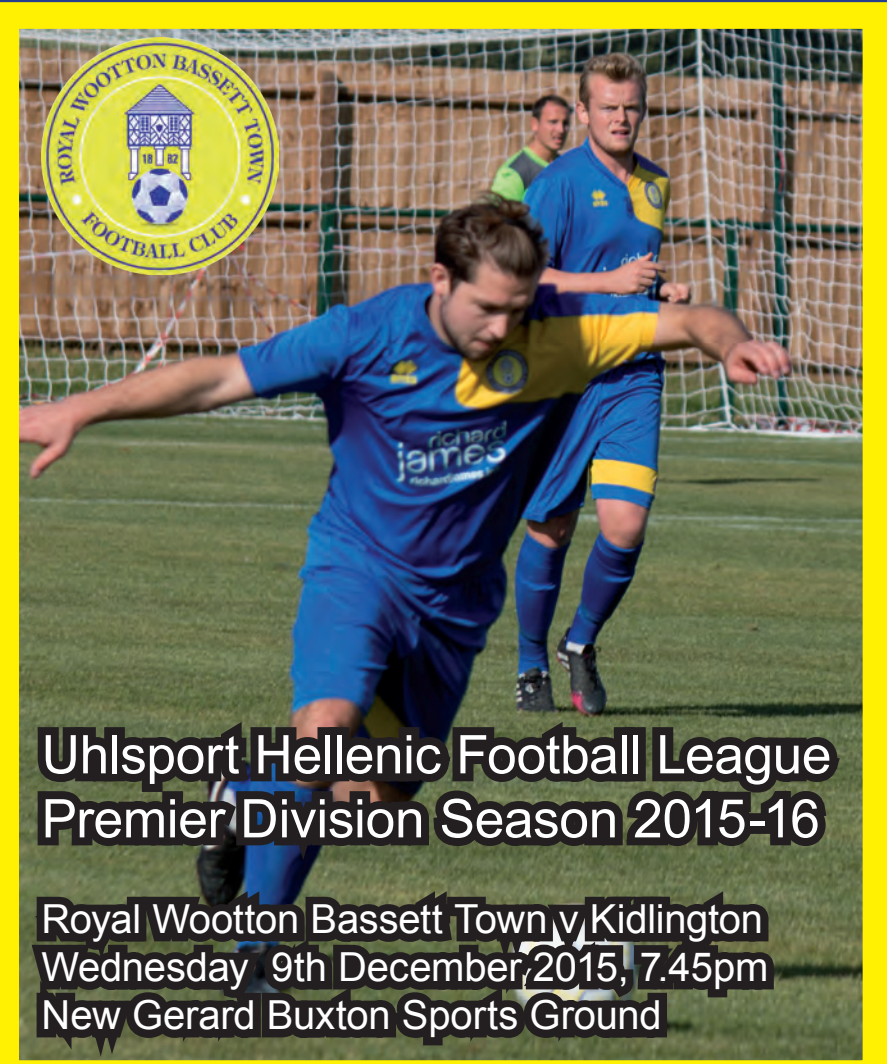

Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Kidlington

Tonight sees another UHlsport Hellenic League side make their first visit to the New Gerard Buxton Ground when league leaders Kidlington visit our new home. A warm welcome to all from Kidlington for this evening's UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. We hope all from Kidlington enjoy their first visit to our new ground and we wish them a safe journey home.

Kidlington went top of the table on Saturday thanks to a 3-1 home win over Brackley Town Saints. With previous leaders Flackwell Heath otherwise engaged in Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup action Kidlington took full advantage to go one point clear at the top, both teams having played nineteen games. Highworth Town are just below Flackwell, two points behind Kidlington having also played nineteen games. For all three teams this is the half way stage of the season and it looks like it is going to be another tight finish in the UHlsport Hellenic League this season.

Looking at Kidlington's record they have only failed to score in one game all season, that a 2-0 defeat away at Oxford City Nomads and in Anaclet Odhiambo (19 goals) and Lewis Coyle (16 goals) have two of the top strikers in the division in their ranks. Last season Kidlington finished in 4th place, which was their best ever performance at Step 5 level, having finished 6th the previous season, and look like they are again going to improve on that best ever finish again this coming season. Last season Kidlington beat us easily at their place by five goals to nil, the game being played early season. The return at Cirencester in March demonstrated how much we had improved over the season when we secured a point from a 1-1 draw, Callum Wright with our goal. Over the years we have met Kidlington on 34 occasions and it is pretty even between the two sides with Kidlington just edging it with fourteen wins to our twelve, eight games having been drawn.

