# Editorial & RWBTFC News

## Welcome to Cirencester Town Development

Today's visitors are Division One West side Cirencester Town Development who have made the short journey that we know so well after playing at Cirencester during the two previous seasons to this one. A warm welcome to all from Cirencester who have made the short journey to Wootton Bassett for this Bluefin Insurance Challenge Cup fixture. We hope all from Cirencester enjoy their first visit to our new ground and we wish them a safe journey home.

The two sides have met on only two occasions previously and it is one win a piece. Cirencester Town Development won the first encounter between the two sides on 15<sup>th</sup> October 2011 by a solitary goal. In the return at Rylands Way goals from Matty Bown and Lee Bowen gave us all three points in a 2-0 win. There is a match report from this game in today's programme. Whilst we have only played the Development side on two occasions we have met Cirencester Town First team on six occasions, all games being between 1988-89 and 1990-91 when Cirencester Town were in the Hellenic League. It is another symmetrical record with two wins, two draws and two defeats in those six games. Both defeats were 1-0 and came in Season 1990-91. The first ever encounter with Cirencester in Season 1988-89 ended in a 2-2 draw, Colin Valters getting both Bassett goals. Valters was again on the score sheet in the game at Rylands Way along with Paul Harper as Bassett won 2-1. The following season both games were drawn, it was 2-2 at Rylands and 1-1 in the return at Cirencester. All three Bassett goals that season came from Damon York.

Cirencester Town Development currently sit in 10<sup>th</sup> place in the Division One West league table with three wins in their opening fourteen league fixtures. All three wins have come in games against Swindon sides New College, Shrivenham and Purton. Six games have been drawn and five games have been lost. Whilst the league wins have been somewhat infrequent what has been impressive has been some of the cup performances with wins against Fairford in the County Cup and against high flying Premier Division side Kidlington in this competition. We must certainly not underestimate Cirencester here today if we are to progress through to the last eight of this competition.

Cirencester Town Development has in their ranks a couple of players who played for our Under 18's when Danny Groom was the manager of the Floodlit side. Welcome back to Wootton Bassett for the day to these former players and hopefully they will take the chance to catch up with Danny whilst at the new Gerard Buxton ground this afternoon.

## Brimscombe & Thrupp

Well after the humiliation at Highworth how sweet was to get that victory last week. As the clock moved onto 90 minutes it looked like it was going to be a very frustrating afternoon. Despite putting the visitors under a lot of pressure in the second half it just didn't look like we would score then bang two goals in the space of a minute and three points. We had also been unlucky to go behind as their goal was well offside as the old linesman on the far side of the pitch failed to keep up with play and did not flag for what looked an obvious offside. The ref clearly had some doubt as he ran over to the linesman to consult him but in the end the goal stood and it remained that way until the injury time excitement. These were three points in my view which were richly deserved for that second half performance and for not settling for a point after equalising. You could hear from the bench that the management wanted the lads to push for a second goal and we got our just reward for that ambition. Brimscombe must have been gutted and I am not sure that the lads should have celebrated right in front of their bench but the emotion after what happened on the Monday was understandable. It was also heart warming to hear after the game that the lads had been so embarrassed by their performance at Highworth that they offered to pay the entrance fee of all those spectators who travelled to Highworth from their own pockets. ## Under 21 and Veterans Leagues

Royal Wootton Bassett Town have entered Under 21 and Veterans sides into the newly formed 'Flexi Leagues', which have been established by the Wiltshire FA. Aimed at providing competitive games for players aged between 16 and 21 and, in the case of the Veterans' League, over 35 in a flexible format, games will take place on the 3G pitch at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground on Tuesday evenings throughout the winter. The Veterans started their campaign on 3rd November, defeating KMLC 2-1 thanks to goals from Simon Jones and Rab McLeod. They then made it two wins out of two, defeating Trowbridge Tigers 1-0 in a tight encounter thanks to Steve Fisher's header midway through the second period. In their third match the Veterans found it hard going against early league leaders Swindon Centurions, who won 4-1. Next up is a clash with Hathaways on 26th January (8.05pm kick off).

The Under 21s, under the stewardship of Paul Gerrish and Rab McLeod, began with a 2-1 triumph against Highworth Town Juniors as Jemil Ates and Dale Richards found the back of the net. In their second game against New College, an enjoyable contest finished 1-1 as Gabe Diba equalised late on for Bassett.

# Opponents - History

## Cirencester Town • Club History

Cirencester Town Football Club was formed in October 1889. The Development Team was introduced for Season 2009/10 to provide a route for talented players from the Junior Section of the Club and the Academy to make the transition to adult football and hopefully, in due course, the First Team.



The decision to create this team was taken as a result of an approach to the Chairman and First Team Manager from the management of the previous season's U16's who had to decide whether to enter a team in the Youth section of the Midland Junior Premier League (a league they had been competing in for the previous four seasons), or risk losing players they had been coaching for between 1 and 11 years to other clubs who were offering the chance to play adult football.

In addition to the development of Junior Section and Academy players it was expected that there would also be scope for First Team Squad players in need of matches to improve match sharpness or returning from injury to have a game. As the emphasis of the team is to be primarily young players who had been playing junior or youth football it was decided to call the team a 'Development Team' rather than 'Reserves'.

