Welcome to Windsor

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Windsor for this first UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture. This is Windsor's first ever visit to Royal Wootton Bassett and we hope all those from Windsor enjoy their short stay with us today and we wish them a safe journey home.

Whilst this is Windsor's first visit to Royal Wootton Bassett, the two sides have met once before, that meeting came in the FA Vase in Season 2015-16, a game which Windsor won 2-1 after extra time. Our only goal was scored by Steve Yeardley who is likely to be joined by about half of our team who played in that match here today. By all accounts we should have won last time we met and we will try and avenge that cup defeat here today and also register our first win of the season in the process. Windsor have played just one league game so far, losing 1-0 away at Tuffley Rovers. They also lost in the FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round, going down 4-1 at home to Wembley. They are expected to have a famous player in their ranks this afternoon in the shape of former Fulham player Barry Hayles. Whilst now in the twilight of his career, he played 175 games for Fulham scoring 44 times and was also capped 10 times by Jamaica. As noted last week our former chairman and Fulham fanatic Paul Harrison cannot be with us today because he is actually at Fulham and is disappointed that this game clashes with a commitment already made to go to Craven Cottage. He has undertaken to try and make the away game assuming Barry is playing when the clubs next meet up.

Last season Windsor were in the strong Combined Counties League and made the switch to the Hellenic in the summer giving them local derbies with the likes of Ascot, Binfield and Bracknell and short journeys into Reading to play Highmoor Ibis and Woodley United. They finished in 11th place last season, winning 17, losing the same amount of games and drawing 11 times. Their full results and the league table from last season are included elsewhere in today's programme. Windsor are renowned for their distinctive kit which will no doubt be on display here this afternoon. I quite like it but I know a few who don't so will be interested in seeing what our fans think after today's game.

Bracknell Town and Lydney

Well after last season's heavy defeats against Bracknell they certainly knew they had been in a game last Saturday. In the end they won 3-1 but that score line flattered them and we could and should have taken something out of the game. We were clearly the better side in the first half and should have been 2-0 at half time, even the Bracknell Committee members said that at half time. A good goal from Ben Lodge gave us the lead but in the end Bracknell's 100 goal strike force found their shooting boots and we were beaten. However, we should be encouraged by this performance and there were some excellent league debuts from Matt Bulman, Dave Coleman, Ben Lodge and Kai Robinson. We have certainly signed some good players in the last week (and a special welcome back to Sam Collier in his player/coaching role) and apologies for all the changes that had to be made to your programme last week but these players were all signed after the programme had gone to the printers. Saturday was followed by another impressive performance away at Lydney, never the easiest place to visit, with us securing a 1-1 draw thanks to a Nathan Gambling goal. Nathan has taken his tally for the season to three already and looks to be filling the hole left by Steve Robertson. Dave Coleman also looks to be a great signing.

Development Side

Our Development Side had a bad start to the season going down 3-0 away at Ludgershall and having a player sent off. However, the first points were secured in midweek in the "Bassett derby" against Bassett Bulldogs. A fine hat-trick from Ryan Withers plus strikes from Josh Coombe, Ryan Rawlins and a Julian Dicks style penalty from Rich Clark securing the 6-1 win. The Bulldogs put up a spirited performance but are going to take a few heavy defeats in the competitive Wiltshire Senior League this season. They have also drawn Salisbury in the Wiltshire Senior Cup and will no doubt be looking forward to their encounter with Steve Claridge's side with a little bit of trepidation but will no doubt enjoy the experience whatever the result. My first "reserve team" fixture in a while and whilst the game

attracted a large crowd disappointingly there was no first team coaching representation at the game. Now when I ran sides at Wootton Bassett Sports and Minety, if the reserves had a game when the first team did not I always found it useful to have a look at how the players were performing in the second team. Now I know we had a long trip to Lydney the night before but I was surprised to see no-one there from the First Team. For information, Ryan Withers and Ryan Rawlins both had good games for the Development side and would be the players who I would take up to the First Team should we need to cover for missing players.

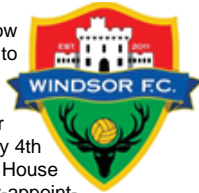

Opponents - History

Windsor FC • Club History

Summer 2011 and it's rather ironic that 100 years of senior football at Stag Meadow should be celebrated by the birth of a brand new club, Windsor FC, which came to be following the sad demise after 118 years of Windsor & Eton FC. During the final death throes of the previous club it became apparent, following several well attended supporters' meetings, that the will was there to continue to host a senior football club in Windsor for the community to embrace and, therefore, on February 4th 2011 WFC Football Community Development Ltd was registered with Companies House with the aim of achieving that objective. Founding Director Kevin Stott and a newly-appointed management committee then set about the long and sometimes arduous task of turning that dream into a reality.



