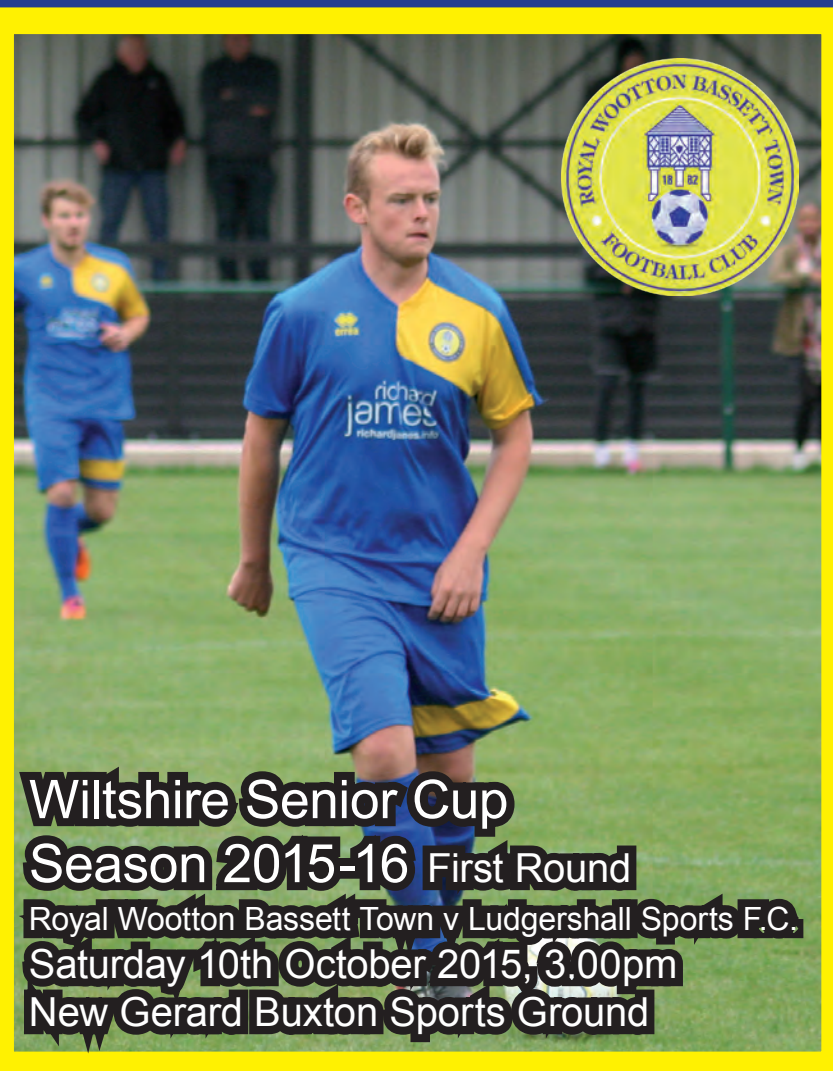

Welcome to Ludgershall Sports

A warm welcome to Ludgershall Sports who have made the journey up from South Wiltshire for this afternoon's Wiltshire Senior Cup fixture. We hope all from Ludgershall enjoy their visit to our new ground and we wish them a safe journey home.

This is our first ever First Team fixture with Ludgershall Sports although both our Development Team and Reserve sides have met Ludgershall before. The one and only game with our Reserves was on the opening day of the Wiltshire League fixtures this season on Saturday 15th August. The two sides shared four goals and the points with Carl Shepherd and Scott Large on target for Bassett Reserves. Last season Ludgershall did the double over our Development side. It was a narrow 2-1 defeat at Ballards Ash in November but at the end of the season Ludgershall ran out easy 7-0 winners in South Wiltshire. So to date an adult Wootton Bassett side has yet to beat Ludgershall. However, on a personal note I was part of the Wootton Bassett Town youth team that defeated Ludgershall 3-2 in a Mid Wilts Youth League Cup final back in 1979. A copy of the newspaper report on this game is included in today's programme.

Ludgershall currently sit in eighth place in the table with fifteen points from their opening eight games, having won four, drawn three and lost just one game. That one defeat came at the hands of Melksham Town Reserves. Full details of their record to date this season are shown elsewhere in the programme. These games against Wiltshire League sides are notoriously tough games and we will need to be at our best if we are to avoid a giant killing in the First Round. With nothing to lose I am sure Ludgershall will be coming to the Gerard Buxton Ground this afternoon with no fear and looking to cause an upset.