Thame United

Well we have finally achieved that first ever victory over Thame United at the eighth time of asking. In awful conditions throughout the win was based on a great backs to the wall defensive performance in the first half as Thame were unable to make the strong wind behind their backs count. Having got to half time without conceding we duly made use of the wind scoring from two in-swinging corners from Dale Richards which caused all kinds of problems to the Thame keeper and allowed young Dan Comer to register his first and second goals for the Club. A great game for Dan but also solid performances at the back from Nathan Hawkins, Dale Richards and young Dan Carter. Scoop gave Nathan Hawkins man of the match and whilst there was little in it, I personally would have given man of the match to Dan Comer for those two goals on top of the sterling performance at centre-back.

Floodlit Cup exit

On an evening on which we were second best to a spirited Lydney Town the previous Wednesday saw Royal Wootton Bassett Town fall short of reaching the last eight of the Hellenic League Floodlit Cup as, despite taking the lead, we were beaten 2-1 by our Gloucestershire visitors. The opening period was largely all Lydney. However, the prolific Steve Robertson struck on the stroke of half time to give Bassett a surprise lead heading into the break. A second half double from Declan Morley-Lyne earned the visitors the victory, and passage to the quarter finals, they arguably deserved. Morley-Lyne found the net first from a free kick, whose reward was somewhat dubious. His second, to which Bassett could muster no answer, then came with quarter of an hour remaining. Any hopes of silverware for Bassett this season are now reliant upon progress in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, the quarter final for which we play against Melksham Town in a fortnight's time, and the Challenge Cup. With all but one of the Second round games having been played hopefully we will hear who our next opponents are in the Challenge Cup in the next day or so. Performances in our next fixtures in both competitions will certainly have to be better than the Lydney one if those cup dreams are to remain alive.

First a great header that was missed by the keeper and then a rebound off the post that he drove in from four yards out. The desire shown for both goals and the quality of the delivery were fantastic.

As a group though every player worked hard for 95 minutes, Sam Packer and Robo ran themselves into the ground in the second half up top and like the Thatcham and Ascot games the win was well deserved.

Hopefully we can bring this good league form into this tough encounter this evening against the side who are just about everyone's favourite for the title.

Opponents - History

Kidlington FC • Club History



Kidlington FC was founded in 1909 and played local village football up to WW2. Success was slow in coming, records show their first trophy was achieved in 1929, the Lord Jersey Cup Final against Fritwell. The Lord Jersey Cup was a competition highly prized among the villages in the Cherwell Valley; rivalry was so keen that players had to prove they were residents of the village for whom they played

In 1945, Kidlington moved from village football to play in the Oxford City Junior League, with a good deal of success in both league and cup. By 1951 the Oxfordshire Senior League was entered, where stronger competition was provided by the likes of Witney Town; Morris Motors; Pressed Steel & Thame United.

1953 The Hellenic League formed, the Oxon Senior League immediately lost some of its stronger clubs to the new league. Kidlington won the Senior League title that next season, joining the new league in 1954. Early days in the Hellenic League showed quite clearly the difference in standard. Kidlington maintained a Premier Division place for a time, but spent most of the 60's in Division One. The 70's started with winning the County Intermediate Cup Final, along with two further County final places in the decade. Both epic battles against a very talented Peppard side, who won on both occasions. A squad of good young players produced Kidlington's best ever run in an FA competition, when in 1976-77. Having played every round but one away from home, Kidlington reached the last 16 in the FA Vase, bowing out to Gosport Borough. The nucleus of this side eventually gained promotion back to the Premier Division in 1979-80. The 80's saw Kidlington return to Division One, the County Cup produced few consistent performances, other than in 1983-84 when Kidlington were 5 minutes away from a place in the final. The early 90's were steady, Season 94-95 brought silverware at last, Martin Bakers' Reserves side did the League/Cup double. An upturn in the first team fortunes occurred when Karl Grossmann assembled a formidable tough tackling side, finishing in the top 6 of Division One in four successive seasons.

