Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Ascot United

This afternoon our visitors are Ascot United for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. A warm welcome to all from Ascot who have made the journey along the M4 to Royal Wootton Bassett for this league fixture, we hope you enjoy your first visit to our new ground and we wish you a safe journey home.

Earlier in the season we put in one of our best performances of the season to defeat our high flying opponents by 4 goals to 1. Steve Robertson fired a hat-trick that afternoon and Nathan Gambling hit a fourth. Along with our win at Thatcham Town it ranks as our best result this season. These notes are being prepared ahead of Tuesday night's trip to Brimscombe & Thrupp. Hopefully by the time you read these notes our usual good fortune at Brimscombe has prevailed and we have already ended our depressing run of results. After Saturday's home defeat at the hands of a very good Binfield side we had gone 7 games without a win and on Saturday never looked like getting back into the game after we went behind.

It seems if we are to get results from games these days we have to score that first important goal to give the side the confidence to go on and get the result. Once again individual defensive errors cost us against Binfield and Paul and Chris must be tearing their hair out that we keep on pressing the self destruct button.

Having watched Binfield on Saturday if they can keep that side together they will be my tip for the title next season as I felt they had attacking options throughout the team, with lots of youth and pace. They certainly enjoyed the wide open space here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground. There is no doubt that the pitch here at our new ground is vast but by now we should be used to it and using it to our advantage. One tip I will offer Paul for next season is that in the pre-season for Season 2016-17 we work hard on upping our fitness levels to ensure that we can make best use of home advantage here at the New Gerard Buxton Ground.

Not winning can become a bit of a habit but we could really do with that little bit of luck which seems to be alluding us of late. I would settle for a scrappy 1-0 win this afternoon with the ball going off the backside of one of our players, if it means that the depressing run of results comes to an end.

Ascot United currently sit in 4th place in the table with 20 wins from their 34 league games played to date. They have won their last 3 league encounters against Abingdon United, Oxford City Nomads and Brimscombe & Thrupp and with just 4 league games to go are expected to finish in the top 4. That said we have the chance this afternoon to do the double over Ascot and it would be a great achievement to achieve such a feat over one of the top sides in the division. Joe Grant is the player to watch in the visitor's line-up with 21 goals so far this season.

League Title and Relegation Battles

The league title appears to be a two horse race now between Thatcham Town and Kidlington; this after Flackwell Heath dropped two points on Saturday when they were only able to draw 2-2 at lowly Tuffley Rovers. Kidlington were winning 3-0 away at Ardley United whilst Thatcham Town were 3-1 winners at Lydney Town. The two leading contenders met on Tuesday evening at Thatcham and it was Kidlington who came away with the points following a 2-0 win.

At the other end of the table the point earned by Tuffley in the game with Flackwell may prove important come the end of the season. Wokingham & Emmbrook are almost certain to now finish bottom of the table and return to Division One East after just one season in the top flight. Abingdon United will join them assuming that 4 teams are relegated. If the number of relegated teams is less (and there are rumours that the Premier Division will be returned to 22 teams) they will still need to win all of their last 3 games to avoid the drop. Milton United with three tough away games to end the season also look in trouble and would need to rely on a reprieve to avoid relegation. The 4th relegation place looks to be between Tuffley, an improving Bracknell Town and Brackley Town Saints.

From The Dugout

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to Ascot United to the New Gerard Buxton Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. Earlier in the season we won 4-1 at their place in one of our best performances of the season and it would be great if we could repeat that here today.

Unfortunately we are on a bad run of form of late whilst our opponents have won their last 3 league games. On Saturday against Binfield despite not winning for a while we went into the game feeling confident. We created opportunities early on and could have gone into the lead but just didn't take those chances. The best opportunity in the opening stages fell to Bailo, who was played through on goal by Sam Packer's clever through ball. However, visiting stopper Nathan Silver was equal to the shot, which Bailo sought to guide inside the near post. A lapse in concentration at the other end allowed Liam Ferdinand to get a yard on our defence and fair play to him he finished clinically to give Binfield the lead. After dealing well initially with a free kick into our box we then allowed their player too much time on the edge of the box to fire Binfield into a two goal lead. Dip got us back into the game with a well taken goal just before the break and we were back in the game.