Having drawn a team from the County League in this competition I realise how I have started to take for granted the Pen Pics, history and squad lists that are compulsory to provide at Hellenic League level. Ludgershall kindly provided a list of players and I was able to find some history on the internet. Apologies that there are no Pen Pics for the first time in a while but I was not able to locate a Website for Ludgershall from which to prepare such information and they are not required to send these in the Wiltshire League.

Wiltshire Cup Success

Royal Wootton Bassett Town have twice won this County Senior Cup competition. The two successes, as touched on by Paul Davis in the Wokingham & Emmbrook programme, coming in Seasons 1998-99 and 2000-01. We have also finished runners-up on three occasions. As it is some fifteen years since we last played in a final of this competition it would be great if we could put that right this coming season. Always a tough one to win but I would like to think we can emulate our fellow UHlsport Hellenic League neighbours Highworth Town by lifting the cup again.

F.A. Vase Exit at Windsor

Last Saturday saw the end of our interest in the prestigious national FA competitions, going down 2-1 after extra time against Windsor. By all accounts we had the upper hand for most of the game but really missed the clinical finishing of Robbo on the day. All in all we have earned £600 of prize money from the FA competitions this season which will no doubt please the Treasurer. This cup exit leaves us to now to concentrate on Hellenic League competitions and the Wiltshire Senior Cup.

Bluefin Insurance Cup

The draw for the next round of the Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup has now been made and it sees us travelling to Bracknell Town in Round 2. Having defeated us already in the FA Cup Bracknell will be confident of progressing to the next round but I am sure Paul and the lads will be looking to put in a better performance in the return game than we did in the FA Cup tie and gain revenge for that defeat against a side who are struggling in the league and very much depend on Shane Cooper-Clarke for goals.

Last Two League Games

Our last two league games have seen us take four points in difficult circumstances. In both the games against Wokingham & Emmbrook and Tuffley Rovers we found ourselves down to ten men. In the Wokingham & Emmbrook game, having lost our keeper so early on to another controversial decision, the remaining players did an excellent job to secure the three points against the bottom of the table side. These were three very important points coming courtesy of goals from Sam Packer and Stephen Olphert. This was followed by a midweek trip to Tuffley Rovers, a side we had not played for a few seasons. From The Dugout

Good afternoon and a warm welcome to the management team and players from Ludgershall to the New Gerard Buxton Ground for this Wiltshire Senior Cup fixture. It's been a real hard but proud few weeks for myself. We have had some really bad luck and some shocking things go against us. Our last home game was against Wokingham and Emmbrook. After five minutes goalkeeper Curtis was red carded and a penalty awarded. Not only was the ball over at the Rugby Club across the road but Curtis was a yard or even two outside the box. Down to ten men again for the second game on the bounce (George Drewitt had picked up a last man red card when a Binfield player thought about stopping his run rather than maintaining it to just score in our last game) captain Yeardley put his hands up and offered to go in goal. So over 85 minutes plus with ten men and your skipper, who is far from a keeper, in goal. We had shown Binfield on the previous Monday and Saturday that playing with ten men is something we can do and are used too. So we had faith in the players to overcome this harsh gift that Wokingham had been given.

There was to be no penalty save from Dip and we were down 1-0. However, from then on confidence in the team grew and grew and chances were created. What did surprise us at half time was Wokingham's lack of desire to score a second or maybe they assumed job done. It wasn't long into the second half and we got what we deserved after great work from Harvey and Dan down the right flank which led to a great cross looking for a Bassett player to get on the end of it. The Wokingham centre half had other ideas though and placed a hand up to block the ball and gave us a penalty. From twelve yards Olphy is always one you back and again he powered his trademark pen straight down the middle. Again the Bassett ten men created many chances but it took to the 85th min to take the lead and again work from young Dan Comer led to a pinpoint pass for Packs to run onto, after beating his player he hit a well placed shot to cause great celebration.