Our founding season turned out to be a very exciting one, eventually finishing as runners-up to worthy Champions Guildford City in the league and we also made it to the semi-finals of the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy so it was close but no silverware to show for it, although that is not entirely true as Ryan O'Toole won the Golden Boot as top scorer in the Premier Division and Hayden Wheelers' efforts in editing our programme led to it being voted best programme in the Premier Division.

Several weeks into season 2012/2013 a major decision to operate without a budget was taken to free up funds for the regeneration plans at the ground and the management team and all but three of the playing squad left immediately. Mick Woodham was appointed as our new manager and had two days to get together a squad before our next league game. Despite some heavy defeats early in his tenure as he built a squad of local youngsters the club never lost faith and Mick eventually put together a squad that was to finish a very creditable 6th in the league as well as another appearance in the semi-finals of the county Senior Trophy competition whilst our Under 18's side made it all the way to the CCL's Grant McLellan Youth Cup Final eventually losing to a very strong Camberley Town side.

Recognition from the league away from football itself was achieved with a runners-up award for the programme in the Premier Division and FA Groundsman of the Year award for the CCL and this was added to in August 2013 when our groundsman Lewis Clements won the FA Groundsman of the Year Award for the whole of Step 5 and 6 football nationally, something both he and the club are justifiably proud of whilst also giving some extra publicity to the CCL. This building process continued for season 2013/2014 as players were added to the squad with the emphasis on young local players interspersed with some older experienced heads but whatever happened results wise we continue to enjoy visiting the many friends we made in our first two seasons in the Combined Counties League and hope they all enjoy their visits to Stag Meadow. A sixth place was recorded in the Combined Counties League, with early exits in the FA Cup and the FA Vase. The highlight of the season was a 3-0 win over Reading Town in the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy.

In 2014-2015 we again finished a creditable 5th in the Combined Counties League but again suffered early exits in both the FA Cup and FA Vase. Success did come again in the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy when we retained the title with a 3-2 extra time win over neighbours Flackwell Heath. In 2015-2016 we had a number of changes on the player front and ended up halfway in 12th place in the Combined Counties League. The FA Cup saw us go out at the first time of asking while in the FA Vase we went through 3 rounds before losing to our league champions Hartley Wintney in Round Two. Our defence of the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy ended on a very cold icy night when we lost to Newport Pagnell Town in the Quarter Final. In 2016-2017 we played in the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties League Premier Division and had two under 18 teams in the Allied Counties Youth League plus many sides competing in local youth leagues for Windsor FC Youth. A middle of the table finish was achieved with a very young side while our joint under 18s were runners up in the Grant McLellan Cup Final.

In 2017-2018 we enter a new era as the FA have decided we move us laterally into the UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division and our youth set up changes with one team playing at U18 level in the Allied Counties Youth League and one team playing at U19 level in the National League U19 Alliance.

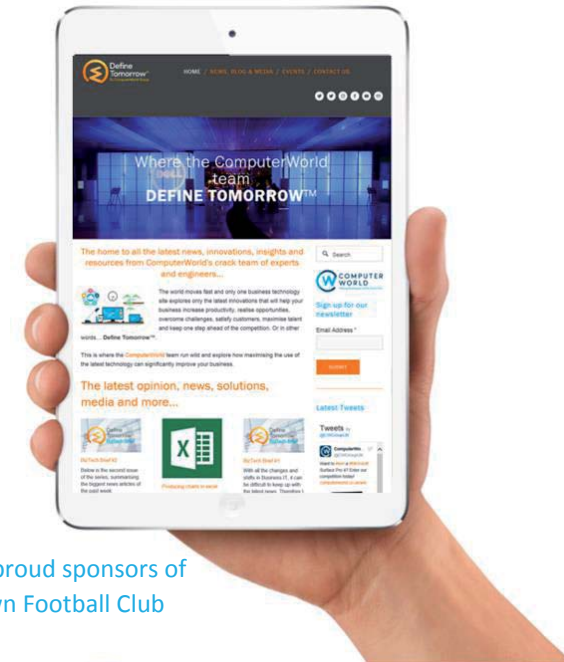

Barely a week into the new season with each cog of English football in full function and we already have plenty of clubs championing the Non-League cause.

Three cases in particular have caught my eye over recent weeks in striking up an affinity between club and community or club and fanbase.

Leyton Orient, Lewes and Lincoln United have all demonstrated the values that uphold tradition and a decency which allows their fans to think "Yes, I am very proud to support this club".

In Orient's case, it has very much been a matter of relying on past personnel to build for the future as the club transitions from an 'asset-stripping' chairman in Francesco Becchetti to the renewed hope forged by the club's Anglo-American co-owners.