We came out for the second half confident of getting back into it and early in the second half Bailo had the chance to equalise when one on one with the keeper but squandered what was probably the best chance of the game so far. Chances win games, Binfield had taken all those that came their way and we didn't.

They then scored a third and you could see the confidence drain from the players. We are not a confident side full of big characters that can pull the players up when we have a setback, unfortunately heads tend to drop and players feel less confident to take responsibility. The inevitable then happened when they scored a 4th. Bailo managed to get us back into the game with a goal after good work by Joey only for us to then concede a penalty and for Binfield to score a 5th. Binfield are a good side going forward but I didn't think they were that special at the back and in midfield and we shouldn't have lost by 3 goals. Disappointing all round and I would take a scappy 1-0 win from anywhere at the moment.

Due to bank holiday deadlines these notes are being written before Tuesday's fixture at Brimscombe & Thrupp and by the time you read these hopefully we have picked up something from this away game. We have generally done well at Brimscombe, winning there last season, but they are a good side and it will be tough. We also went into the game on Tuesday minus Robbo and Dan Comer due to work commitments with Dip was also missing. This gave us the chance to try a few of the Under 18's and hopefully they have given me a few tough decisions to make this afternoon with team selection. We certainly need more competition for places as we have struggled all season with strength in depth. Today's game will also be a tough encounter with Ascot currently occupying 4th place in the table, a position they are just about guaranteed to finish in. As we showed at their place and at Thatcham, on our day we can compete with anyone in this league and hopefully today will be one of those days where we put in a performance and are rewarded with some points.

Opponents - History

Ascot United • Club History

Ascot United as we know it, was founded in 1965 by a men's team who played their games at Sunninghill with "after match meetings" in The Wells in Cheapside village (now Mikado's). teams playing as long ago as 1928 under the name Ascot United but nothing to link them directly to the current club. In 1965, the club had gained permission from the Ascot Racecourse Trustees to convert the land east of coach park 10 into a football pitch. A wooden clubhouse was built and this team went on to win many prestigious trophies in the years that followed.



Various youth teams represented Ascot United over the years up to 1988, and in 1992 the East Berks 7-a-side Association was formed by our then Chairman Keith Wicks introducing small-sided junior games, and having disbanded in 1980 the men's team also reformed. The club continued to grow, entering into partnership with Charters School and being awarded FA Charter Standard status in 2004. The men's senior team enjoyed early success through the East Berks League gaining continued promotions to the Senior division and winning various Cups including the Fielden Charity Cup in 1996/7. 2001 saw the 1st team join the Reading Senior League and 5 years later in 2006 they won the Evening Post Senior Cup at the Madejski Stadium. Promotion to the Hellenic League soon followed in 2007, followed by promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division in 2009. The club today has grown to become one of the largest Community football clubs in the UK with over 1,000 registered players and over 70 teams playing every weekend embracing all ages and abilities from 5 year olds through to Vets. The new clubhouse recently opened in September 2010, together with an improved main pitch, floodlights and a stand.

The club has enjoyed much success at all levels particularly in the Ladies and Girls Section where they are regular winners of leagues and county cups. In 2015, the Under 16 Youth team finally won a boys county cup.

The past four seasons have been increasingly successful for our first team, our debut in the FA Cup in 2011 attracted 1,149 people to the Racecourse on a Friday evening where the famous trophy itself was on display and the match was streamed live on Facebook. In 2012-13 we finished 7th in the Premier Division and reached the quarter finals of the FA Vase, before Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup success followed in 2013-14 accompanied by our highest league position of 3rd. Last season, 2014-15, we reached FA Vase quarter finals again only to be defeated 3-2 by AFC St Austell in Cornwall, and we were runners-up in the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup. However, a sequence of unbeaten league matches stretching from December 2014 through to the end of the season proved the catalyst for another 3rd place league finish, rounding off our most successful season to date.

Previous Meetings

After a week to forget comes a performance to remember

Racecourse Ground, 29th August 2015

Any team who had endured as torrid a past week as Royal Wootton Bassett Town would have been satisfied to get back on track with a narrow victory or even just a scrappy draw. Paul Braithwaite's side weren't content with that however, producing a stunning team performance that resulted in a 4-1 away victory over Ascot United.