The Hellenic League was thought to be a suitable league for this transition and it subsequently confirmed acceptance of the team into Reserve Division 2 (West). The young team adapted well to the rigours and physicality of adult football and completed their first season as Champions of Reserve Division 2 (West).

After completing the 2010/2011 season in the Hellenic Reserve Division One in a respectable mid-table position, and having reached the final of the Reserve League Cup, a re-structure in the Hellenic League saw the team promoted to the Hellenic League Division One West.

A new management team was appointed and the youngsters adapted well in their new league and up until the Christmas break were in contention for a top end finish. With the first team taking priority and utilising more and more players, the second half of the season was a little disjointed and the team finished a respectable mid-table side.

As the players were even younger (average age 18) it was decided that this 1st division may be too strong so to avoid a season that could totally dishearten the younger players, the team was dropped to the reserve league. This proved to be unnecessary with a Reserve Team cup win and a third place in the league in their first season and a league win in their second season the team has been promoted back to Division One West for the 2014-2015 season.

The development of the young players has greatly benefitted the first team with over 20 players making appearances and 5 playing regularly.

# Defunct Opponents

A look back at former opponents who are no longer competing. Today's featured team is.....

## Gloucester United

Gloucester United joined the Hellenic League in Season 2000-1 and shared Gloucester City's Meadow Park ground. They were Division One West champions in that very first season, achieving promotion to the Premier Division.

Wootton Bassett Town were already in the Premier Division at this time and the first encounter between the two sides took place on 4<sup>th</sup> September 2001. In what was to be a good season for the Gloucester side they won by a solitary goal at Rylands Way. In the return played at the end of the season the two sides shared the points following a 1-1 draw, Kevin Theobald on target for Bassett in this one. In the end Gloucester United finished runners-up in that first season of Premier football, trailing champions North Leigh by five points. As can often happen with sides who come up from nowhere (e.g. Hardwicke etc), Gloucester United's success was not to last and they struggled the following season finishing one place below Wootton Bassett Town in 16<sup>th</sup> place in the table. Wootton Bassett Town indeed did the double over Gloucester United. Goals from Steve Woodman and Gary Ashford secured a 2-1 win at Rylands Way in August and in the return in March two goals from Ben Gascoyne and one from Ben Jarrett helped Bassett to a 3-1 win.

If Season 2002-03 had been a struggle the following season was to be even worse as Gloucester United finished bottom of the 22 team division with just 4 wins from their 42 games. One of those wins actually came at Rylands Way in a game that will be remembered for many years to come by the Rylands Way faithful for two reasons. Firstly this was the infamous game where Wiltshire FA goalkeeping coach Mick Byrne, playing in goal due to the absence of Rich Stevens, was lobbed from the half way line by Tom Radcliffe. The second reason why the game will be remembered will be because Gloucester United were that day managed by former Bristol Rovers, Coventry City, Wimbledon, WBA Cardiff City, Cheltenham Town and Wales manager Bobby Gould. It is not often that we got many football celebrities in the clubhouse at Rylands Way but this was to be one of those days. Perhaps our lads were star struck that day as the result was something of a shock at the time with Gloucester doing so badly. We were to extract our revenge at the end of the season as goals from Matty Bennett and Mark Hammond gave us a 2-1 win at Gloucester. This was an important win which meant we finished in 16<sup>th</sup> place, just one point above the relegation places.

After a season of struggle Gloucester United folded at the end of the 2003-4 Season. To be fair they saw out the season before calling it a day, when other sides might well not have done so. Despite making the Premier Division they never entered the FA Cup and lost both of their games played in the FA Vase, going down 1-0 in the Second Qualifying Round at St Blazey in 2001-02 and losing in the Second Qualifying Round again in 2002-3, this time against Falmouth Town, 2-1 the final score. So all in all we played Gloucester United on 6 occasions, winning 3 drawing 1 and losing just twice. Wonder if Bobby Gould at one of his after dinner speaking events still talks about that day one of his players scored from the half way line?

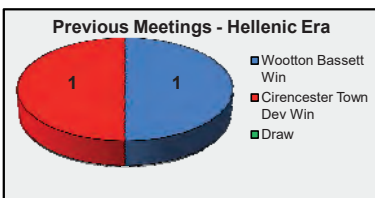
**Ground Directions:** Go along the dual carriageway, the Cirencester North-South outer bypass which links the M4 at Junction 15, Swindon, with the M5 at Junction 11a, Gloucester. That road is identified on the road signs and road maps as A419(T) from Swindon or A417(T) from the M5. It is about 20 or so minutes road time from both the M4 and the M5 junctions, traffic permitting. Come off the bypass at the Burford Road Junction (named on the road signs). There is a big services located there - fuel, food and a Travelodge. At that junction, go up the slip road to a roundabout. At the roundabout, turn away from Cirencester Town Centre. (If you are coming from the south, go over the bypass and straight over another roundabout) and up to the traffic lights. Turn right at the traffic lights and follow the road to a T-junction. Turn right, the road takes you back over the bypass, and then turn first left into Kingshill Lane. The round is half a mile on the right, past Kingshill School and the Council Playing Fields. NB: "Cirencester Town FC and Arena" is signposted from the bypass.