Tuffley away and with a few stiff bodies we started the game slowly. Tuffley took the lead after an individual piece of skill. Then in the 28th minute it happens again. Curtis the goalkeeper punches a ball away only to be studded in his shoulder causing it to dislocate. A poor challenge that like so many things that have gone against us was put down to opinions and angles. Dip for the second game running stepped up to go in goal. And for the third game running we were under the cosh. But we have a team of players who work hard and want to win games. They were not going to lie down and allow Dip to come under a siege of shots. So hard work kicked in and Tuffley were limited to long range efforts off target. Again we were given a penalty after a hand ball stopped the ball going in and Olphy stepped up to smash the ball down the middle past the diving Tuffley keeper. Opportunities then came to take the lead or even more but we didn't take any. Tuffley then had one grass cutter shot that the stand in keeper Dip managed to not get down too but who can blame him. Backs to walls again as the squad worked so hard to find an equaliser and that came from a fantastic strike from Packs again. Picking the ball up in the right channel he smashed a fifteen yard shot into the food of the net. 2-2 and a well earned point.

Windsor away in the Vase. Not going to say too much about this game as it's the weirdest game I've been involved in. If anyone says we didn't deserve to win the game by three, four or even more goals, but if you don't put the ball in the net then you deserve nothing, then they are clueless. As a team it's the best we have played all season. But for one player in goal for Windsor who saved six or seven one-on-ones, tipped four around his post and three over his bar we would have won. The keeper was beaten twice but had defenders falling over on the line who still managed to keep the ball out. When the keeper and defenders were beaten we missed two efforts that were open goals. Yes you win by scoring goals but this was truly not our day and wasn't meant to be. But all credit to the players who left a Windsor defence in a mess but came up against a keeper on form. A 2-1 loss in a other day could have been a cricket score

We would like to welcome Christy Miller to the club and Joey Hiscocks returns today after his midweek transfer from Purton. Goalkeeper Chris Ashton has also signed for the club to help with goalkeeper cover. Finally congratulations to Corcs and his partner on the birth of their little boy.

Opponents - History

Ludgershall Sports - History

The exact origins of the Club are not documented but it seems that in 1918 two existing village teams merged, to form Ludgershall Sports Football Club. Its headquarters were in the back bar of the Prince of Wales Hotel and those who were too young to go in the bar waited on the pavement outside to see if they had been picked! However, this early view of the club's origin has been thrown into some doubt recently, when the Wiltshire FA contacted the club to award a plaque to mark our 100th year of football, with it transpiring that the Wilts FA's records showed that the club existed in 1900.

The first secretary of note was Fred Elliot, whose grandson, grandson-in-law, and great grandson were all to play for the club from the 60s to the present day. Like most clubs there were ups and downs; one of the high points was in the late 1920s and early 1930s when a team of all Ludgershall lads won the Morrison Cup, the Faber Cup, the Wiltshire Junior Cup and were runners up in the Salisbury League. Eric Wilson was the captain and other included Mick Perry, Jim Snell, Maurice Budd, Roy Meade, John Knight and Denis Roberts. It was shortly after this, in the mid 30s that the Club purchased the main parcel of ground on which we still play.

Another successful team came in the late 1950s and early 60s, partly following the wind up of local rivals, Kangaroo Sports. Among this team were Len Ransom, Cliff Waugh, Eddie Pearce, Dicky Toal, Bill Markwood, Micky Walsh (snr) and Andy McGlashan, who was asked to keep goal one day when Len Ransom couldn't play and proved to be such a natural keeper that he subsequently went on to play for Andover Town, and much later was manager and secretary of the football club and secretary of the parent Working Mens Club. During the 60s, there was a successful side in the Wiltshire League, managed by Alf Denton and Neil Blackmore with Brian Budd and Roy Place among others, and later in the 60s there was a successful team with Bob Bale, Trevor Keohane, John Watson, Alan Spanswick (Current President) and Larry Shirley.

There was a further expedition to the Wilts League under the managership of Chris Way and forays in the North Hants Senior League with Geoff Johnston and Mick Witt as managers. However, it was in the early 90s that the club has probably produced the most sustained period of success. Under the management of Steve Winstone the club won the Andover and District Saturday League in 91/92 and went on to win the North Hants League in the following season (92/93). This led to promotion to the Hampshire League, where the club were crowned Hants League Div 3 champions in their first season (93/94) under the leadership of Mike Walsh. With players such as forwards Ian Winstone, Chris Phillips, wingers Jeremy Hayward, Simon Stutheridge, a midfield of Mike himself and Brendan Spanswick, and a back line consisting of the likes of Adie Brice, Simon Poultney, Dave Keefe, Gary Collinson, Dave Austin.