Former manager Martin Ling was appointed director of football with a mere 10 players available for the first team - all under the age of 21 - while Matt Porter, the club's trusted CEO under Barry Hearn, returned to take a place on the board.

Yet where Porter was one of the first casualties under Becchetti, being asked to leave less than a month into the Italian's reign, some staff stayed and endured a torrid three years.

The new owners decided to recognise the virtues of their club staff last Saturday by having a number, which included the kitman, secretary and commercial manager, walk out onto the pitch before their match against Maidstone United to warm applause from the home faithful.

Echoing Orient's sentiments in ensuring everyone feels valued are Lincoln United who are undertaking renovation works to their Ashby Avenue home to improve the matchday experience of disabled supporters.

By no means a quick fix, the Whites plans will take a full 18 months to complete and the club's chairman hopes the initiative will kick-start a nationwide drive to address issues facing disabled supporters.

With the outdated trains in service across the country, the problems for many disabled fans can start well before they've reached any football stadium.

United's work will ensure supporters have quick and easy access to toilets and their view for the afternoon or evening, while keeping supporters a part of the atmosphere.

Bostik League South Lewes showed no split parity when announcing their newly-adopted policy of paying their men's and women's team equally back in July.

This is an instance of Non-League taking the lead when others are willing to drag their heels.

I do not class myself as a feminist, but you do not have to be to appreciate what is simple decency. Nor do I class myself as a humanitarian but I still donate money to charities and NGOs who do great work and work hard.

All in all, the matters mentioned in this column are instances of staff and supporters not being overlooked by the people who normally have the best seat in the house on a Saturday afternoon.

People in key roles within clubs who appreciate decency in football and have the humility to recognise this and act in a show of gratitude.

The fact The Non-League Football Paper has been published for well over a decade now is down to people being proud of their clubs and buying the paper because they have something to be proud about, regardless of successes or failures on the pitch.

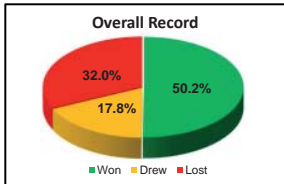

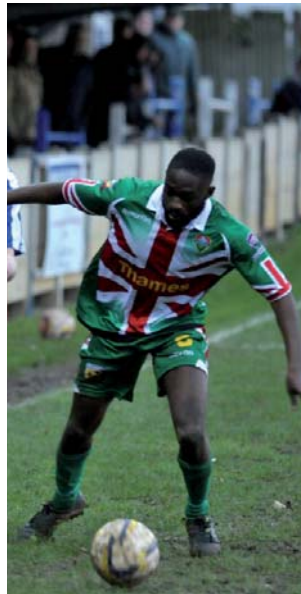

Hellenic Years - 1990-91

Elsewhere in the non-league scene the Hellenic Premier Division was won by Milton United 12 months on from having been promoted from Division One. Bicester Town were the cup winners in the Premier Division whilst Cirencester were the Division One Cup winners.

Meanwhile in the Wiltshire League, Division 1 was won by Amesbury Town who finished 4 points clear of both Shrewton United and Aldbourne Park. Division 2 champions were Wroughton with Biddestone runners-up. Sunray Badbury won Division 3, with Wootton Bassett Sports finding it tough in their first season in the division, finishing a lowly 11th. Equal top scorer for the Sports on 8 goals were Malcolm Little and Richard Casey, whilst Division 4 was won by Ramsbury who finished 4 points clear of West Swindon.

The Cup Competitions in the Wiltshire League had new sponsors and were renamed the Addkey Senior KO Cup and the Fountain Trophies Junior KO Cup. Amesbury Town won the Addkey Senior KO Cup and Sunray Badbury won the Fountain Trophies Junior KO Cup.

In the professional game the pre-season had seen West Germany crowned world champions following a 1-0 win over Argentina in the final in Rome. England had for once made a fight of it, losing on penalties in the semi-final to the eventual winners. Kenny Dalglish had walked out on champions Liverpool in February and were then pipped for the title by Arsenal who clinched their 10th league title at Highbury with a 3-1 win over Manchester United. Alan Smith led the Division 1 goals corers table with 23 goals. Oldham Athletic were champions of Division Two and the FA Cup winners were Tottenham whose win over Brian Clough's Nottingham Forest came at a price with Paul Gascoigne incurring a self-inflicted knee-eligament injury. Swindon Town struggled after the drama of the previous season finishing 4th from bottom in Division Two.

Hellenic Years - 1990-91

As this is the 30th year of our participation in the Hellenic League this year's programme will look back at each of those years to see what was going on in the local Non-League football at the time.