Never before had Bassett beaten the Yellamen on their own turf. But with hat-trick man Steve Robertson in rampant form and a defence - still smarting after conceding ten goals in their past two outings - that shackled the hosts' dangermen for the majority of the game, they recorded one of the club's best wins in a long while.

Only in the opening quarter of the game could it be claimed that Ascot – convincing 3-0 winners against Flackwell Heath in the week – had the upper hand. In that period they took the lead through Joe Jarra, who lashed home from twelve yards after Steve Deverall's inswinging corner fell perfectly for him, and had Jarra and Damien Markman skew a pair of threatening opportunities off target. Yet, once Bassett had found their feet they were more than a match for the home side. They signalled to Ascot that they were in for a difficult afternoon when a well-crafted move ended with Steve Yeardley seeing his glancing header deflected onto the bar on 25 minutes. After that it didn't take long for the visitors to get on level terms, and they did so in sublime fashion. Purposefully, Bassett shifted the ball around the midfield before it was turned around the corner to Yeardley, who had made a darting run into space that had opened in behind the Ascot defence. The skipper advanced down the right before clipping a perfectly weighted cross into the path of Robertson, who guided a fine header beyond the reach of Chris Grace.

Confidence grew mightily following that equaliser. A snap shot on the turn from Dan Bailey forced Grace to scurry across goal and save at his near post before Nathan Gambling fizzed a dangerous low ball across the six yard box, which needed just a touch to divert it goalwards. Robertson then seized upon an error from home centre half Alex Rodrigues, presenting Gambling with a one-on-one opportunity, which the centre forward, having the ball stick in his feet, failed to capitalise upon. However, Gambling made amends on the stroke of half time, planting a firm header into the top right corner as he connected with Harvey Scholes' brilliant right wing delivery.

Following what was an evenly contested opening period, that goal would prove vital. Ascot were forced to chase the game following the restart, coming close early on as Joe Grant shot from range and forced Luke Kuczynski to tip around the post. Bassett were able to soak up the large majority of the pressure which the hosts sought to apply though. Playing with great patience, they were then able to pick off Ascot on the break. One such counter resulted in Bailey playing a clever reverse pass for Robertson, who, goalside of Jesse Wilson, was clearly dragged back by the Ascot defender only for no penalty to be awarded. When Bassett's third goal eventually arrived, there was no need for any assistance from the officials. It followed a swift transition from defence to attack as Gambling raced onto Dale Richards' clipped pass in the left corner before cutting back for Bailey on the edge of the box. The midfielder's shot was blocked, but the ball deflected into the path of Robertson who eventually prodded in from close range. An immediate reply almost arrived via the head of Jamie West. However, his connection with David Pitt's cross flashed inches wide of the right post. That would be the last occasion on which Ascot threatened though as thereafter they were limited to a series of pot shots from distance thanks to continued resolute defending. They were then punished for trying to commit too many men forward with ten minutes to go when Robertson raced onto a Richards' clearance which had split the hosts' centre halves and coolly slotted past Grace to complete his hat-trick and nab his sixth goal in the past three games. Given that record, his week has been a personal success. Prior to the Ascot visit, it had certainly not been a seven days to look back on with pride for his teammates. This grand day at the races is certainly one that deserves to be recalled fondly though.

Man of the Match: Adam Corcoran – produced a commanding performance at centre half alongside Nathan Hawkins as the pair silenced dangerous frontmen Jamie West and Damien Markman.

RWBTFC History On One Page

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

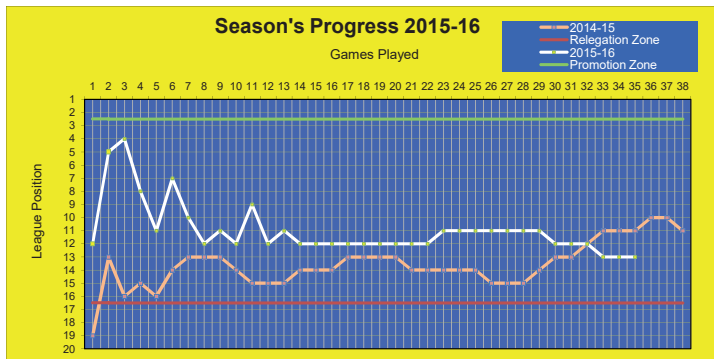
Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

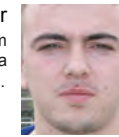

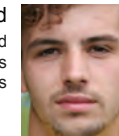

FA to improve grass pitches with £8m commitment

The FA has launched an £8 million commitment to improve football pitches across the country over the next four years. The Pitch Improvement Programme (PIP) will deliver improvements to more than 2,000 grass pitches – a central pillar of the organisation's 2015/19 Strategy for Participation and Development. PIP will provide a range of support services to grassroots clubs, club volunteers and groundsmen including on-site evaluations with practical advice and recommendations.