Success has also been achieved in Sunday Football with Mike Walsh leading Ludgershall to the Andover and District Sunday League title in 90/91, Brendan Spanswick and Simon Poultney then took the club on a series of League and Cup Triumphs. In 2000/01, the club once again won the ADL and progressed to the North Hants League, where promotion once again to the Hampshire League was achieved. Then in 2003 Ludgershall Sports joined the expanded Wessex League, but withdrew at the end of the 04/05 season, due to uncertainties surrounding the required ground improvements. Ludgershall Sports then returned to the Hampshire League (2004).

In 2009 they dropped back down into the Andover and District League which they won leading to them into joining the Wiltshire League in 2010-11. A successful first season saw them finish runners-up to Sanford and promoted to the top division of the Wiltshire League and also losing cup finalists. They have remained in the top division of the Wiltshire League ever since with their best finish being 4th place in 2014-15..

Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents no longer competing, today's featured team is former Swindon side

Meadowcroft FC

Meadowcroft FC started life in the Swindon & District League and had their first success in 1974-75 when they won the George Thomas Cup. This was a competition for the bottom two divisions of the Swindon & District League. At that time the league was much more successful than its present incarnation with four divisions operating and the standard of football being much higher than it is today. They repeated this success in 1975-76 when they also lifted the Division Three title. For some reason they were promoted straight to Division One (by-passing Division Two) and in the process lost the ability to defend the George Thomas Cup.

The decision to promote them two divisions was vindicated when they stormed to the Division One championship in Season 1976-77. They were clearly a dominant force in the Swindon & District League as Punk rock rocked the British nation as they were promoted to the Premier Division of the Swindon & District League.

Season 1977-78 was to see the success continue as Meadowcroft stormed to a league and cup double, winning the Adver Cup, a competition played for by the top two divisions of the Swindon & District League. Having won everything possible in the Swindon & District League the natural progression for the Meadowcroft side was to join the Wiltshire County League. The picture below shows the double winning Meadowcroft side from Season 1977-78.

In their first season in the higher level league Meadowcroft took the Division Four title.

The following season (Season 1979-80) was the first time in five years that they did not win a league title. However, the consolation for the Meadowcroft fans was a trip to the Wiltshire Junior Cup final where they met Shrewton United. Unfortunately it was Shrewton who won the prestigious county cup competition played for by all junior clubs within Wiltshire.

With all the success on the pitch Meadowcroft, who played in Upper Stratton, were also upgrading their facilities and were to be granted Senior Status by the

Wiltshire FA allowing them to join Division Two of the Wiltshire County League. It was on their elevation to Division Two that Wootton Bassett Town First Team were to have their one and only season competing with Meadowcroft, this being Season 1981-82.

Wootton Bassett had been relegated from Division One in 1979-80 and had failed to bounce straight back when Meadowcroft joined them in Division Two. For Wootton Bassett Town it was to be another frustrating season as they finished in a mid-table 10th place. The new boys however stormed to the title losing just one game all season and pipping Bemerton to the title by four points. Along the way Meadowcroft did the double over Wootton Bassett winning 6-0 at Rylands Way and 1-0 at Meadowcroft.

The two sides were to meet just one more time, this being in the Second Round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup in Season 1983-84 when goals from Kevin Flavell and Roger Smith gave Wootton Bassett Town a 2-1 win at Meadowcroft and a passage into the next round of the competition.

By the time that Wootton Bassett Town returned to Division One of the County League Meadowcroft were no longer there and with Wootton Bassett winning promotion to the Hellenic league the two Clubs paths were never to cross again. I have not been able to research when precisely Meadowcroft folded but they were one of a number of Clubs who were amongst the top sides in Swindon in the 1970's and 1980's that no longer grace the fields of Wiltshire.

