixteen includes all the top sides in the county and I know Paul would like to draw Steve Claridge's Salisbury side. A home time against Salisbury would certainly be very good in terms of attracting a big gate. Other than Salisbury, Melksham Town, Highworth Town, Bemerton Heath and Bradford Town are all still in the competition.

Reserves

Whilst the First Team were safely navigating through to the next round of the County Cup the Reserves were drawing their third consecutive game, 1-1 the score at Vale of Pewsey. The three game unbeaten run may come an end today as they visit champions Malmesbury Vics, although with Vics losing their first game last week who knows we may even pick up all three points.

Under 18's

Paul Gerrish's Under 18 side have made a great start to the season and have now played all teams in their division and defeated them all. Well done to Paul and the lads and it would be great if they could go the whole season unbeaten.

Youth Teams

Sunday saw four of Royal Wootton Bassett Town's youth sides book their place in the second round of the North Wilts League Cup. The Under 16, 15, 13 and 12 Blue teams all advanced, and join the Under 18s, who received an opening round bye, in the hat for the next round. Elhadj Seck was the star of the show for the Under 15 Blues as he netted a hat-trick in a 6-2 victory against Ramsbury Juniors. He was joined on the scoresheet by Jamie Biles, Harrison Gough and Sabelo Ntombela. Braces from Joseph Dixon, James Handley and James Russell helped the Under 16 side on their way to a 7-2 win at home against Croft Juniors Blue. Also on target for last season's cup runners-up was Ashley Prim. The Under 13 Blues are reigning cup holders and got their title defence under way in convincing fashion, defeating Tetbury Town 8-1 thanks to goals from Ben Chin (2), Billy Saunders (2), Daniel Warre (2) and Adam Jones.

Biggest winners were the Under 12 Blues, who thrashed South Cerney 11-1 away from home. Eight different scorers found the net, with Matthew Purcell, Joey Warren and Stanley Webb all finding the back of the net twice. Also winning on Sunday, albeit in the league rather than cup, were the Under 18s, who became the first team to take points off Fairford Town Youth so far this season, doing so thanks to a Jake Covey pair and Aidan Thompson strike in a 3-2 triumph. The Under 15 Yellows headed out of the cup despite a valiant effort against higher league opposition as they fell to a 2-0 loss against Malmesbury Youth North. Bowing out in a similar vein were the Under 12 Yellows, who were defeated 2-0 by Division Two Lydiard Millicent Juniors. Both Under 14 sides were eliminated, the Blues losing to Cirencester Town and the Yellows to Stratton Juniors Pumas, while the Under 13 Yellows were defeated 4-2 in an entertaining encounter against Malmesbury Youth Tornadoes.

Opponents - History

Abingdon United • Club History

The club was formed in 1946 when a group of ex-service men decided that the town could support two football clubs. The first meeting to form the club was held in the local Anchor Public House on the bank of the River Thames, as there were no club facilities. They joined the North Berks League and within two seasons had won its Charity Shield. The following year 1953/54 they won the league and cup finalists



The club had its sights on higher things and five years later entered the Hellenic League. Since then it has remained in this league and during this time had success in the lower divisions. In 1965/66 they won the Division One Challenge Cup and the following season were the cup finalists.

No further honours came the clubs way until winning promotion in 1976/77 to the Premier Division. After a struggle at this level, relegation back to Division One came after four seasons. With a more ambitious approach, the club bounced back into the Premier League where it has remained ever since. It also won the Division One Cup in the same promotion year. Senior status was achieved in 1985 allowing it to be eligible for the F.A. Vase, County Senior Cup and in 1989 entered the F.A. Cup for the first time.

A Members Room, Function Room, Covered Stand and Floodlighting have been completed in recent years to improve the off pitch facilities. 1996/97 has seen the club complete its 50th season and it's most successful. United won the final of the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy and also winning the League's Floodlit Cup. The highest ever league position was attained when finishing as Runners Up in the Hellenic Premier Division. The following season again saw success come to Northcourt Road with retaining the County Senior Trophy, Hellenic League Reserve Championship and Allied Counties Youth League winners.

2001 saw the construction of new changing rooms, together with turnstiles, to the Northcourt Road Ground and 2005 saw the construction of a new 150-seater stand and a covered stand. The club clinched promotion to the Southern League in season 2005/06.

In season 2013/14 Abingdon re-joined the Hellenic League after voluntarily resigning from the Southern League.

Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents no longer competing, today's featured team is.....

Wollen Sports

Woolen Sports started as a Sunday side playing in the Swindon Sunday League. In 1990 they applied to join the Hellenic League but were unable to complete at the Hellenic level due to issues with gaining senior status from the Wiltshire County FA. However, the following season they achieved their ambition and quickly justified their place in the Hellenic League by winning the First Division championship at their first attempt and not to be outdone their Reserve Team won the Reserve Section West. They also made the final of the Division One Cup losing 3-2 to Wantage Town in the final at Clanfield.