The new millennium brought with it a major overhaul to the committee and a new Chairman in Geoff Talboys. In 2004-05, under the guidance of Kevin Walton the first team finish in third place, with it promotion back into the Hellenic Premier Division. With promotion came a struggle with the considerable difference in the standard of football compared to Division One, losing the first twelve games. The season petered out in frustration as the team finished in a relegation position ... however a national non-league re-structure saved them from the dreaded drop.

In 2007 - 2008, first team silverware arrived at Yarnton Road for the 1st time in over 30 years, winning the Floodlit Trophy under the guidance of manager Paul Lee. With additional honours this year from the Reserves, who won Reserve Division One for a second consecutive season, The Youth winning the Oxfordshire U18 Youth Cup, and to cap the season Kidlington Vet's retained their Veteran League crown. Season 2008-09 was again a good one for all our teams. Our 1st Team finished in a very respectable 9th position in the league and had some good cup runs, the Reserves finished 3rd in their league but unfortunately yet again were runners up in the Oxfordshire Intermediate Cup final. 2009-10 came a new Chairman, Lloyd Wray, and new team management, ex-player Gordon Geary was recruited to look after 1st team affairs and Barry Hiles to run the Reserve team. Season 2010-11 saw the club, under the same management structure, achieve it's most successful season ever. Our best league finish ever, a superb effort by all saw us play a very strong Oxford United team, at the Kassam Stadium in the final of the Oxfordshire Senior Cup. We did win some silverware though, we beat Purton 3-0 in the final of the Supplementary Cup Abingdon Town. In December 2011 Geary and his assistant Appleton decided to leave stating they had taken the club as far as they could. Players Danny Leggett and Christian Perkins stepped forward to guide the club through till the end of the season. This season was very frustrating but owing to some decent early league results the club maintained its Premier division status. Ex-Oxford United striker Paul Berry was appointed manager for season 2012/13, however he resigned after only three matches to pursue alternative opportunities. Gordon Geary was persuaded to come out of retirement and was re-appointed as manager during the second week of the season. Geary managed to assemble a squad with the ability to avoid the dreaded drop achieving a respectable 13th position. Martin Wilkinson and Chris Peacock took control as Manager and Assistant of the first team at the start of season 2013-14. Under their guidance the club experienced it's highest ever level of achievement in it's Hellenic League history ending the season in 6th place of the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division.

In season 2014-15 again under Wilkinson's guidance Kidlington once again managed their highest league finish this time of 4th place after topping the table for several weeks. Wilkinson has appointed Julian McCalmon as his assistant ahead of the 2015-16 campaign and the bar has now been raised and Kidlington will look to surpass that level.

Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents no longer competing, today's featured team is.....

Winterbourne United

Whilst the Club still exists, the shock news this week of Winterbourne United's resignation from the Western League with immediate effect means that the club are no longer competing at the Step 5/6 level and a valid reason for including them in our defunct clubs feature.

Winterbourne United Football Club were formed in 1911 and were formerly known as Winterbourne Wasps until the outbreak of the First World War. The Club entered the Bristol & Suburban League and enjoyed one of the most successful periods in their history. They finished as runners up in the league no less than 4 times during the 1930's and in the 1933-34 season reached the semi-finals of the G.F.A. Senior Amateur Cup, losing to Victoria Albion. On the way to the final a crowd of over 2,000 witnessed a game against Dockland Settlement.

During the Second World War, the local Home Guard kept football going in the village until peacetime. In 1950-51 the Club joined the Bristol & District League. In 1967-68 the Club moved into senior football after it won the Bristol & District League Division One Championship and the GFA Intermediate Cup. This success brought promotion to the Premier Combination and three years later the Club won the Second Division Championship. Winterbourne continued membership of the County of Avon Premier Combination until their most successful season 1991-92, winning the Premier Combination Cup and finishing runners-up in the Premier Division. As a result the Club gained promotion to the Gloucestershire County League for the first time.

A poor season in 1995-96 saw the club relegated back to the Bristol Premier Combination. The slump did not last long as just one year later they marched back into the County League by winning the double of league champions and GFA Senior Amateur Cup winners. In 2000-1 they finished as champions of the Gloucestershire County League to gain promotion to the Hellenic League. That is when Wootton Bassett Town first played Winterbourne United.