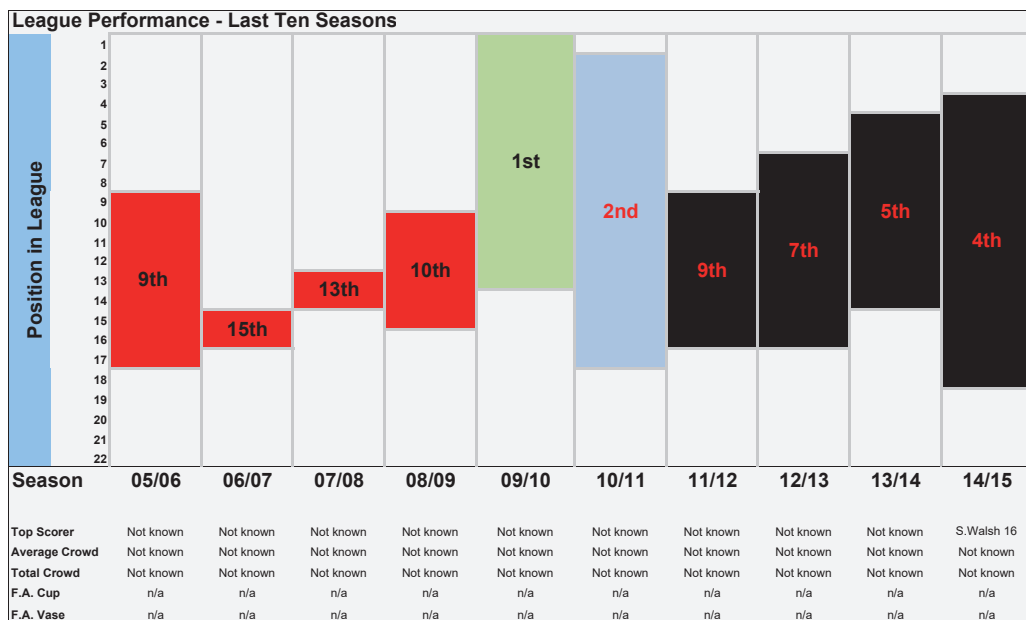

The Non-League Paper Article

Support for Referees

More often than not, an official would prefer not to get a mention in The Non-League Paper.

It's a job where it's much better to fly under the radar. But sometimes we just have to talk about them and United Counties League flagger John Clark is no exception. On Tuesday night at Desborough Town v Harborough Town the 61-year-old reached a remarkable 1,000 games. Nearly all have been as an assistant referee since he ran the line for a UCL game back in December 1974.

Clark remembers his debut fondly. The man in the middle for Stamford against Spalding that day was Brian Hill, who went onto take charge of the 1988 FA Cup final between Liverpool and Wimbledon. He also recalled an irate Stamford-supporting pensioner trying to attack the officials as they left the pitch with her umbrella! Something he assured was seen as humorous in those day.

Speaking to John it was clear how much he loves his time in the black. He says he's made many friends through the refereeing community and he plans to keep going as long as he can. When he does decide to hang up his flag, the leagues in the area will no doubt feel his retirement. Without people like John giving up their time to do something they love, football won't happen.

Officials may be maligned by some, but where would we be without them and their dedication? When starting out, it can be a lonely, dare I say, an intimidating job. At the park levels it can't be easy to turn up all by yourself and take charge of 22 players, plus substitutes, supporters and managers, all trying to put pressure on you and influence you. If they don't like your decisions then you are on your own. That's why John says it's so important for officials to help each other.

"I just really enjoy it," he told me. "But I can honestly say if all matches under the auspices of the FA were controlled by three officials then there would be more referees.

"One of the reasons why there's a fall-out of referees at grass-roots level is because they are all on their own. It's like the loneliness of the long-distance runner. When these young lads start refereeing on the local parks, it's them against the rest of the world.

"I'm a big believer that nobody helps us because they are not there to help us. So if we don't help each other in our three person team then we've got problems. We must support each other."

And we must support them.

RWBTFC History On One Page

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away.

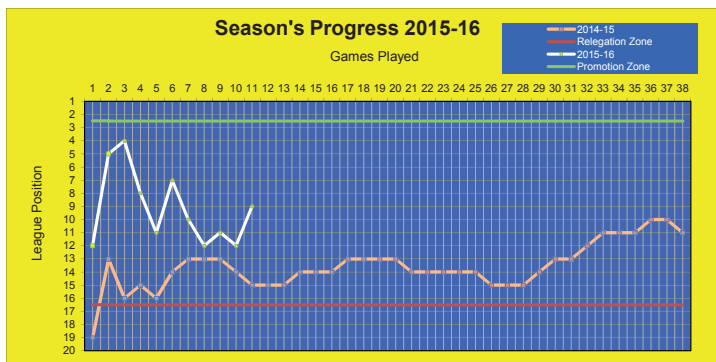
With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

Away Travel Season 2015-16

Richie Carter (midfield)



Carter is a highly dependable holding midfielder in his third spell with the club, who re-joined Bassett prior to last season from Fairford Town. While not a flashy player, he's the type of player who you can rely on to put in a performance thanks to his intelligent play, and his calm demeanour has a steadying influence on the players around him.