In Season 1991-92 Wollen Sports finished seven points clear of runners-up Wantage Town. Along the way they defeated Wootton Bassett Town 4-0 at Highworth and also won at Rylands Way, 2-1 the score in that game, Tony Malone with the Wootton Bassett Town consolation goal. These would be the only two competitive league fixtures between the two sides.

Having won Division One in their first season they went on to win the Premier Division in their first season in the top flight. They also entered the FA Vase in 1992-93 winning 2-0 away at Kintbury Rangers in the Extra Preliminary Round before going out to Bournemouth, losing 3-2 at home. That season they also made the Wiltshire Senior Cup final losing 3-1 to Bemerton Heath Harlequins.



The Club were to have just one more season in the Hellenic League finishing second from bottom and then folding at the end of that season (Season 1993-94).

They actually played at a former market garden on the edge of Highworth but could not get change of use to develop the ground fully; the plans were to enclose the ground and put in floodlights. Planning permission for the improved facilities was controversially turned down by Highworth Town Council. The ground had an excellent pitch, was railed and had a clubhouse. They were named after Terry Wollen, the former Swindon Town player, whose son Andy played for them. There were a few Hellenic League "celebrities" involved in Wollen Sports including the likes of Gary Ackling, John Fisher (pictured left) and Mick Goodwin, who later went on the play for Wootton Bassett Town.

The Wollen Sports side for the League Cup final against Wantage Town was listed as:

K.Nash, M.Thompson, D. Casserley, A.Wollen, G.Ackling, S.Robinson, R.McCrory, T.Bown, K.Little, R.Boden, M.Goodwin, M.Crossman and J.Fisher. To reach the final they had defeated Swindon Supermarine 4-0, Purton 2-1 before beating arch rivals and neighbours Highworth Town 3-1 at Chipping Norton.

How much of an impact of their rivalry with near neighbours Highworth Town had on their ultimate demise is open to conjecture. In the end the decision to deny the erecting of floodlights was probably one of the key reasons why the Club had such a short life in both Wiltshire football and the Hellenic League. Interestingly they had not been the first Club in the Highworth area to set up and challenge the Town Club as the top team in Highworth, the older readers amongst you will remember Hampton who played in the Wiltshire County League and took a number of Highworth players with them. It is testament to the strength and resilience of the committee at Highworth Town that they survive to this day and go from strength to strength whilst clubs like Wollen Sports, whilst they may achieve great things, they often have short lives.



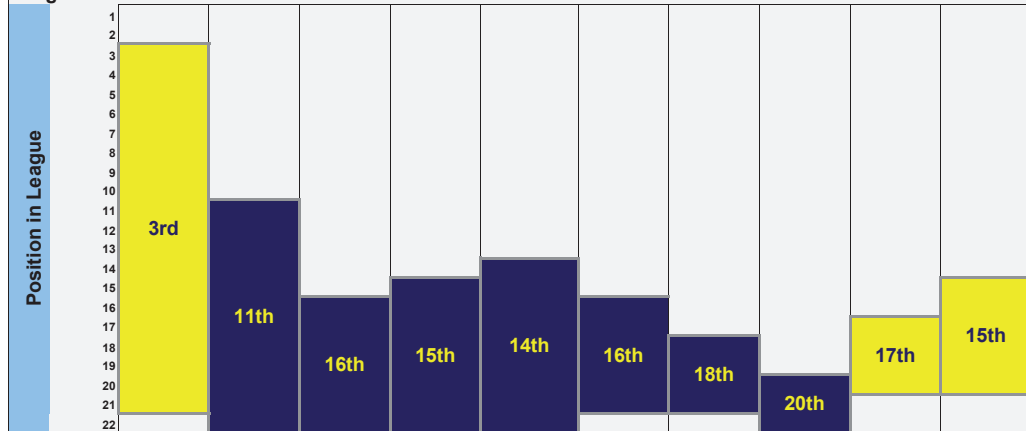

Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: You must also have played under a number of managers in your time at Wootton Bassett, can you remember all of their names and who do you consider to be the best manager of all those you played under?

BE: My first manager was Frank Davies. Frank was followed by George Hunt who was a former Swindon player [Ed: He made over 300 appearances for Swindon at right-back]. After George another ex-Swindon player Mick Woolford became our manager. Of all the managers I rated George the best, he was certainly the best I got on with and respected the most.

MS: What is your fondest memory of your time with Wootton Bassett Town?

BE: My fondest memories are probably from playing for the club's Sunday team, which was really enjoyable over the years. I guess the thing that I recall the most is the old changing room which was basically an old shed with one tin bath in it. The bath would be filled up at the end of the game but by the time I got my turn to go in it would be cold and full of mud.

MS: Knowing how muddy Rylands Way could get, I bet there was hardly any water left.

MS: In 1975 a young Gary Dixon made his Bassett debut. A huge talent, what do you remember of Gary's first steps in adult football and how good a player was he? And did you take him under your wing?

BE: I was a good mate of Gary's Dad Lionel and knew Gary was going to be a quality player. I remember he was on the books of Bristol Rovers as a youngster and turned out to be a class player for Bassett. I was not the type of player to take anyone under my wing and so no I didn't do that with Gary, but as I say he was a class player.