It will also include a range of measures to help develop the skills and knowledge of the volunteers and groundsmen including seminars and workshops. In addition to the commitment to improve grass pitches, The FA has also pledged to spend £36m on facility improvements and new developments directly through the Premier League and FA Facilities Fund managed by the Football Foundation.

Further large-scale funding has also been dedicated to building a series of football hubs across 25 key cities – a pilot scheme is currently being constructed in Sheffield ahead of the next grassroots football season – with discussions in progress with the Government and Premier League for similar contributions for the wider roll-out.

"We have committed to investing £260m to address the problem of poor quality facilities"

Kelly Simmons MBE, FA director for participation and development, said: "Last winter we asked people from across grassroots football what they felt would make playing football better.

"Nearly 30,000 people gave us their view, yet among the vast majority the answer was remarkably similar: supporting clubs to improve their pitches.

"We have committed to investing a total of £260 million in addressing the problem of poor quality facilities and improving grassroots coaching by 2019.

"In addition to the PIP, we are now a heartbeat away from the start of our groundbreaking football hubs project with the pilot initiative set to go live in Sheffield this summer."

One of the great challenges that many clubs in grassroots football face is that 83% of pitches in England are publicly owned and, as austerity measures kick in, local authority budgets are increasingly being squeezed. Funds for pitch maintenance are often at risk as councils are forced to prioritise essential services.

The official roll out of the PIP follows extensive piloting which has already seen £1 million invested and over 800 visits to grassroots football pitches by trained experts. Mark Pover, The FA's national facilities manager, said: "PIP has already proven to be a tremendous resource for many grassroots clubs.

"In addition, through the introduction of new technologies, The FA is able to develop local investment strategies and continue talking directly with clubs about the state of the facilities they use, providing dedicated programmes to help with improvements.













"The development of playing pitch strategies also gives us an early warning of pitch conditions and pitches under threat of development, strengthening our hand when it comes to challenging pitch closures and maintenance programmes."

To support the programme The FA has appointed two industry partners, Redexim Charterhouse and Rigby Taylor, who will assist in the roll out by supplying FA-affiliated grassroots clubs with discounted product and materials and also support the training workshops.

The table below shows the addresses of all the grounds we will be visiting this coming **2015-16** Season. With 5 new teams next season the league has moved West a bit during the summer and added over 100 miles to the travel that needs to be made. The table below includes the postcode to enter into your Sat Nav. A rough estimate of the distance from Wootton Bassett is also shown.



Match Reports

Five Star Binfield Inflict More Pain

New Gerard Buxton Ground, 19th March 2016

This time last season Royal Wootton Bassett Town were firing on all cylinders. Prior to a final day defeat, Paul Braithwaite's side went on a nine game unbeaten run, which lifted them to a club best eleventh place finish in the Hellenic League Premier Division and a record goals haul. Their 51 points was just one fewer than the tally recorded in Bassett's inaugural campaign in the division back in 2000/01. Fast forward twelve months, however, and there's little chance of any records falling, at least no positive ones. Sitting thirteenth, there's no danger of relegation. Yet, you get the sense that there's little positive that will ultimately be taken from the run in during this campaign. Not after another heavy defeat – this time a 5-2 home defeat against Binfield, which extended Bassett's winless run to seven games.

With four games now to go, there's the potential for that streak to extend into double figures. Especially so given the nature of opponents to come. Bracknell Town, currently sixteenth, are one of them, but they have not lost in seven and will surely go into Easter Monday's clash as favourites. There may not be any silverware to play for, but the team owe it to themselves – and to those involved behind the scenes at the club they represent – to reverse the slump they have sunk so miserably into.