Season 2005-6 was a very successful one for the Club when they won Division one West but were denied promotion due to their ground not meeting the ground grading requirements. In 2007-08 they again won the Division One West title but were again denied promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division due to their facilities. Season 2011-12 saw them finish 3rd in Division one West and secure a promotion spot. Having moved into GFA Headquarters at Almondsbury, formerly the home of Almondsbury Town who were promoted up out of the Hellenic League, Winterbourne were able to finally take a position at the Step 5 level. However, rather than play in the Hellenic Premier with all the travel to the East they sought and were granted a transfer to the Western Football League Premier Division for the 2012-13 Season.

In total Wootton Bassett Town played Winterbourne United on fourteen occasions, winning eight times, drawing twice and, despite their successful record in the Hellenic League, only losing four times to Winterbourne. We were somewhat of a bogey side for them with our record looking even better until their final season in the Hellenic as two of those defeats came in that final season. The first meeting between the two clubs was on 29th September 2001 in the League Cup when goals from Mark Vaughan, Jack Dodd and Justin Hyde gave us a 3-1 win. The final meeting between the two sides was on 9th April 2012 at Rylands Way when Winterbourne left with all three points following a 2-1 win, Matty Bown with our consolation goal that day.

On 3rd December 2015 the Western League announced the following 'It is with deep regret that we have to inform you all of the resignation of Winterbourne United from the Toolstation Western League Premier Division with immediate effect'. Winterbourne were second bottom in the Premier Division table after a difficult season that had seen various changes in manager.

Tearle Wonder Goal and Thompson Wonder Save Give Bassett Historical Win

Rylands Way, 4th October 2008

An exquisite chip from Phil Tearle to beat the Kidlington keeper in the second period of extra-time followed by a Stewart Thompson penalty save saw Wootton Bassett Town through to the Second Round Proper of the F.A. Vase for the first time in the Club's history.

It was fitting that, in the week that the move to the new ground came closer to reality, it was a product of the Club's expanding Youth Section who scored the winning goal in this important money spinning match. Tearle has played for the Club since he was an Under 10 and is seen by the many youngsters who currently play for the Club's youth set-up as an inspirational figure who has shown that if you are good enough the door to the First Team is open to you.

In front of a healthy Rylands Way crowd Bassett started the game well and went in front courtesy of a well taken goal from another youngster, Lee Moulton, on 19 minutes. Following a flowing passing move the ball came to Moulton on the left of the box, he cut inside and put the ball into the far corner of the net giving the Kidlington keeper no chance. A cool finish for a youngster who continues to impress down the left hand side of Bassett's midfield.

Bassett extended the lead a minute later when a penalty was awarded for a foul on Ryan Banks. With regular penalty taker Steve Yeardeley away running the Great North Run, it fell to top scorer Shaun Terry to take the kick. Memories of the missed penalty in the earlier round at Buckingham came flooding back but this time Terry made no mistake and fired the kick into the net.

Missing match reporter Scoop was duly sent a text advising of the second goal and it took two more such texts to convince him; yes Shaun had scored a penalty!

Two-nil to Bassett at the break and in reality Bassett had dominated play with the back three of Chris

Oram, Shaun Carter and Luke Sharps giving the Kidlington strikers little opportunity in front of goal and the midfield, particularly Tom Richie and Richie Carter in the centre, working tirelessly to close down the Kidlington players, including former Wycombe Wanderers and Doncaster Rovers pro Jermaine McSporran.

The second half saw Kidlington come out all guns blazing but despite a lot of possession and neat passing football Bassett held onto the two goal lead. However, a harshly awarded free-kick on the edge of the 18 yard box allowed Morgan Williams to fire a free kick into the back of Stewart Thompson's net to make it 2-1 on 50 minutes.

Chris Oram and Shaun Carter continued to deny the lively Kidlington strikers but Bassett were to suffer a setback on 79 minutes just as they thought they were going to get the win. Bassett were slow to react to a ball down the left which allowed Mark Flanagan to get away and bear down on the Bassett goal and Flanagan fired a powerful low drive past Stewart Thomson to send the game into extra-time.

Just when thoughts were turning to a replay on Tuesday up stepped substitute Tearle and that cheeky wonder goal. A ball over the top saw Tearle race away from the Kidlington defence and as the Kidlington keeper came out he deftly chipped the ball over him and into the empty net, cue celebrations not seen at Rylands Way for many a year.