MS: Now a real tough one. Who would include in your Wootton Bassett Town dream team made up of only 11 players you played alongside?

BE: This is a tough question and I have had a few sleepless nights thinking about this one. In the end I have settled on Ronnie Ward in goal (sorry again Dennis), Bob Pearce, Seppy Glasscoo, Tony Vines, my brother-in-law Bob Thomas, Dave Clark, Benny Lehane, Dave Challis, Derek Powell, Tommy Gardiner and Roy Blackburn.

MS: There are some big names in the history of the Club in this eleven, and some big characters. Thank you for this, picking a dream team is definitely not an easy one.

MS: When did you finally hang your boots up?

BE: It was initially around about 1977 when I was about 30 when I moved to Bournemouth. I did however make a comeback in 1983-84 when I played for the Reserves under Dougie Gee. Dougie had been pressing me to come and play again and one day I came along to watch and they were a man short. Dougie told me to go and get my boots and I played and scored the only goal in a 1-0 win against Pewsey.

MS: Any chance that you might make a comeback in the Veterans Team next season as they struggled for goals a bit last summer?

BE: Nah, I don't think so. The brain might still be able to do it but the lungs would be the problem.

MS: You have been along to a few games at the new ground, what do you think of the new facilities?

BE: Absolutely magnificent. For any youngster starting out this is a lovely place to come and play your football. There should be no excuses for not being able to play decent football on that pitch.

MS: Talking of excuses one final question that I ask everyone. Bassett bobble at Rylands Way – fact or just an excuse used by players with poor ball control?

BE: Definite fact. There was even one down at the Rylands Way end when you came to take a penalty.

MS: Well thank you again for the time taking me down memory lane from your time as a player at the club and look forward to seeing you and more of the other ex-players in the bar this season.

Bassett rescued by another Robertson hat trick

Northcourt Road, 19th September 2015

Steve Robertson just can't stop scoring. And after nearly seeing a 3-0 advantage slip away on the road against Abingdon United, Royal Wootton Bassett Town are more than thankful for that as the frontman's third hat trick of the season – and his second this week - secured an anxiety inducing 4-2 triumph against the early season strugglers.

Ideally his three-timer would have been the focal point of this encounter. But Paul Braithwaite and his team will need to concentrate on how what should have been a comfortable triumph turned so quickly and, from the visitors' perspective, so disappointingly into a close run affair. Bassett certainly weren't at their best on this afternoon. Yet, from the evidence of the first half, nor did they need to be. Abingdon's youthful side offered little end product in the opening period with Dom White labouring fruitlessly on his own up front. It appeared as though the Bassett back four were therefore set for an easy afternoon. In addition to that lack of threat, the home side were also rash and undisciplined during the opening period, resulting in a trio of yellow cards being picked up for late challenges. That combination allowed Bassett to cruise to a 2-0 half time lead.

They took the lead twenty minutes in thanks to a well worked goal. Nathan Hawkins sprayed a diagonal ball out to Dan Bailey on the right wing, and he burst past Cameron Hawtin before eventually squaring for Steve Olphert, who swept home with precision from twelve yards. The midfielder's finish made up for an earlier miss when he squandered a one-on-one opportunity having made a clever run to latch onto a Robertson flick. And when Robertson bagged his opening goal just before the half hour, he too made up for passing up an earlier chance that he snatched at. As ever though, when he did find the net, he did so in some style. Olphert's deft header set him through, and after shrugging off the attentions of the last defender by cleverly shifting onto his right foot Robertson buried the ball into the bottom left corner from the edge of the area. He could quickly have added the team's third and his second as he raced onto Harvey Scholes' defence splitting pass before rounding 'keeper Jack Griffiths, but his attempt to slot home from an angle was cleared off the line. Despite that near miss, Bassett's two goal lead still seemed rather secure as the sides went into the break.

And, although starting shakily after the restart, the visitors bolstered it further after the hour when poor defending from the hosts allowed Robertson to slip in unnoticed, collect George Drewitt's clearance and blast beyond a helpless Griffiths. However, Bassett soon found they had a game on their hands. Really Abingdon should have been dead and buried and offered no hope of salvaging something from a lost cause. But the hosts, and in particular wingmen George Reid and Jordan Jeacock, sparked into life. Combined with a complacent approach to proceedings from Braithwaite's side as they appeared to go through the motions, the game's outcome was soon in doubt. Arguably the warning signs early in the second period should have been heeded, but Robertson's strike only seemed to reinforce the sense that the points were in the bag. How dangerous that was. Adam Bowerman soon forced Curtis Meare into an uncomfortable parry, before, having survived a double Dan Bailey chance, Jamie Essex cut into the deficit with a glancing header from a corner. With quarter of an hour to go he grabbed his second. Reid did the legwork, skipping down the right and taking on Dan Comer before squaring to his captain, who steered in confidently. By now, you got the impression that the team who got the next goal would go on to win the game. And the way momentum had swung so heavily in favour of Abingdon, fear crept in that perhaps Bassett were about to capitulate completely. They breathed a sigh of relief when Reid failed to find the target from range having cut in from the right and twisted his way past two challenges. Eventually though, in the game's final minute, Robertson completed his hat trick to extinguish any concerns. Again the goal came from a Drewitt clearance over the Abingdon defence, which Robertson charged down. Then, from an angle on the left edge of the box that he really had no permission to score from, he thrashed a low arrowed drive that bounced just in front of Griffiths, over the 'keeper's outstretched palm and into the opposite bottom corner. Albeit way after they should have been, the points were finally safe.