Against Binfield the script was one that has become depressingly familiar. Falling into a deficit resulted in a loss of will and a surrender to a Binfield side, who, although talented, failed in two of the three previous meetings between the teams this season to emerge as winners. Neither team had really established themselves as the dominant side prior to Binfield's opener midway through the first half. Indeed, the best opportunity in the opening stages fell to Bassett's Dan Bailey, who was played through on goal by Sam Packer's clever through ball. Visiting stopper Nathan Silver was equal to the shot, which Bailey sought to guide inside the near post though.

Liam Ferdinand was to show greater composure in front of goal at the other end 22 minutes in. He outspurred Nathan Hawkins to latch onto Josh Howell's lofted pass from the right wing, took a touch to get beyond the onrushing Curtis Meare before steering into the empty net from what had become an awkward angle. Behind, Bassett soon found themselves in a deeper hole. Howell whipped in a dangerous free kick from the left wing, which was defended well initially. However, the second ball fell to Danny Horscroft on the edge of the area, and he was afforded too much space as he thumped a left footed drive that Meare could get a hand to yet not keep out. Some hope for the hosts was salvaged when Steve Yeardley controlled a Hawkins set piece delivery in the right hand side of the box and fired low inside the near post on the turn to beat Silver on the half hour mark.

Then, less than a minute after the restart, Bailey had the chance to get Bassett back on level terms when he raced onto a ball over the top but snatched at his shot when he again had just Silver to beat. It was something of a let off for Binfield. Their response to it was rapid though, and, aided by lax defending from their opponents, quickly raced into an unassailable position.

With fifty minutes on the clock, full back Jack Broome drove inside from his position on the right and rode two weak challenges before shuffling a pass to centre Jewel Johnson, who picked out the bottom left corner from eighteen yards with ease. Johnson then further extended the visitors' lead with a composed side foot finish after Ferdinand picked out his unmarked strike partner with a cross from the right. Their lead was cut to two with seven minutes remaining as substitute Joe Hiscock recycled the ball from a half cleared corner and Bailey slotted home from twelve yards. However, Bassett were instantly caught out by a quick transition, which resulted in Jamie Richards hauling down Horscroft in the box and Howell tucking away the resultant spot kick. That allowed Binfield to complete their five goal haul. And were it not for the resistance of 'keeper Meare, the Berkshire side would have had at least six.


Prior to Bailey's strike, the Bassett stopper scrambled across the full length of his goal to repel a Ferdinand effort after a corner had not been dealt with. Later, in injury time, he stood firm to deny Ferdinand a solo goal, the forward having cut in from the left and swerved by a couple of defenders with ease.

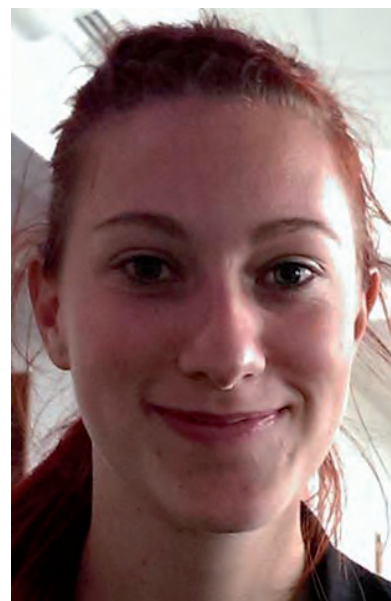

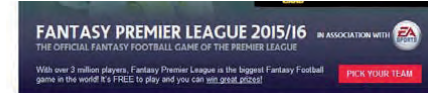

Big Day at Wembley

SO NOW we know then. Wembley will reverberate to the sound of four sets of supporters on one day – the line-up for the experiment which may shape the future of Non-League's premier cup competitions has been confirmed.

Morpeth, Hereford, Halifax and Grimsby fans will all be under one roof (well, if the weather turns!) The FA Vase kicking off at 12.15pm and the Trophy four hours later.

Non-League Finals Day on Sunday May 22, a festival of football, is a one-off but should it be successful, this first will probably not be the last.

Credit where it's due. We've banged the drum for this for some time and the Football Association have made a brave call and will try something new and untested to breathe some much needed new life into the games.