After initially playing with Fairford, he joined Dave Turner at Pewsey Vale in 2006/07, making 29 appearances and scoring four times. He failed to register a goal a season later, but was once again a regular at the heart of the Vale midfield before his first move to Bassett.

The brother of centre half Shaun, Carter first appeared for Bassett in 2008/09 when he followed Turner across from Pewsey. Beginning the season at full back, Carter eventually moved to his preferred spot in the centre of midfield and registered 45 appearances – only one of which came from the bench, meaning he played in more games than any other outfield player. His only goal of the campaign came in a wild 5-3 away win against Cricklade Town, but he was an integral part of the Bassett side that finished fourth, narrowly missing out on promotion. Along with his brother, he left to join Shrivenham a year later, and for a side who struggled mightily, he played 38 games, once again scoring only a single goal, that coming in a 3-1 away win for Shrivy at Ascot United in September. Carter then returned to Bassett for the 2010/11 season and finished joint second in appearances, playing 48 times in the Hellenic Premier campaign.

The effective central midfield partnership he had built with James Turner continued in 2011/12. It was an eventful season for Carter too as he achieved the remarkable feat of scoring a goal and saving a penalty in the same year. His lone stroke came in a 4-0 thumping of Headington Amateurs, while his heroics with the gloves occurred in the action-packed final fixture against Winterbourne United; in the latter he would be helpless to prevent the Bristol-based side's eventual winner that secured their promotion in a five goal thriller.

He made just two appearances for Bassett in 2012/13 before moving to Shrivenham. A short spell there was followed by a move to Fairford Town with whom he would make 11 appearances as the Reds finished fourth in Hellenic League Division One West.

Carter then spent the entire 2013/14 season with Paul Braithwaite's team and enjoyed an extremely successful campaign, playing primarily at centre half. He was an ever present in the league, playing 37 times in all competitions, and won both Players' and Manager's Player of the Year awards.

He followed Braithwaite back to Bassett ahead of last season. Although he started the year at centre half, he soon moved back into central midfield and was joint-leading appearance maker, along with Dan Bailey, playing 46 times with just one of those appearances coming as a sub. Carter also got on the scoresheet once, heading home Bassett's opener in a 2-1 away win at Shrivenham.

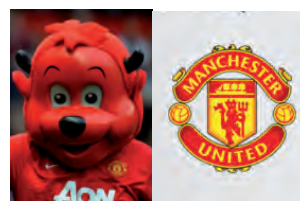

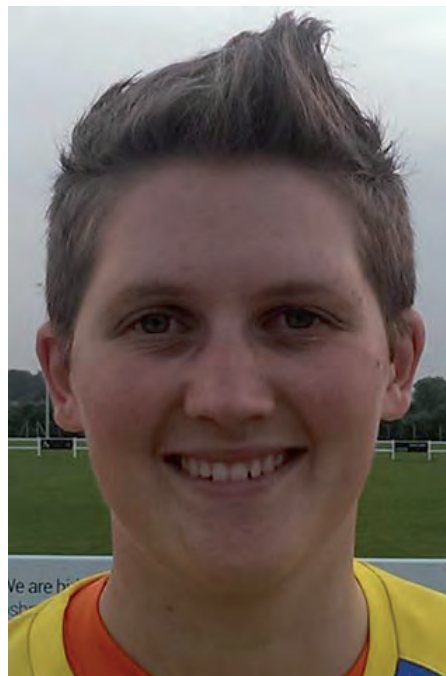

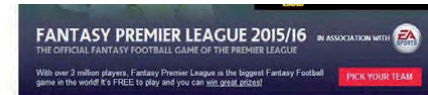

Managerial Shuffles

Whether it be Premier League, Football League or Non-League, one thing remains a constant in football news – managerial re-shuffles...and the last few weeks have been no different.

Gary Whild has left Kidderminster Harriers after five seasons at the club as assistant and manager, and Neil Aspin has moved on following a six-year stay at FC Halifax. The National League's bottom two sides made the difficult decision to pursue other options, acting on recent results and the clubs' current league positions. These prolonged stints, in themselves, are an achievement and both were full of success.