Man of the Match: Steve Robertson – again Bassett were indebted to his lethal finishing abilities. All three of Robertson's goals were well taken, with the third, and most important, the pick of the bunch.

Reminiscing - The Good Old Days

MS: Another major influence at the Club during your time, and perhaps the most influential of all time, was President Percy Stone who would have been Secretary when you first started playing, having held that position from 1933-34 until the end of the 1960s. What do you remember of Percy and do you think he is the most important person in the history of Wootton Bassett Town Football Club?

BE: Percy used to run the cafe in the High Street where Oscar's Kebab shop now is. I remember the players used to meet down there and the team used to be posted by Percy outside the Cross-Keys pub. The players didn't get too involved with Percy, they mainly dealt with Frank Davies the manager. Frank didn't know too much about football but he was a really good organiser and a great bloke that the players respected. Percy had been at the club for a long time and is definitely a key person in the history of the club.

MS: Season 1968-69 was a good season for both you and the Town as you finished 5th in the league and you finished 2nd top scorer with 17 goals. Roy Blackburn hit 24 that season was he the best goal scorer you played alongside at Bassett?

BE: He was definitely more of a centre forward than me. I played on the wing whilst Roy played down the middle. He was the type of player that would run through a brick wall. He was like Seppy Glasscoo in that respect. He was not the most skilful of players but he certainly scored a lot of goals. He was another player that I also played alongside on a Sunday. To answer your question, yes he probably was the best goal scorer I played alongside.

MS: The two of you scored another 30 goals between you in Season 1972-73. Can you remember which one of you finished top scorer that season?

BE: That would have to be me!

MS: Correct, we have you as scoring 17 and Roy getting 13.

MS: We have a team picture from that 1972-73 including you and Dennis Holder. How good a keeper was Dennis?

BE: Yes Dennis was a good keeper, although not quite good enough to make my dream team (sorry Dennis). He was very reliable but did struggle a bit with high centres into the box given his lack of height!

MS: In that picture is also Tony Vines who was a quality player and went on to play at a higher level for Andover I believe. What do you remember of Tony as a player and is he the best player you ever played alongside?

BE: Tony Vines in my opinion is the best player I have played alongside. He played at centre half and had this amazing ability to climb and head the ball away. He beat the centre forward in the air virtually every time, he was a brilliant player. He definitely played at Andover but I'm not sure if that was before he came to Bassett or he left us to play for them.

MS: At the end of the 1960s and start of the 1970s the top side around were Sanford, who you mentioned earlier, and who won the Wiltshire Combination 3 times in a row. Do you remember what it was like playing against Sanford and was Tony Pike as good as the newspaper reports of the time seem to infer?

BE: Sanford were definitely the top side in the area and in fact I don't remember ever beating them. Tony Pike was their star player and he played for Wiltshire. He was tall, good in the air but also deadly in and around the area. He was a much better player than me.

MS: Season 1973-74 was not a particularly memorable one for Bassett as we finished 3rd from bottom in the Combination. However, I have to ask about the top scorer that season. He scored 13 goals and his name was Bob Anderson. Was he the famous 80s darts player Bob Anderson (I have a vague recollection of someone saying he played for Bassett) and if so how did he come to play for Bassett?

BE: Yes that was the Limestone Cowboy. He lived in Broad Town at the time which is how he came to play for Bassett. He was a good player but he only played one season if I recall. He was a bit full of himself.

This week with Brian “Toby” Ewan

MS: Thank you for taking the time to be interviewed for the programme. It is great to see some of our former players coming along to see our games at the new facility.

BE: No problem, very happy to be interviewed but it is all along time ago so I may struggle with my memory.

MS: For some time now the Non-League Club Directory has shown you as the top scorer ever for Wootton Bassett Town FC. Do you have any idea how many goals you scored for the Town?

BE: Not a clue. I played for around 10 years and with the Reserves and Sunday Team it is probably up around the 150 mark. *[Ed note: Back in the 60s, 70s and 80s the club also ran a Sunday team in the Swindon Sunday League].* At one point I did leave Bassett to play at Calne Town but came back to Bassett.

MS: Time to clear up the issue around the correct spelling of your surname. The Non-League directory has it down as “Ewing”, most of the newspaper reports of Bassett games during your era had it down as “Ewen”, and that is what we have used on our website, but I now understand that it is in fact “Ewan”.

BE: That is correct it is “Ewan”. The Adver and Football Pink always got it wrong and it was Roger Williamson that always spelt it “Ewing”.

MS: It must have been Rod Carter that first provided the information to the Non-League directory with Roger having given Rod your name. Perhaps Roger was a big fan of the 70s and 80s TV programme Dallas!