Make no mistake, it's a logistical nightmare for them. It's hard enough to police two sets of supporters, but four – all inside the stadium at one point – will be a challenge, as will the running times.

Extra time in the first game and a delayed presentation may get the Wembley suits uncomfortable in the posh seats, while a Sunday League-style tussle for the changing rooms will see the cleaner's speed to scrub be tested to its fullest should the FA Vase go the whole way.

You could of course argue the only reason the FA are giving this a whirl is because it will save a lot of money having to open Wembley's heavy doors on two separate weekends, but there's a fascination and excitement about how the whole day will unfold.

They have taken stick. Just when the governing body were getting props for their unconventional methods, they leave themselves exposed to a return to the tutting and the eye-rolling.

Non-League Finals Day isn't exclusive after all. England are playing, albeit in Manchester and yes later on, the fear is that the Three Lions' Euro warm up with Turkey will steal national focus.

It's an opportunity missed to dedicate a day to the Trophy and the Vase. There's no reason at why England couldn't play on the Saturday and leave all the attention to what's going on under the Arch.

But let's not hammer the FA at every chance possible. The point remains that they have taken a gamble, risked the wrath of the traditionalists and brought life to both competitions when it was desperately needed.

Yet the biggest thumbs up must be for the prices – rarely will you say that about Wembley.

You can watch the entire day for £25, with concessions for £10. Do you know a youngster who has yet to see their national stadium? Bring them along for £1.

In fairness, it's a fantastic bargain. Just remember to bring your own sarnies!

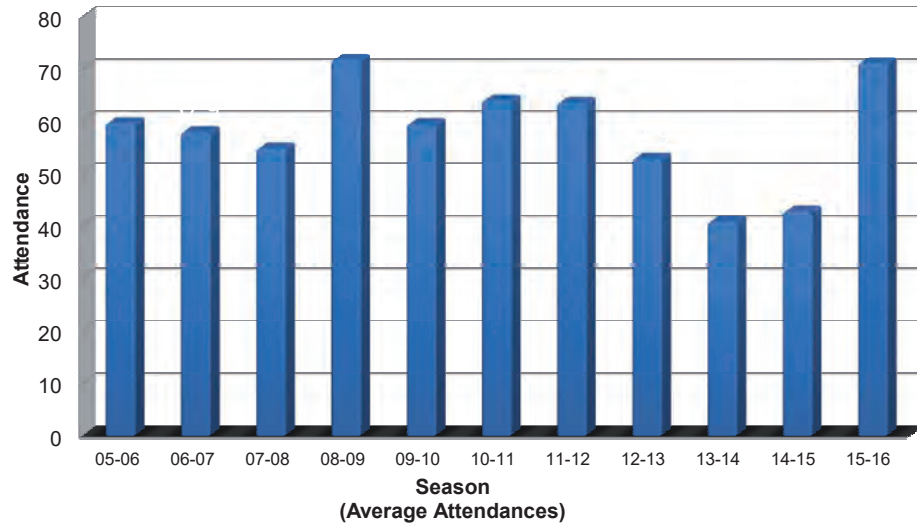

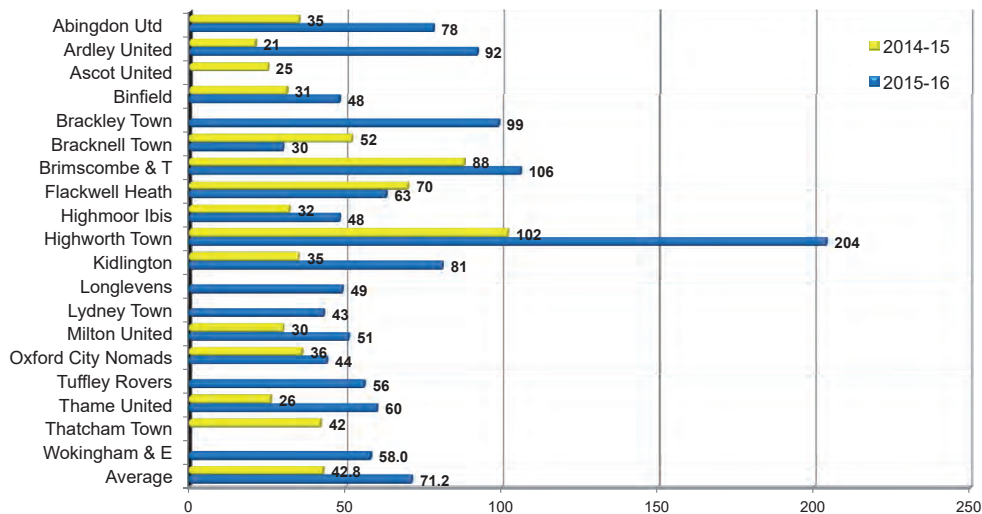
Andover New Street Swifts FC withdrawn from the league