However, within a minute the euphoria had gone as Shaun Carter handled the ball in the Bassett box and the referee pointed to the spot. Time for the second hero of the day to step forward. Kidlington's striker fired the penalty low to the left of keeper Stewart Thomson, but Thompson had guessed the right way and pulled off a magnificent save.

In the second period of extra time Kidlington pushed forward in search of an equaliser but left themselves vulnerable to the break. One such occasion saw Shaun Terry do the difficult bit of turning his defender on the edge of the box and with the keeper way off his line the opportunity was there to put the

result beyond doubt but his curled shot just went the wrong side of the post. Bassett survived a late scare but clung on for the history making win that sends them into the last 128 in this prestigious national competition. The £1,000 prize money will have gone down well in the Committee Room.

Man of the Match: Tom Richie / Richie Carter – tremendous work rate in centre midfield and difficult to pick one out.



Rating (using the famous Scoop scale): 9/10 – a great team effort from start to finish. Bassett dominated first half but in second half it was the visitors led by Jermaine McSporren who put Bassett under pressure in the second half but the work levels never dropped and a deserved win in an excellent game of football.

RWBTFC History On One Page

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

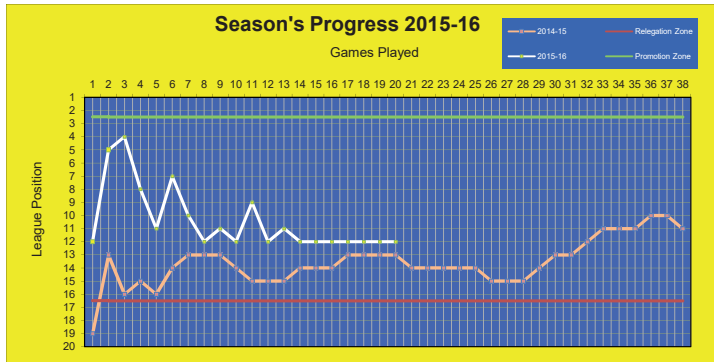
Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

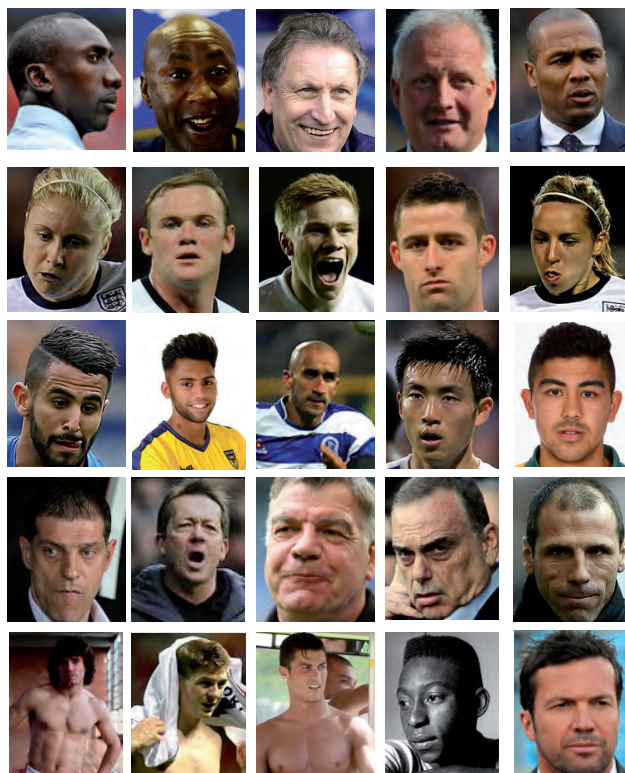

Betting Clampdown

THE Football Association has issued a reminder to players and club officials at Steps 5 to 7 of the National League System that they are not allowed to bet on competitions they are involved in. The move follows a spike in referrals from betting companies identifying individuals at these levels betting on FA Vase matches.

While there is no suggestion of any attempts to fix matches, the fact betting companies are offering an ever-expanding football market has led to the game's governing body issuing a timely reminder. Players and club officials at Steps 5 to 7 fall outside the FA's worldwide betting ban which came into force on August 1 2014. Instead, they are prohibited from betting, either directly or indirectly, on a match or competition in which they are involved or could influence. The using or passing on of inside information for betting is also banned.