# Previous Meetings

## Bowen and Bown Combine as Bassett Bounce Back

Rylands Way, 7th April 2012

After Tuesday night's crushing meltdown against Lydney Town, it could have been expected for that performance's impact to linger as Wootton Bassett Town wound down their season. But a professional performance against Cirencester Town Development, capped by goals from Lee Bowen and Matt Bown, secured a 2-0 victory and preserved – for now – Bassett's hold on fourth place.

Befitting of a game between two sides looking forward more to the summer break than the encounter at hand, this contest was not much of a spectacle with chances rare and no real excitement on offer to the hardy souls making up the Rylands Way crowd. Part of the explanation for the decidedly average football on offer was the fact the hosts were once again forced into naming a much changed side. Missing were Alex Green, James Turner, Alex Harper and Kyle Pitts, while in their place came Mitch Wyatt, Liam Edmondson, Matt Buckingham, with Lee Bowen moved to centre forward from centre half. The lack of continuity unsurprisingly led to Bassett spending much of the first half chasing the ball and camped inside their own half. Fortunately the visitors were unable to translate the lion's share of possession they had into meaningful opportunities, ensuring 'keeper Pete Doolan had a decidedly quiet afternoon. Cirencester shifted the ball around with impressive confidence for a team so young. Their back four favoured a measured, patient approach, refusing all temptation to pick the easy option and thump the ball clear. Bassett, on the other hand, struggled to maintain possession early on. Often the visitors were gifted the ball back as their pressing style forced mistakes. Yet merely to possess the ball is no guarantee of success. Certainly Cirencester did threaten, but not in the necessary areas. For instance, George Williams' skill on the left wing provided Craig Bowden with a test, drawing a rash challenge in the left corner and a booking for the Bassett defender quarter of an hour in. It said something that, for all their pretty play, the only real notable chance they created came from a corner when Ollie Pitt's overhit set piece was headed wide at the far post by Nathan Hawkins, who had risen above marker Richie Carter.

At the other end Bassett eventually found their feet. And the first time the home side were able to string a decent set of passes together nearly allowed them to take the lead. Play was switched to Jack Ellis on the right, and his clever backheel created room for the overlapping Bowden. The defender then slid in Bowen, who cut the ball back across goal to Buckingham, but his powerful drive was well held on the dive by Charles Steward. Bassett were then quick to find their feet after the restart, netting twice before the hour mark to assume control of the match. In the 51st minute, substitute Daryl Charman found himself with the ball in the left channel, and he squared to Bowen, who fashioned some space before picking out the bottom right corner from the edge of the area. Seven minutes later the lead was doubled. Matt Bown saw a corner of his only half cleared, and he quickly regained possession on the right flank. There, he flashed across a volley – seemingly intended as a cross, which flew towards goal instead and through the hands of a surprised Steward. From there on out it was relatively comfortable sailing as Bassett gained revenge for their loss earlier in the season at the Corinium Stadium. Rarely did Cirencester threaten late on. Only Danny Hale – prolific for Bassett's under 18s over the past three seasons, came close, but he dragged weak effort wide following Jack Smith's cutback.

**Scoop's Man of the Match: Jack Ellis** – the young, tricky midfielder continued to justify his elevation into the first team with another assured performance. His pace posed problems for the Cirencester full backs, while his use of the ball was typically intelligent.

**Scoop Rating: 7/10** – not a performance to rave about, but enough was done to eventually secure a relatively comfortable three points.

# RWBTFC History On One Page

## Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Wootton Bassett Town formed in 1882 and are one of the oldest Clubs in Wiltshire. Bassett's early success came in the Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, losing to Warminster 3-1 in a replay before going down 3-0 to Swindon Town the following season. Bassett folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League. After finishing runners-up in 1930-31 they went one better the following year winning the championship. A short unsuccessful spell in the Swindon & District League saw the team return to the Calne League where they were champions again in 1934-35.

Having won the Calne League for the second time Bassett moved up into Wiltshire League Division 2. Promotion was achieved in the first season and the team remained in the top division until the start of World War II. After the war Bassett recommenced in the County Senior League but struggled. In 1956-57 a reorganisation of football in Wiltshire saw the creation of a Premier Division and Bassett found themselves in the second tier. Season 1958-59 saw the first title secured when Bassett finished top of Division 1. Back in the top tier the highest place finish was 8th in Season 1967-68. Then, following another reorganisation, Bassett found themselves in the Wiltshire Combination where they were to remain until 1976-77 when the current Wiltshire County Football League was formed. The second season in the new league saw Bassett relegated but they were to bounce straight back in 1978-79 when they finished runners-up. Unfortunately momentum could not be maintained and they were immediately relegated to Division 2 where they remained for 5 seasons. A second league title was secured in 1984-85 when Bassett were promoted back to Division 1. This time the team were able to hold their own and after finishing 6th and 4th they then achieved their greatest success in 1987-88 when they won the Division 1 title, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained since.