As assistant to Steve Burr, Whild led Kiddy to runners-up spot in 2012-13 and helped discover and develop big-money sales like Jamille Matt and Joe Lolley, while Aspin masterminded three promotions in his time at FC Halifax and sold on the likes of current England international Jamie Vardy, Lee Gregory and Scott Hogan for a near-£1m profit. But shorter tenures can often make the decision even tougher to make. However, in a results business something has to give.

Tim Dixon has left Hythe Town after a winless run of 10 games left them occupying a place in the Ryman Division One South relegation zone. Dixon may have spent just 16 months in the job, but waiting to ride out the storm can often be more of a risk than making a change. Many will disagree with timing, personnel and other mitigating circumstances that come with running a football club, but attempting to turn things around can be crucial.

Recently, Paul Cox said goodbye to National League side Torquay United while Evo-Stik Division One South side, Loughborough Dynamo, saw Lee Morris depart. But in these cases the reasons are different. The former Torquay boss left due to personal reasons, while Dynamo are looking for new leadership following circumstances out of their control. Morris, who was in the hot-seat alongside Jason Maguire, has recently been handed a promotion in his coaching role at Derby County's academy and splitting his time between the two was no longer feasible. Although Jason Maguire is to stay at the club for the foreseeable future, the unprecedented re-shuffle undoubtedly takes its toll. With Dynamo currently sitting precariously in 20th place in the table, a period of uncertainty was not part of the plan.

Unlike the Football League and Premier League, rumours are not always flying around about who might take the freshest job on offer. Advertising the vacancy online is a method often used to thrust unknown, but qualified, applicants in the direction of Non-League clubs and, in turn, help to secure an appointment swiftly. Doncaster Rovers, currently in League One, were heavily criticised for adopting the same approach on their own website in recent weeks.

But with Non-League unleashing a vast amount of talent, both on the pitch and in the dug-out, why shouldn't these clubs adopt a new tactic to find their perfect match and quickly? One thing is for sure: there will be plenty more movement in the dug-outs as the season progresses but the results that follow are often the most intriguing. Clubs either look to bounce back from the disappointment of the departure or push forward and change results – all with the spotlight on the new boss.