MS: My son and I are writing a book about the history of the club and have been collecting results and goal scoring information from old newspapers (you can see all this information under the archive section of the club website). The earliest goal we have found attributed to you was in 1966 when you scored 2 away at Frome Town Reserves and one at Westbury. Was this your first season at the club?

BE: It must have been sometime around then. I have talked to Strawb [Les Hunt] and Dennis Holder about this as I thought it might have been earlier but after speaking to them it is probably about right.

MS: In those days few people would have had cars and the Wiltshire Premier Division had teams from Stonehouse, Salisbury (Bemerton) and Melksham (the Town and Spencer Moulton). How easy was it to get to away games then and did you ever go by train?

BE: We never went by train. No, it was by car. I had a van back in 1966 that I went to games in. Frank Davies was manager and he used to drive a few players to the games. We also had a lot of RAF boys from Lyneham and they all had cars.

MS: In those early days the players who were scoring the goals alongside you were the likes of Dave Challis, Colin Taylor and Tommy Gardiner. What do you remember of these three players?

BE: Dave Challis was a very good player. I played alongside him on a Sunday as well. He was a very heavy smoker but it didn't impact his game. I remember Colin Taylor but I didn't really play alongside him that much. What I do remember was he made a special request about my corners. In those days the balls had the laces in them and he wanted me to always deliver the corner so that the laces were away from his forehead! Tommy Gardiner was the best of the lot. He was a class player and I recall he also played for Sanford who were the top side around Swindon.

MS: At the end of the 1960s Bob Thomas started to play for the Club. Bob was to become Chairman in the 70s and, if I recall, built the stand at Rylands Way. What do you remember of Bob and his influence at the Club?

BE: Well actually you know that Bob was my brother-in-law having married my sister?

MS: No sorry in the asking the question, I didn't know that. Obviously then you knew him very well.

BE: Bob was hard as nails. He wasn't the most skilful player but he gave everything in a game from start to finish, a great leader. I recall he also used to run the bingo for the club. It was also he that took me to Swindon Victoria before joining Bassett, which must have been around the time he first started courting my sister.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

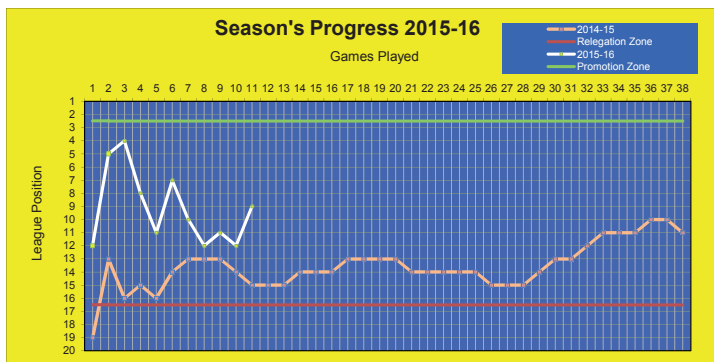
Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivenham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

Free scoring forward who re-joined the Club from Shrivenham last season. Despite joining part way through the season he netted an impressive 12 times in just 16 games.

Ryan Thomas (midfield)



Skilful, creative and difficult to defend against, Thomas is a quality attacking midfielder player who is a threat from out wide or through the middle where he can create space for himself in between the lines.

The son of Steve Thomas – who enjoyed an illustrious and lengthy career for Bassett throughout the 1980s and early 1990s - the attacking midfielder is extremely gifted and capable of turning a game on its head. Whilst small in stature, Thomas can dance away from defenders with ease and also knows where the back of the net is.

Thomas' previous spell with Bassett was a successful, albeit brief one as he helped then-manager Dave Turner's team secure promotion from Hellenic League Division One West in 2009/10. Though he made 19 of his 22 appearances that year from the bench, he made an impact in many of them. He made his debut in the home derby against Purton in August, before his first league start came at home to Lydney Town in mid-September. And he

certainly made the most of that opportunity, getting himself on the scoresheet in a convincing 5-0 victory. He went onto to find the back of the net twice more. He completed the scoring in a 5-0 drubbing of Launton Sports in March with an exquisite curling effort from 25 yards before side-footing home the only goal of the game at Tytherington Rocks – just moments after his introduction to the game – to seal at least a top three finish and promotion.

His chances were more limited than he would have hoped in the Premier Division, however, and he made just seven substitute appearances in 2010/11. In order to get more first team football, Thomas moved to Cricklade Town, scoring four times in 18 games and earning the Young Player of the Year award as his team finished seventh in Division One West.

He began the 2010/11 campaign at Stones Lane, scoring twice in four games, with his form enough to catch the attention of Highworth Town manager Dave Webb. In 26 games with the Worthians, 12 of which he started, Thomas scored twice.

Thomas was back at Cricklade for the start of the 2012/13 season, scoring six goals in 15 games. An unfortunate knee injury then kept him out for the 2013/14 campaign. After recovering, he re-signed with Bassett ahead of last season, but suffered another injury in pre-season, which, along with work commitments, limited him to just 12 appearances, 6 of which were starts.