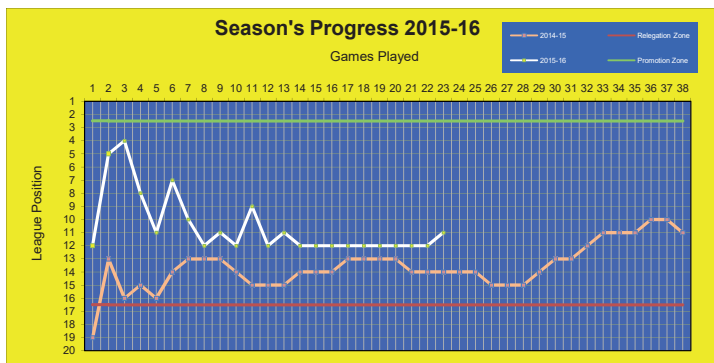
Throughout their first eleven seasons Bassett kept a steady mid table position. In 1999-2000 they finished 3rd in Division One West and gained promotion to the Hellenic top flight. First season in the Premier resulted in a respectable twelfth position and a County Cup triumph. The next season they made the first round of the FA Vase but just avoided relegation. The next two seasons saw Bassett finish mid table but the following season they were relegated, this after making their first venture into the FA Cup since 1950-51. Bassett missed immediate promotion back to the Premier by one point in 2005-06 and went close again in 2008-09, finishing fourth. Meanwhile Bassett became the first club in Wiltshire to be awarded Charter Community Club status by the FA. Promotion back to the Premier Division was secured at the end of 2009-10 as Bassett finished level on points with champions Slimbridge.

Bassett finished in a credible 15th place in their first season back in the Premier. However, they harshly found themselves demoted back to Division One on a ground grading technicality. They did well to finish in 5th place the following season after such heartbreak. In 2012-13 Bassett were never out the top 3 as they marched towards promotion, finishing 2nd. In addition they reached the FA Cup 2nd Qualifying Round for the first time. At the end of the season manager Dave Turner decided to move on after 5 years in charge. The Club were devastated when shortly after the fixture with his new club Shrivensham Dave tragically passed away.

With plans for the club's and Sports Association's new facility finally moving ahead, the first team began a two year ground share with Cirencester Town in 2013-14, a year in which Bassett finished a comfortable 14th in the Hellenic Premier Division. That performance was bettered in 2014-15 under new manager Paul Braithwaite, Bassett's final year playing its games in Cirencester, with an 11th place finish – the club's highest ever in the non-league pyramid – and record points haul in the division. This season sees the club playing at the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name.

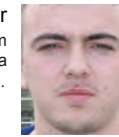

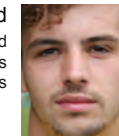

## Steve Robertson - Forward



A goal-getting forward, Robertson is a deadly finisher who has amassed significant experience in the Hellenic League Premier Division.

He joined Bassett from Shrivenham in November last season, and proved to be a key addition as his 12 goals in 16 appearances helped Paul Braithwaite's team to their highest ever finish. His first goal was a stunning left-footed strike that earned a point against high-flying Binfield. Other notable contributions from the forward included a brace in a 3-1 away victory against Brimscombe and Thrupp, a hat-trick away at Reading Town and another two-timer at home against Brimscombe.

Overall last season Robertson struck 19 times, having scored 7 seven for Shrivenham before his move.

Earlier, Robertson had a brief spell with Bassett in the 2012/13 promotion winning season. Joining towards the end of the campaign, he grabbed a goal on his debut against Hook Norton before scoring a second half hat-trick in a 3-0 victory against Malmesbury Victoria in what was the first team's final game at Rylands Way. In total he played five times, scoring four goals.

His first taste of Hellenic League football came in 2006/07 when he played four times for Highworth Town, scoring once. That season he also finished as the leading scorer for the Worthians' Reserves in their Division Two West title winning team. A season later he featured 15 times for Highworth's first team, grabbing a lone goal, while again top scoring for their Reserves.

Those goalscoring exploits earned Robertson a promotion to Highworth's first team in the 2008/09 campaign, and he showed he belonged with 13 goals in 27 appearances as his team finished sixth. He performed even better a season later, top scoring with 20 goals in 38 games. 2010/11 was a less prolific campaign as he struck six times for Highworth before moving midway through the season to Shrivenham. He re-found his scoring boots for Shrivy, notching 13 times in 21 appearances before leading them in the scoring charts with 18 goals in 2011/12. Robertson then returned to the Worthians, finding the net 5 times in 15 games before switching to Bassett briefly. He then followed Dave Turner to Shrivenham for the 2013/14 season, averaging a goal every other game with 22 goals in 44 appearances.










As well as the ability to find the back of the net, the forward brings a great knowledge of the game, and is currently manager of the successful Swindon Town Ladies team, a position he has held since the start of last season.