Jenni Kennedy, the FA's Head of Integrity, said: "Whilst it may seem a novelty for players and officials at Steps 5 to 7 to bet on their team when betting companies rarely offer the opportunity to do so, it remains a breach of FA rules and could lead to disciplinary proceedings being taken.

"This rule is in place to protect the integrity of the game and to prevent any allegations of wrongdoing. We take this opportunity to remind all players and club officials to take note of this advice."

The FA works in partnership with the Gambling Commission and the betting operators to identify individuals who breach football and betting rules. Meanwhile, Morpeth Town have been granted a place in the FA Vase third round after their opponents 1874 Northwich withdrew from the competition. The decision came after an appeal by 1874 to play their rearranged second round tie yesterday was rejected by the FA. Originally, the match was set to be played at Morpeth last Saturday but was postponed due to the poor weather. Unable to assemble a team for the 380-mile round-trip, the North West Counties Premier side did not travel for the match on Wednesday. Northern League Division one side Morpeth will now travel to South Shields on December 12.

Chairman of 1874 Northwich, Paul Stockton, told The NLP: "This is in no way a criticism of anyone at Morpeth Town or the FA.

"But I will say that we are extremely disappointed with the decision we have had to make, and we had hoped that Morpeth Town would have supported our appeal.

"We felt a midweek trip of 193 miles were exceptional circumstances to try and change the tie. Even including some of our U21 side, we were only able to get eight players together.

"All of our players have full-time jobs and were unable to commit to the travelling, and it would not have been a competitive match. If the boot had been on the other foot, we would have supported them."

Morpeth Town were not willing to discuss the decision when contacted by The NLP but club secretary David McMeekan did say: "The Cup Committee made a decision."

A spokesman for the FA said: "A midweek replay date had been agreed between both clubs should the first match be drawn and a replay was required, which would have meant Morpeth Town travelling to 1874 Northwich midweek.

"Based on the written submissions from 1874 Northwich to request the game be rescheduled, these reasons were considered by The FA Vase Committee, however, the decision was made that the match must be played on Wednesday 25th November and is final."