Thomas is a Cirencester Academy graduate, although whilst an under 16 he featured for Bassett's Floodlit League side. During his time at the Corinium Stadium he was a feature of the side that made it to the third round of the FA Youth Cup where the Centurions lost at the Stadium of Light to Sunderland.

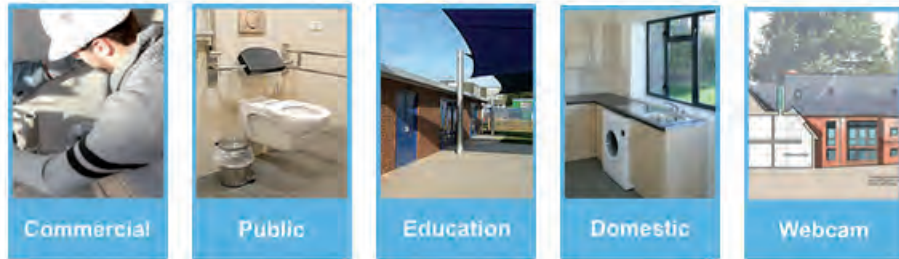

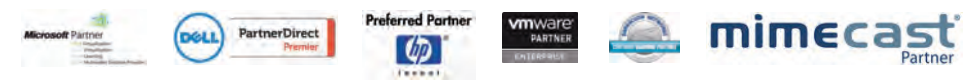

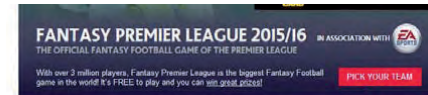

F.A. Cup

Dreams of the FA Cup first round proper are edging ever closer following the fourth round qualifying draw last Monday.

With 32 ties decided, the National League sides are welcomed in on the action as we prepare for the big stories of 2015. But this season's Cup has already thrown up plenty of excitement with some increasingly familiar names making their mark.

Bognor Regis striker Alex Parsons is making a name for himself, adding a giant-killing double to his exposure following his modelling exploits just a month ago.

The 22-year-old won The Sun's "Hunk Hunt" in August and was awarded a professional photoshoot for his efforts. These shots were a far cry from those of his uncontrollable elation at scoring twice in the world's most famous cup competition.

Bognor hosted National League South side, Oxford City, who are sitting pretty in second in the league, and the underdogs looked to be on their way out of the competition trailing 2-1 with just 18 minutes left to play.

However, Parsons entered the frame on 63 minutes and showed why he is a proven winner.

The Ryman Premier side prevailed 4-2, thanks to Parsons' impact, and their draw will require them to cause another shock.

Wealdstone, who sit 18th in National League South, will welcome the dangerous Rocks in the next round, but they also put on a memorable performance that did not go unnoticed.

The national media caught on to Scott Davies' impressive finish from inside his own half. The stunner is floating around YouTube as the midfielder ambitiously struck home from 70 yards.

When you are 3-1 up in your FA Cup tie, giving it a go from that range is surely always forgiven – especially if it comes off. The unbelievable strike stunned Grigg Lane in injury time and played its part in a comfortable 5-1 victory against Wessex Premier Division side Brockenhurst.

Having gone in to the break all square at 1-1, the underdogs must have hoped for a potential upset but it was not to be with the finish banishing any hopes of the Badgers dominating the headlines.

But the higher ranked sides have not been handed an easy time of it as they get their Cup campaign under way.

Tranmere Rovers host fellow National League side Lincoln City and current leaders Forest Green travel to National League South side Margate. The Gate picked up their first home win of the season against Truro City to book their place in the next round.

With prize money steadily rising to £12,500 for the winners of the matches to be played on October 24, the prospect of a possible money-making meeting with a Football League club is potentially just 90 minutes away.

The question is now – which players, teams or stand out finishes will make the headlines next time out and will a Football League side have to cope with a model professional stealing their limelight?