# Match Report

## Late show snatches victory from jaws of defeat

New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2016

With two minutes remaining of their home clash against Brimscombe and Thrupp, Royal Wootton Bassett Town appeared destined to start the New Year just as they had finished 2015: with defeat. Despite a much improved performance from that which led to such a bitter humiliation at the hands of Highworth Town, Paul Braithwaite's side had failed to unlock their Gloucestershire opponents' stubborn defence, which had successfully defended a single goal lead carved out through Ben Deakin's composed finish after just nine minutes. However, a fluke header from Joe Hiscock sparked a whirlwind 120 seconds, culminating in the quick feet of Dan Bailey earning Bassett a stunning, confidence boosting trio of points at the death. It's not the first time this season that Bassett have snatched victory courtesy of some late dramatics at their new home. In the wake of such a heavy defeat, the sense of relief and joy come the final whistle far outweighed those other last ditch triumphs against Ardley, Bracknell and Wokingham though. With the pressure starting to mount from those sides beneath them, defeat was something Bassett were simply reluctant to countenance. Equally important was keeping up with those just ahead of them: had they not managed to collapse so spectacularly, Brimscombe would have moved seven points clear of their hosts with games in hand still to spare. Yet in the opening stages, the home side seemed nervous which the fluent visitors quickly took advantage of. Curtis Meare's goal had already lived a charmed life before Deakin put Brimscombe ahead as Dave Woodfield's low cross flashed across the six-yard box untouched and the Bassett stopper could only fend off Martin McDermott's long range drive before Nathan Hawkins hacked away. There was little Meare could do about Deakin's opener as the diminutive winger coolly dispatched from Ash Caldwell's cutback after the visitors were able to spring the offside trap. A stunning save from the 'keeper then prevented Bassett from falling into an early hole similar to that in which they had slumped at The Elms. Deakin received possession in space on the left and cut inside, riding a heavy Matt Cheatham challenge before taking aim at the top right corner from 25 yards out. His shot was struck with authority but Meare, flying across goal, kept it out with a sublime fingertip save. Having thanked their last line of defence for keeping the deficit to a minimum, Bassett's outfield players finally began to settle into something resembling a rhythm. Similar to Brimscombe, they were having some joy down the wings, with Dale Richards in a particularly vibrant mood. The left wing back's knockdown from a Hawkins free kick led to Steve Robertson hooking an acrobatic overhead kick wide before his low delivery caused panic in the visitors' box. But, as the loose ball fell for Robertson, Bassett's top scorer failed to capitalise, seeing a snap shot blocked, before Dan Comer's attempt from the rebound was turned around the right post by 'keeper Steve Sparrow.

Ten minutes into the second half, another testing cross from Richards fell to Robertson who took one touch before sending a rising effort narrowly over. It was really only from wide positions that Bassett were able to threaten their visitors though. There was no lack of effort from creative central midfield pair Sam Packer and Harvey Scholes. But they were having little luck even with their team in the ascendancy as Brimscombe remained well organised. And that compact shell helped limit the opportunities the hosts were able to fashion. Thus it increasingly appeared as though the Lilywhites would hang on for victory and that Bassett would be shutout for the fourth consecutive game. That was until Packer heaved a desperation ball into the box from deep on the left. His cross was flicked on by Hawkins before being met by a defensive header, but this attempted clearance bounced off a fortuitously placed Hiscock and arced gracefully into the right corner beyond a helpless Sparrow. Then, less than two minutes later, Richards served as creator. This time his delivery came with a bit more thought. With the Brimscombe defence retreating, he whipped a pass from his position on the wing to the edge of the area where Hiscock set the ball to Bailey, who, getting his shot off before either Chris Jones or Chris Greenhough could shut him down, stabbed home with his second touch.

**Man of the Match: Dale Richards** – Bassett's main source of danger despite seeming to carry a knock, Richards was a ball of energy down the left side and thrived with the attacking responsibilities given to him. His cross for Bassett's winner was something special - perfectly played with precision and pace to allow Hiscock to tee up Bailey.

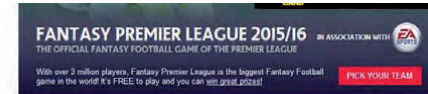

### Games and Crowds over the Festive Period

GAME ON! Those are the two words every football fan across the land is just desperate to hear during the festive season.

Stick your Merry Christmas and your Happy New Year (ok, that's three...), any excuse to get away from the leftover turkey, same old re-run movies and selection boxes is desperately welcomed.

Of course, the weather, like usual, didn't want to play ball. Storm Barney, Desmond or whatever ludicrous name the latest one is given, have wreaked havoc, especially in the north.

Clubs from Steps 1-7 who have been affected are urged to contact their local County FAs to see if they can get a cut of a £750,000 emergency fund recently set up by the FA, Football Foundation and Sport England.

Northern Alliance side Carlisle City saw their Gillford Park home submerged and long-term damage may have been done to the playing surface.

"Our pitch was flooded to a large degree although not as deep as the Carlisle United ground," said City chairman Brian Hall. "Thankfully we suffered no structural damage as far as we are aware, although we will need to check our floodlights. "The water on the pitch for so long is a concern and this is where we may need funding to assess the damage and put it right. It is evident that one part of our pitch now has a dip in it from the weight of the water. "The FA fund is obviously welcome and hopefully it will assist those in most need."

The FA gets a lot of criticism thrown their way regarding grass-roots football, most of it rightly so, but they must be congratulated on setting that up, and so quickly too. The mass of postponed games - especially in the Football League where they of course get more attention - will again bring up the question of a winter break. It's done in most countries on the continent and we're often told that the England national team constantly fail at major tournaments because they 'play too many games' and 'they don't get enough rest'. Even if that were true (rather than the real reason that the players aren't quite good enough...), the UK's fascination for festive football is there for all to see. You only have to look at some of the crowds from Boxing Day and Bank Holiday Monday for that to be abundantly clear. In what other country around the world would you get 4,381 turning up a game at level nine of the league structure? That's more than some top division clubs get across Europe. That's exactly how many supporters were at Edgar Street on Boxing Day for the Midland League Premier game between Hereford and Westfields - unsurprisingly a league record.