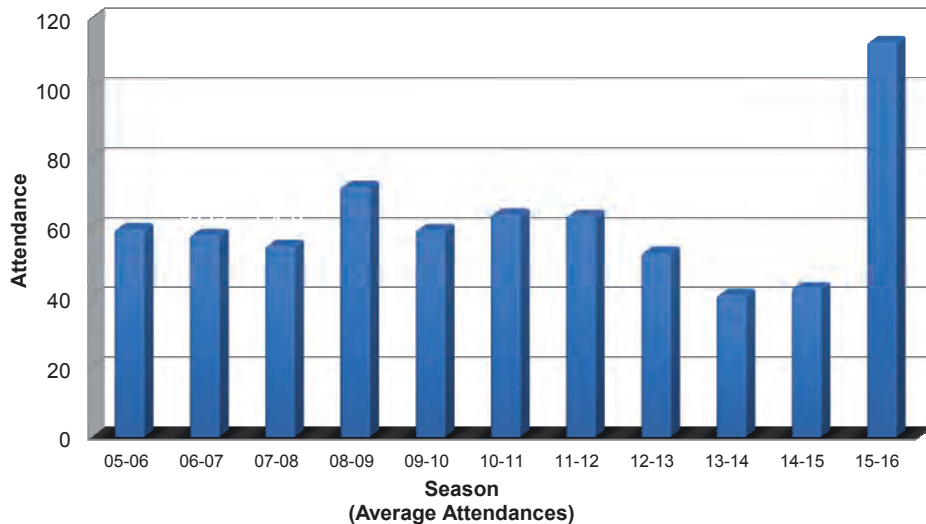

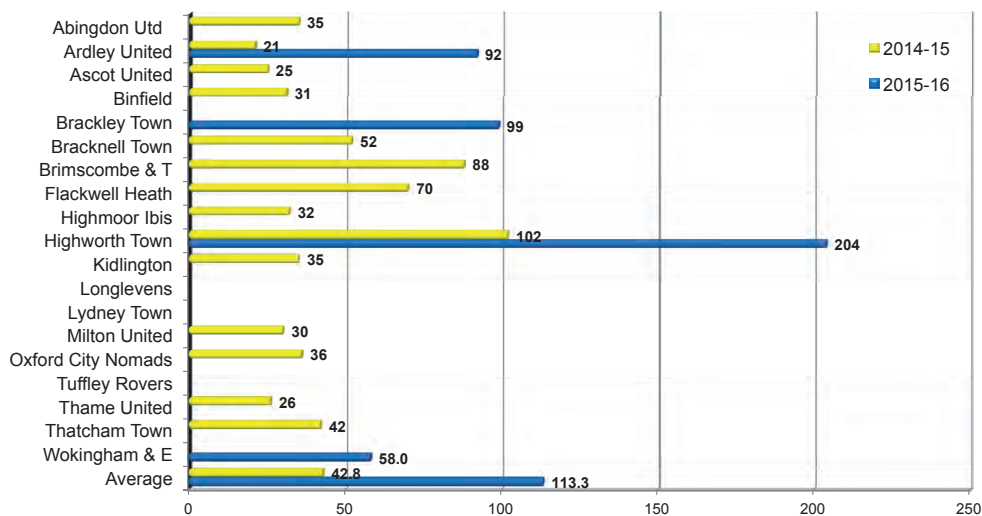

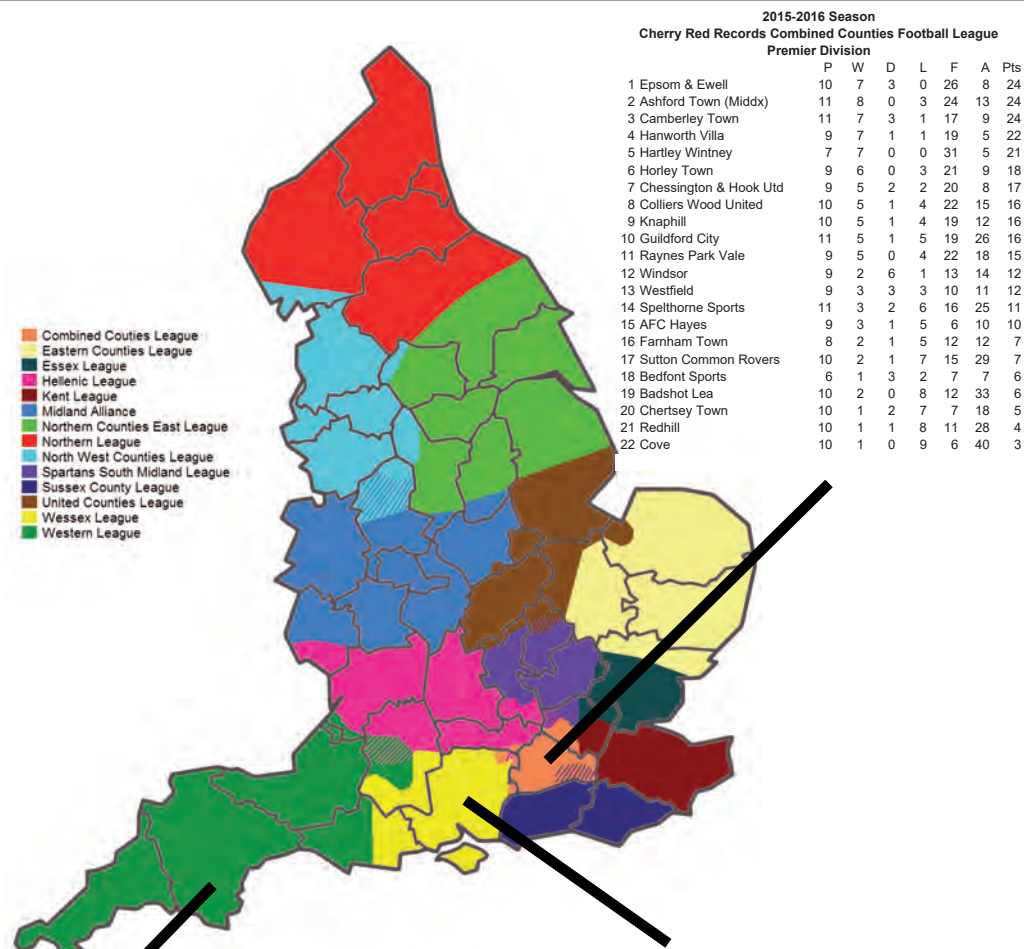