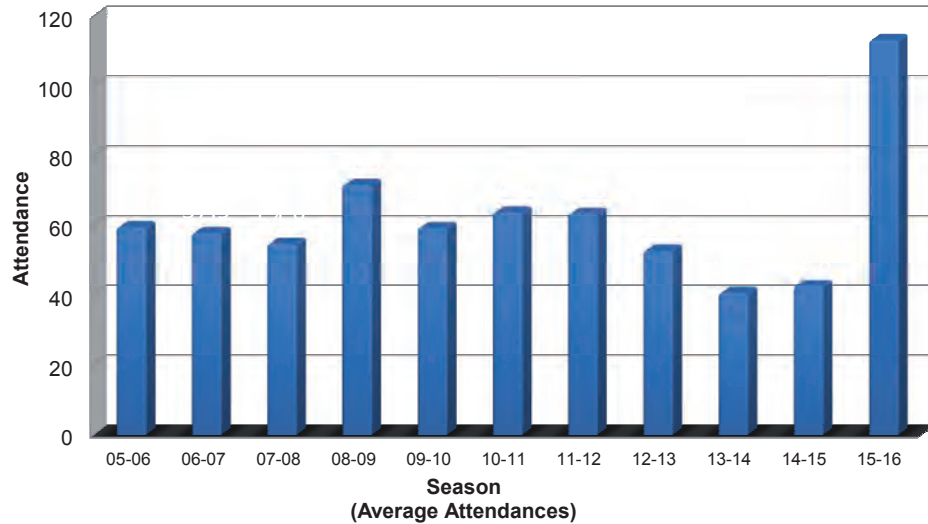

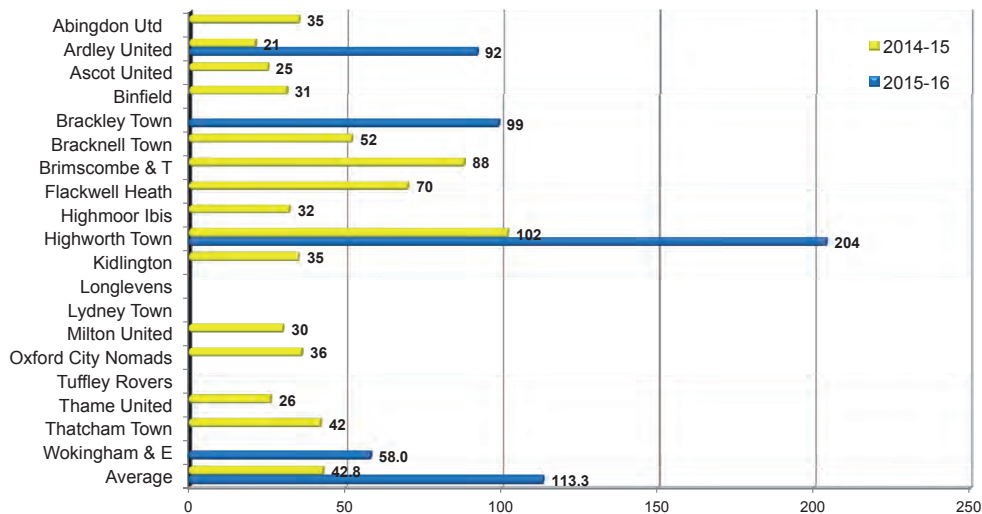
The only other game saw Melksham Town Reserves defeat Devizes Town Reserves 5-2 to consolidate in fourth place in the table.

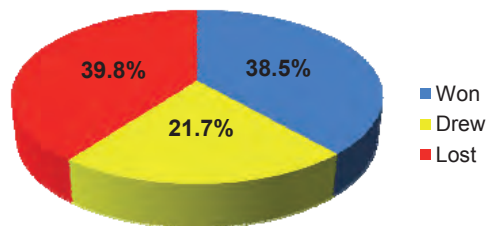

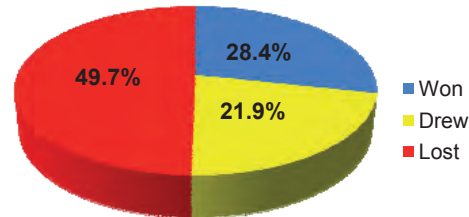

Match Reports

Banana skin successfully avoided

New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, 10th October

It may have taken a cheap penalty twenty minutes from time for Royal Wootton Bassett Town to finally separate themselves from the tricky challenge posed by County League Ludgershall Sports. But Steve Olphert's successful conversion and an additional strike late on from Steve Robertson – his second of the game - eventually sealed a 3-1 victory and passage through to the second round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup. Bassett certainly weren't at their best as they encountered opponents from two levels below them on the football pyramid. However, while a commanding performance would have been preferable to instil a greater level of confidence ahead of a testing run of league games, this County Cup contest was more about ensuring an embarrassing early exit was avoided.

A slow start aside, Robertson's opener after eleven minutes offered hope that his team wouldn't face as much trouble as they did in seeing off Malmesbury Victoria and Wroughton in the competition last year. Moments after Ryan Thomas had struck the inside of the right upright and seen the ball trickle agonisingly across the face of goal, Robertson, receiving a throw in and cutting in from the right, put the hosts ahead with a powerful low drive inside the near post. Ludgershall, who put in an impressive display, were back on level terms within quarter of an hour though. Having forced a corner after a counter in which the Bassett defence was outnumbered, the visitors exposed their hosts' weaknesses from set pieces. Stephen Witt's delivery to the far post was re-directed across goal by Alan Jordan and Sam Walsh flicked a header in from close range. Bassett's response to the equaliser was muted, with Robertson, Thomas and Steve Yeardley all passing up chances before the interval. The best fell to Yeardley, but, rushing in to connect with a low Thomas cross, he skewed his first time attempt wide from twelve yards. That opportunity came after Ludgershall had spurned their own great chance to edge ahead. Outmuscling Adam Corcoran to latch onto Luke Bates' ball into the left channel, David Cotter bore down on goal before shooting into the side netting from a tight angle while one-on-one with Luke Kuczynski. Despite that miss, the visitors were a happy bunch headed into the break. Bassett, on the other hand, were not. A half time wake-up call initially failed to spark Paul Braithwaite's team into life though. They continued to lack ideas, dwelling on the ball too long rather than moving it with the necessary speed to pick open their opponents.