Around 2,000 were expected at South Shields' match against Hebburn Town at Step 6 before the weather cruelly intervened. Salisbury welcomed 1,485 to the Ray Mac for the Bank Holiday Monday fixture with Bemerton Heath Harlequins while over 1,500 watched Hythe Town overcome Folkestone Invicta in the Ryman South. Weymouth and Dorchester attracted 1,808 in the Southern Premier and a hundred less went to Dulwich Hamlet v Kingstonian in the Ryman Premier. Both Blyth v Darlington 1883 and Stourbridge v Halesowen in the Evo-Stik NPL saw over 1,800 through the gates. That's even before you look at Steps 1 and 2! The appetite is clearly there so touching such a widely loved British tradition would be sacrilege. All we need now is some help from the elements!

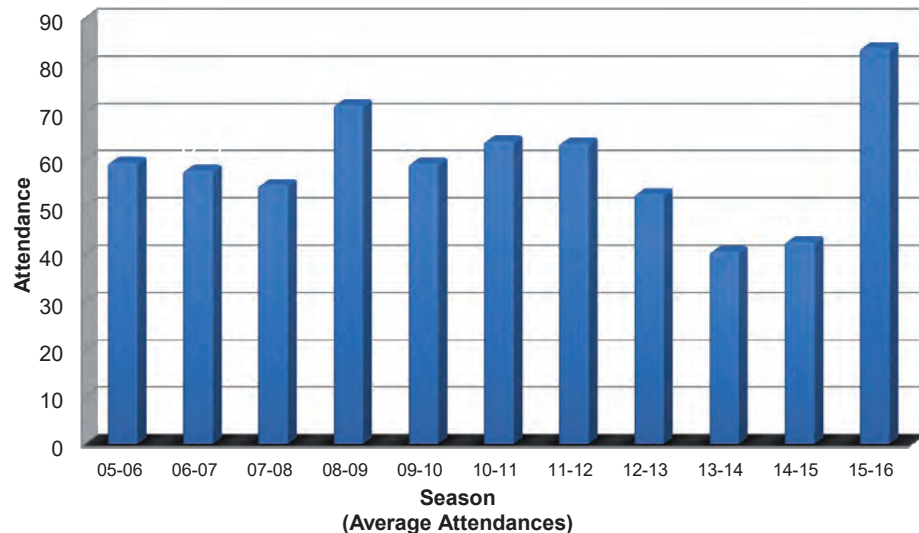

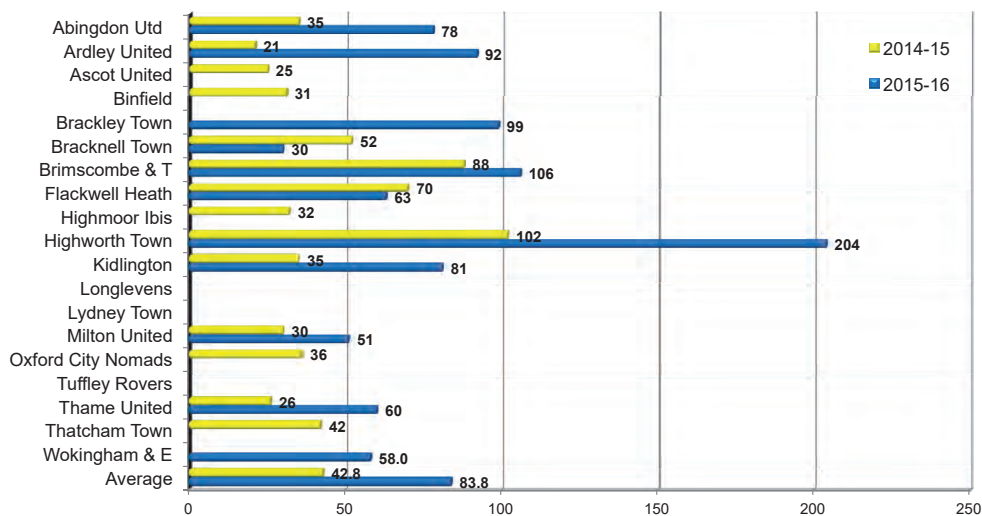

Moving into a new home can often be a stressful undertaking. Although it's certainly been a whirlwind, hectic few months since the club finally moved into the New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, for all involved with Royal Wootton Bassett Town, the chance to train and play at such an exceptional facility certainly makes all the stresses and strains worthwhile.

While there is still work to do and though some youth teams are still playing matches at Beversbrook, the facility has helped foster a greater sense of unity between all sections of the club. Evidence of this is the increased attendance at first team games, with a youth section coaches and players consistently present, the well-attended youth section photo day and the successful social evenings which have been held in the Sports Association clubhouse. On top of this, the club has been able to invigorate its Community Football offering. After a brief hiatus, the Free Saturday Skills Sessions run by Jeff Tidy, have successfully resumed; the Soccer Skills Academy, run in conjunction with Advanced Sports Coaching, has expanded; and free goalkeeper training sessions have also been introduced for club members. A huge thanks must go to all members who have supported the club in this period.