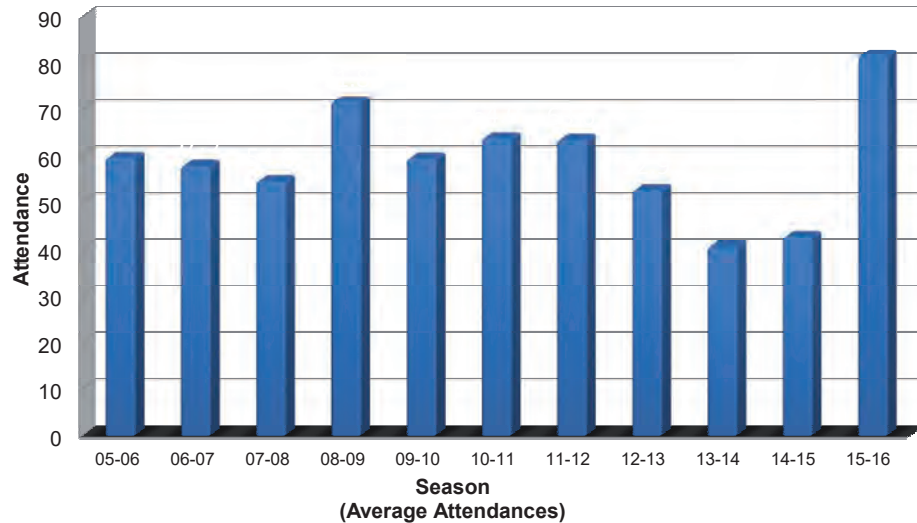

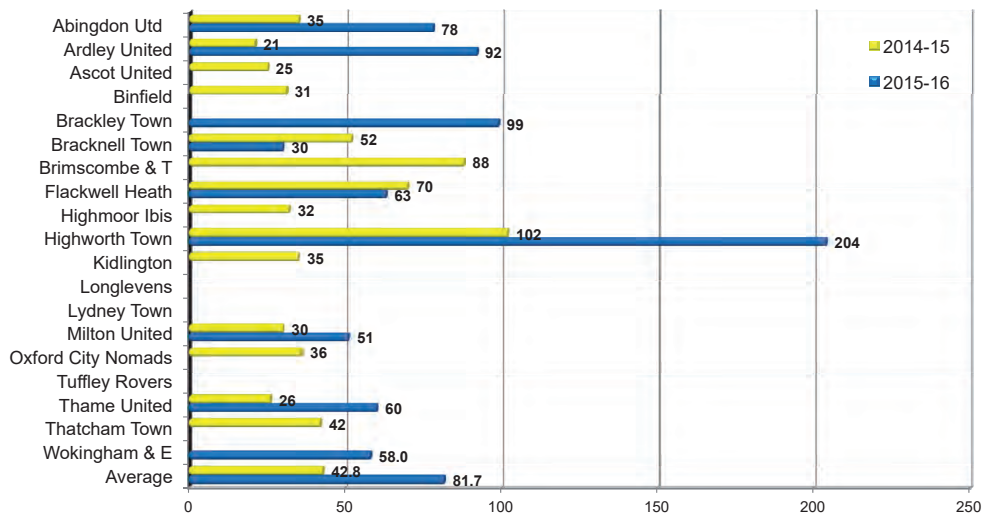

Match Reports

Bassett win with the wind in their sails

New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, 5th December 2015

While their 2-0 victory was heavily assisted by the ferocious December winds, Royal Wootton Bassett Town deservedly claimed another scalp of one of the Hellenic League Premier Division's leading sides as a second half brace from Dan Comer helped account for sixth place Thame United. Comer's pair of goals were near identical, the defender heading and stabbing in from close range after Thame stopper Steve Clarke, enduring a torrid afternoon, misjudged two inswinging corners from Dale Richards.

The duo's combination at that end of the pitch ultimately made sure it was three points Bassett wound up taking from the match. But it was their efforts in defence in the opening period, alongside those of Nathan Hawkins – whose performance was imperious, debutant right back Dan Carter and 'keeper Curtis Meare, which laid the foundations from which their team could go on to victory. With clearances rarely getting any further than the halfway line and Thame therefore enjoying the lion's share of play, playing against the wind prior to the break demanded the utmost concentration. Indeed, conditions were so bad, conceding just one goal would have been seen as an achievement. Bassett's defensive quintet delivered better than that though, standing firm in the face of persistent pressure from the visitors to ensure the half ended goalless. Thame certainly helped matters as they failed to master the elements and take advantage of having the wind behind them. It took them until the 20th minute to create their first chance, which Luke Ricketts squandered as he shot tamely across the face of goal after racing onto Dan West's through ball into the left channel. The visitors also found Meare in top form. He was first called into action when he acrobatically prevented a looping header back from Comer from flying over him. While his reactions there were impressive, the saves he pulled off to first deny David Lynn and then keep out Daniel Pounds were infinitely better. On 28 minutes, after patient build up play in the final third, Lynn surged forward before striking a piledriver from 20 yards, which Meare, flying to his left and outstretched, diverted over with a single-handed tip save. Moments later, a long ball over the top set Pounds in free behind the defence, but Meare, with a Schmeichel-esque starfish spread at point blank range, brilliantly managed to steer his poke from ten yards around the post. Then from the resultant corner, one of many that Thame won in the first half and failed to capitalise upon, Nick Dugmore planted a header over from close range. Having survived that barrage of pressure, Bassett could have taken the lead from two forays into opposition territory late in the period. However, Dan Bailey mishit from a Richards pull back when in a good position, while a curling Ryan Thomas effort from 20 yards brought an awkward parry from Clarke.

Going forward soon became much easier for the hosts as they had the wind at their back following the restart. And they quickly used it to their benefit. On 48 minutes, Richards whipped in his first inswinging corner to the edge of the six yard box, which Clarke failed to claim, allowing Comer to nod in from a matter of yards. Demonstrating how dangerous corners could be on an afternoon so blustery, another Richards set piece then crashed against the bar with Clarke, failing to judge the wind, off his line in no man's land. With 65 minutes on the clock, his low delivery was spilled onto the near post by Clarke and Comer again had the fortune of finding himself in the right position at the right time to prod the rebound home from a yard out. Thame having no recourse to a reply, Comer's second served to sew up the points for Bassett. The final twenty five minutes were therefore a relatively comfortable affair. Yet Paul Braithwaite's side refused to take their foot off the gas, and could have had three when clever play from Joe Hiscock in the right corner allowed him to feed a pass inside for Steve Robertson. The division's leading scorer failed to build on his 22 goals so far this campaign, however, as his toe poke from 12 yards was blocked.