Early after the restart they were limited to shots from distance from Dan Comer and Thomas, while Robertson was able to round 'keeper Darren Leach, but from an extremely tight angle could only find the side netting. Eventually they were gifted a chance to move back ahead. Yeardley did well to control a quickly taken Robertson free kick from the right wing that the club's captain wasn't expecting to receive. Finally assuring himself of possession, he burst into the box where Kevin McWilliams caught him with an outstretched leg. Yeardley went to ground and referee John Graham awarded a penalty, which Olphert confidently dispatched, sending Leach the wrong way. The midfielder's fifth of the season – and fourth from the spot – finally ushered in a period in which Bassett asserted control over the game. They were still somewhat unconvincing though, and were unable to take full advantage of Ludgershall's tiring legs. Frequently the hosts got in behind the Ludgershall defence, but they were only able to add one more goal. That was partly down to a fine performance from gloveman Leach. With quarter of an hour to go, he brilliantly batted away a Robertson strike after the forward had expertly taken down a Dan Comer cross. He then parried away from substitute Joe Hiscock as the forward, making his first appearance since returning to the club from Purton, sought to steer past him while one-on-one. Debutant Dan Smith then saw an attempted lob glide wide after he jumped on a stray pass and raced towards goal. With three minutes to go, Robertson finally made certain of victory, receiving Christy Millar's cross, stepping inside of marker Jordan and burying a low shot beyond Leach. There was to be no hat trick for the forward thanks to Leach, however, as the 'keeper kept his nerve again with his defence breached. Millar should have put away the rebound, but a weak header was hacked away off the line.

Man of the Match: Matt Cheetham – particularly strong in the second half, the centre midfielder kept things ticking with minimal fuss. His tackling helped prevent Ludgershall from initiating attacks, while he looked to be positive with his passing when in possession of the ball.

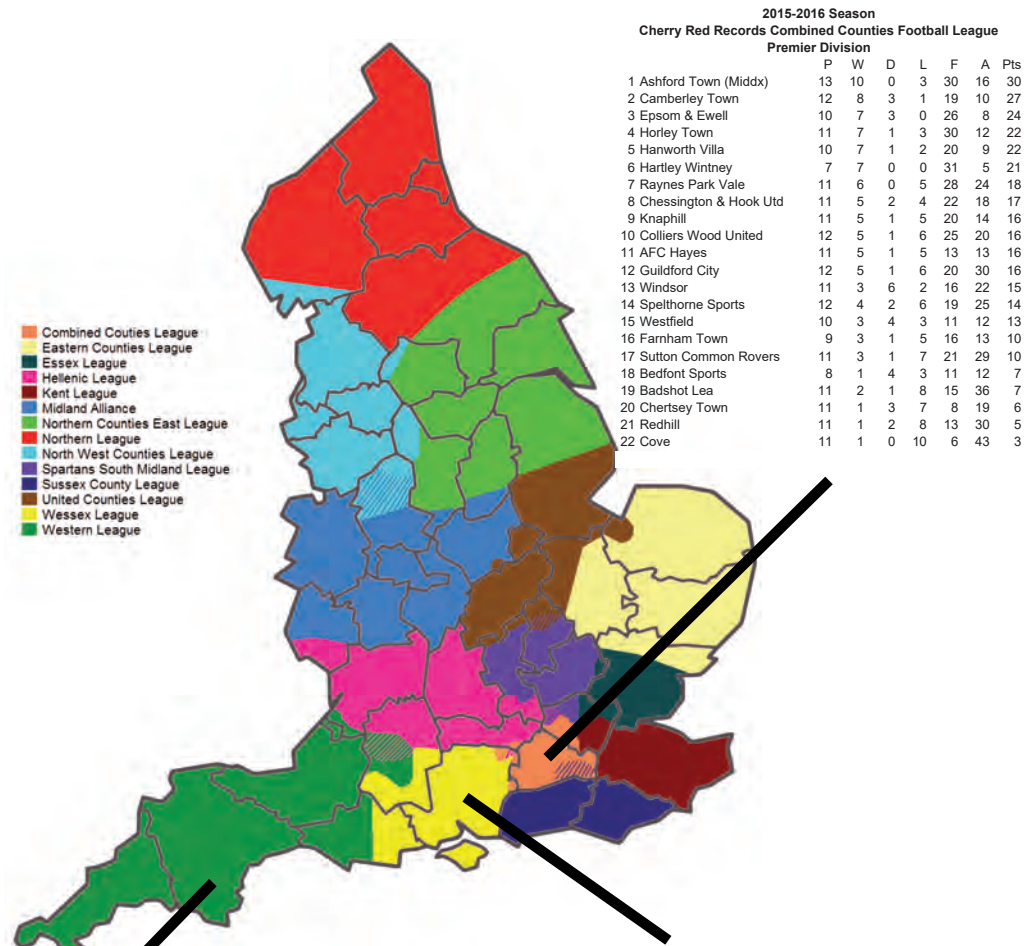