Not only has the facility received internal approval though, as visitors – be they opponents, FA and league officials or groundhoppers – have heaped praise on the grounds. In the few months since its opening, the Football Club and Sports Association have already hosted numerous events for the North Wilts League, Wiltshire FA – including their Veterans and Under 21s Flexi Leagues – as well as Swindon Town. In the case of the latter, they have held two well attended youth team fixtures on the stadium pitch, while their first team have used the 3G pitch for training in recent weeks. Fortunately, these off-field achievements have coincided with on-field success so far during this campaign. The first team go into Christmas 12th in a Hellenic League Premier Division that is stronger than it has been for a long time. Their mid-table position – earned in part through standout away victories against Ascot United and early pacesetters Thatcham United – is a relatively secure one and, although they remain alive in just the Bluefin Sports Challenge Cup, Paul Braithwaite's have enjoyed some cup success too, including a thrilling 4-3 FA Vase replay victory against Binfield.

Following a slow start – the result of not being able to name a consistent side during the early weeks of the season – the Ladies have picked up the pace in Division One of the Gloucestershire County Women's League. A five game unbeaten streak has seen them climb to fourth and they will be looking to improve that position even further when they resume in the New Year. Although the Reserves sit in the bottom half of the Wiltshire League Premier Division, they have been extremely competitive, with six of their eight losses being by just a single goal. The side managed by Dave Terry and Danny Groom have claimed a significant scalp too, defeating reigning champions Malmesbury Victoria 1-0 away from home. Of the club's 'senior' sides, the Under 18s have had the most notable achievement. Reintroduced this season, the Floodlit League squad clinched top spot in the North Division with a game to spare. With one game left to go, they have dropped just four points, winning five of their seven games.

Within the youth section, there are teams competing for honours in all six of the age groups where competitive football is played too – a fantastic achievement. The Under 12 Blue, 13 Blue, 15 Blue, 16 Blue and 18 teams have all advanced to the semi-finals of their respective North Wilts League Cup competitions. Meanwhile, the Under 13 Blues also currently boast a 100% record in Division One, while the Under 14 Blue side are one of three sides sitting on 12 points at the top of Division Two. The Under 12 Blue and 16 Blue teams are also well positioned for a tilt at a top two league finish. Development and providing opportunities for boys and girls of all ages and abilities is the primary goal of the youth section. And Bassett finally again has teams at age groups from Under 7s right through to Under 18s, with twenty in all. Next season the club will be looking to extend that number. In the meantime, here's hoping the success enjoyed so far this season continues to the campaign's conclusion.

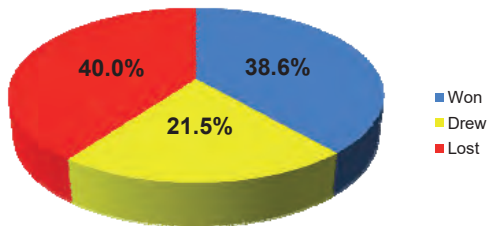

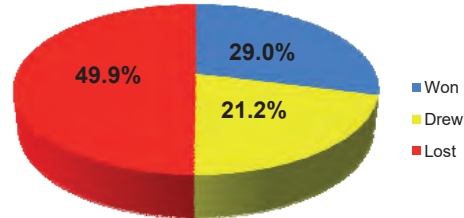

# Editor's Non-League Scene

## Teams I Follow

At the start of the season I talked about the non-league sides other than Wootton Bassett Town who I follow and with the season at the half way stage it is appropriate to have a look at how these various steams are faring.

Looking at the sides in Woking, the town's main side who play in the National League have picked up of late and are now just 3 points off the play-offs and 5 points behind 3<sup>rd</sup> placed Grimsby. It looks like the title is a two horse race between Cheltenham and Forest Green Rovers but Woking have a real chance of making the play-offs. This after manager Gary Hill putting all the players up for sale after a bad run of results, since then they haven't looked back and have climbed the table and now sit in 7<sup>th</sup> place.

As well as the National League side, there are 3 sides who play at Step 5/6 in the Combined Counties League. Of the 3 Knaphill are highest placed, currently occupying 14<sup>th</sup> place but with 3 or 4 games in hand of the teams above them in the table due to an excellent run in the FA Vase. Indeed they will be playing this afternoon in the 4<sup>th</sup> Round when they meet the one remaining UHlsport Hellenic League side Kidlington. Westfield are 2 points and 2 places below Knaphill in the league table but have played even less games than Knaphill (2 games in hand over their near neighbours). The final Combined Counties side are Sheerwater who play in Division One and are currently 4<sup>th</sup> from bottom with just 13 points from their opening 15 fixtures.

The side who I follow in the Midland League Premier Division are Loughborough University having spent my student days at this institution. After a bad start which saw them lose their first 5 league fixtures to be rock bottom of the league they have picked up of late and currently sit in 10<sup>th</sup> place in the league following a run of improved results. Clearly the intake of new students at the start of October saw the side strengthen.