FA Vase

Well I got that one wrong as Salisbury failed to pull back the deficit from the first leg of the FA Vase semi-final and went out to Hereford who will now play Morpeth in the Wembley final. Hereford won 2-1 on the day to make it 3-1 on aggregate. The only consolation for Salisbury was that, whilst not quite matching the crowd at Hereford, they did manage to attract 3,450 paying customers for the second leg. Manager Steve Claridge will now have to settle for the Wessex League title and the Wiltshire Senior Cup.

Teams I Follow

At the start of the season I noted the other non-league teams I follow and with the season drawing to a close it is appropriate to have a rundown of how these sides have all fared. In the National League my home town club Woking have fallen away of late and sit in 13th place with no chance of making the play-offs. They also went out of the Surrey Senior Cup last week against Ryman League side Mersham, this despite playing a near full strength side. The other Woking sides that play in the Combined Counties League are also having tough seasons. In the Premier Knaphill are faring the best, currently occupying 10th place in the table. Westfield meanwhile are currently 5th from bottom and still in a relegation battle. In Division One Sheerwater are in a similar position and lost heavily on Saturday at home to second from bottom South Park Reserves. In the Midland League, after a tough start to the season, Loughborough University have picked up in the second half of the season and have moved up into the top half of the table. The interesting thing in their division is whether big guns Hereford are going to win the league, they currently trail leaders Alvechurch by 5 points with 2 games in hand. In the Lincolnshire League the team I follow Horncastle Town are in 8th place in the table not helped by recent heavy defeats at the hands of Hykeham Town and Skegness Town.

Wiltshire Football Round-up

Chippenham Town lost further ground on the leading pack in the Southern League Premier Division when they lost 1-0 at Chesham on Saturday. This latest defeat for Mark Collier's side meant they dropped out of the play-off positions.

In the Southern League Division One South-West there were no such worries for Swindon Supermarine as goals from Ross Adams and Conor Waldon secured a 2-0 home win over Burnham. The big news in the UHlsport Hellenic League is our former manager Jeff Roberts being named as John Fisher's replacement at Highworth Town. Had to laugh at the committee comment in the Adver about him not asking about budgets, as rumour has it was the Highworth committee that asked him what budget he would be bringing to the club! John Fisher will be a tough act to follow and it will be interesting to see how Jeff does at the Elms. With Fairford also possibly coming up the competition for players in the Swindon area could be very fierce come next season.

At Step 6 Pewsey Vale won another game in the Wessex League against East Cowes Vics on Saturday and, in the process, putting 3 points between themselves and their opponents at the bottom of the table. In the Wiltshire derby between Laverstock & Ford and Amesbury it was honours even as the two sides shared 2 goals and the points. In the Western League Calne Town went down 2-1 at Ashton/Backwell, Devizes lost 5-1 at Cheddar, Chippenham Park were beaten 3-1 at home by the students of Almondsbury UWE, whilst Corsham and Warminster shared the points following a 1-1 draw. Westbury secured a useful 3-1 win in the bottom of the table clash with Wincanton. In the UHlsport Hellenic League Division One, Purton went down 2-1 at home to leaders Fairford Town whilst Shrivenham, whilst not in Wiltshire but not far outside, lost 3-0 at home to promotion chasing Cheltenham Saracens.

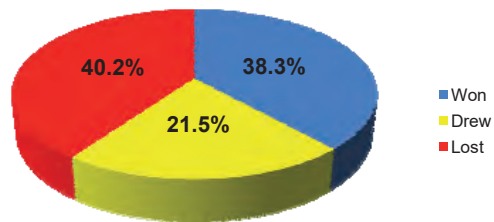