Man of the Match: Nathan Hawkins – despite being just 22, Hawkins was the elder statesman of Bassett's back five and marshalled the back line with maturity and class in the opening period. That helped make sure they failed to concede prior to the break and was crucial in setting the team up for victory.

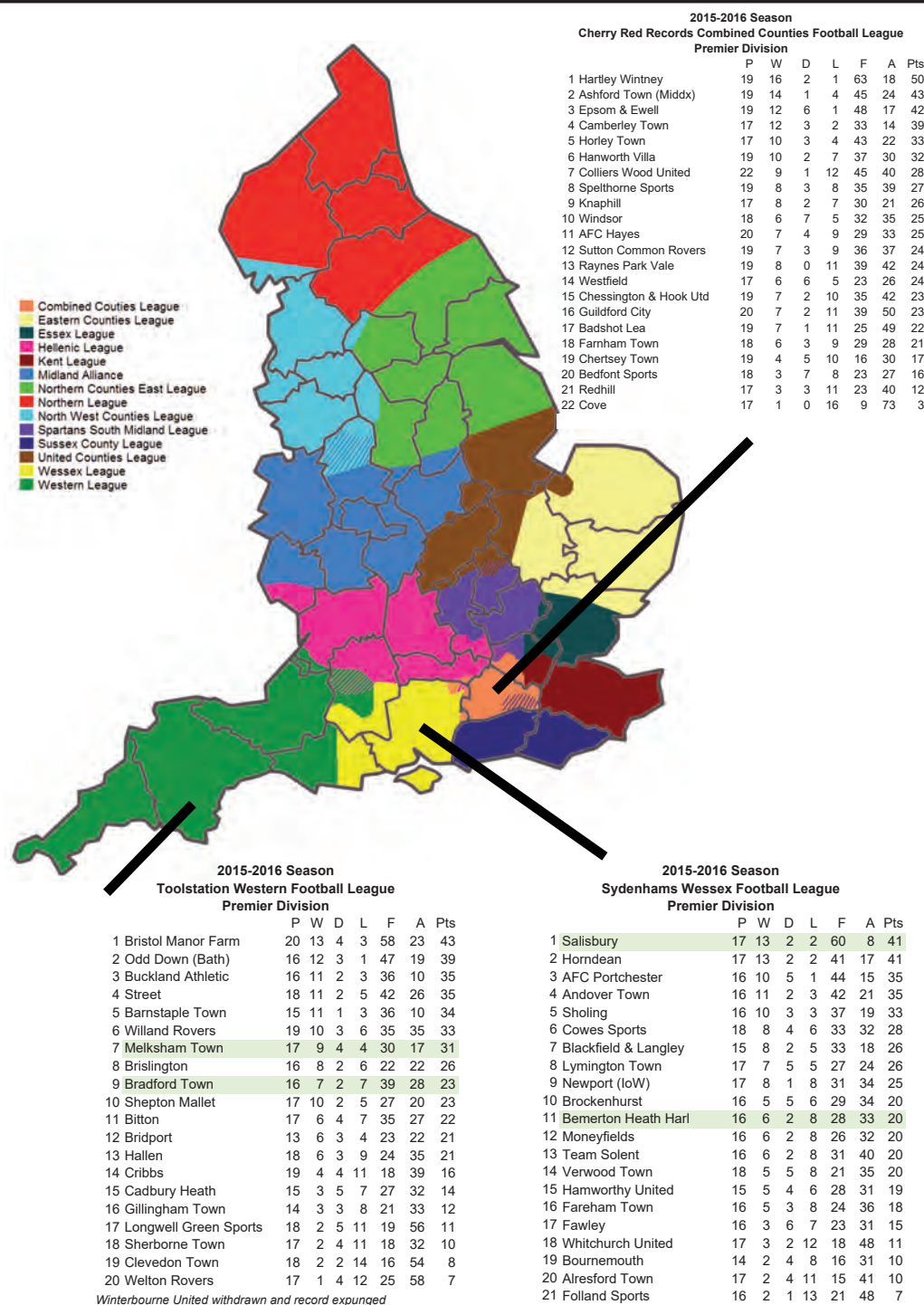