In the Lincolnshire County League, Horncastle Town are having a poor season and are 3<sup>rd</sup> from bottom with just 8 points from their opening 8 league fixtures.

### Step 3 – Southern League Premier Division

Chippenham Town are on fire at the moment and goals from Andy Sandell (2), James Guthrie and Alan Griffin gave them a comfortable 4-1 away win over local rivals Cirencester Town at the Corinium Stadium last Saturday. Mark Collier's side are in 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the table, 9 points below Poole Town with both having played 27 games.

### Step 4 – Southern League South & West Division

Swindon Supermarine are another side on a good run of late. Unfortunately Saturday's fixture against Mangotsfield United fell victim to the wet weather but they currently occupy 3<sup>rd</sup> place, 4 points behind leaders Cinderford Town and level on points with 2<sup>nd</sup> placed North Leigh.

### Step 5

#### Western league

Bradford Town were the only winners in the division on Saturday as all other games, including Melksham's match were postponed. Bradford won 1-0 away at Cribbs to move up into 8<sup>th</sup> place in the table, one place and 2 points behind Melksham Town.

#### Wessex League

It remained nip and tuck at the top of the table with Salisbury and Horndean both on 44 points after 18 games and ahead of the Tuesday night midweek fixture between the two sides. Unfortunately the big match was postponed due to continued waterlogging and the two sides will now have to play each other later in the season.

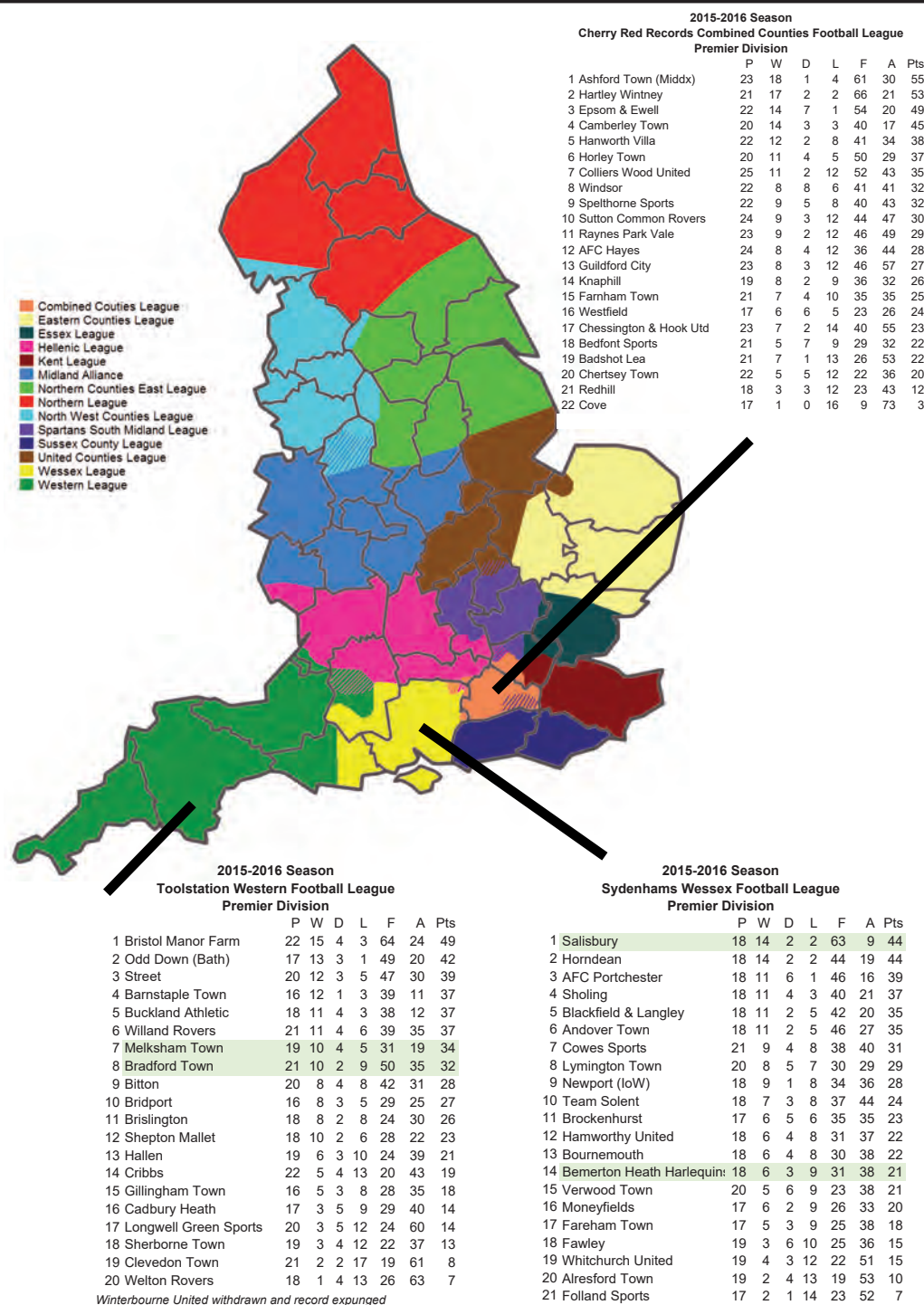