Today the featured season is 1990-91:

The story of Wootton Bassett Town's 1990-91 campaign was their lack of firepower in attack. Though Damon York - second top scorer in Hellenic League Division One a year prior - had begun the season with Bassett, by February the prolific forward had departed, lured away by Swindon Athletic and the attraction of Premier Division football. With his new club he would become a mainstay, helping Swindon Supermarine - as they had would come to be known following a merger - win the Hellenic title in 1997-98 with 16 goals. But for Bassett his departure created a massive void. Mick Woolford's finished in eighth, just inside the top half. But with only 32 league goals to their name - fifth least in the division - it meant that they were ultimately well adrift of seventh place Highworth, Bassett guilty of being held to too many draws.

In the Wiltshire Senior Cup Bassett were defeated in the First Round by Shrewton United, going down 4-1 at Shrewton. In the Preliminary Round Bassett had defeated Laverstock & Ford 2-0. Pewsey Vale won the Wiltshire Senior Cup defeating Swindon Athletic in the final.

One of the highlights of the season was a 3-1 First Round League Cup win over Highworth Town thanks to goals from Damon York, Jimmy Wright and Andy Small. Unfortunately, Bassett exited at the Second Round stage going down 3-1 at Wallingford Town.

Offensive barrage not enough as Vase hopes end in extra time agony

Any hopes Royal Wootton Bassett Town had of an extended run in a national competition this season were dashed as they succumbed by the odd goal in three after extra time away against Windsor. The Combined Counties League Premier Division were indebted to their 'keeper Carl Dennison, who produced an outstanding display to limit the visitors to just a Steve Yeardley goal late in normal time. The hosts took the lead midway through the opening period when Charlie Samuel headed home at the back post.

But for the remainder of the game it was Bassett, without top scorer Steve Robertson, who were the most threatening. Every time Paul Braithwaite's team attacked it seemed that they were able to get in behind the Windsor backline. Over the game's entire duration, the visitors had six one-on-one opportunities, missed two open goals and had two cleared off the line, while Dennison - Windsor's saviour - made seven great saves. It therefore wasn't until the 85th minute that they were finally able to find a way past the home stopper as captain Yeardley netted to force an additional half hour of play. The contest was then ultimately decided in the ninth minute of extra time as Omar Riaz strode forward unchallenged before beating Luke Kuczynski.

Player Profile

Matt Cheetham - Midfield or Defence



A combative central midfielder, who gives no inch, Cheetham is entering his third season with club.

Cheetham previously spent parts of five seasons with Clanfield, who he joined after playing at Cirencester Academy.

He came across to Bassett at the start of the 2015/16 season, and initially found playing time hard to come by on the fringes of Paul Braithwaite's first team squad.

However, Cheetham proved that having patience can pay off massively. He eventually got his first start in the memorable 4-3 FA Vase replay victory away against Binfield and never looked back. From that game onwards he established himself as one of the first names on the teamsheet, and his consistently high quality displays earned him the Manager's Player of the Year award.

His terrific work rate, willingness to get stuck in and intelligent play really stood as he made 41 appearances, scoring one goal. On a few occasions he was asked to fill in at centre half where he also performed strongly.

The qualities he demonstrated in his debut season were enough for him to be appointed captain ahead of the 2016/17 season. And he was again a consistent performer, featuring 42 times and scoring once in a Floodlit Cup defeat against Woodley United.

Prior to joining Bassett, he had made his debut with Clanfield during the 2010/11 season, playing 21 times and scoring once. His appearance numbers dwindled over the course of the next three seasons while he was studying at the University of Sussex. However, Cheetham reclaimed a starting role for the Robins in 2014/15, making 27 appearances in all, while scoring once.

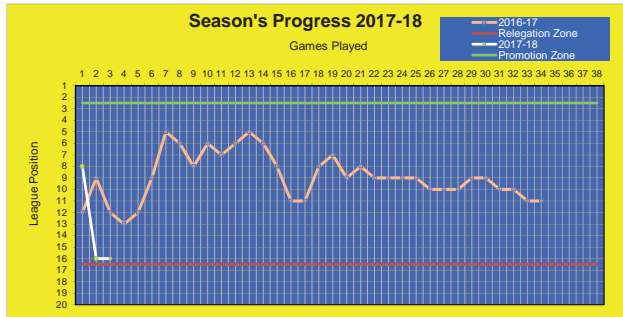

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History



Situated in the small market town six miles west of Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established within the town in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in the county of Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although both ended in defeat. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when the club began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by local dignitary Major Gerard Buxton for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.

Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County Senior League with limited success until Season 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. Season 1987-88 also saw the club again reach the final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup but that first win remained elusive. That changed in 1998-99, however, when the Club defeated Pewsey Vale 3-2 in the final at the County Ground and success was again achieved in Season 2000-01 when Shrewton were defeated 2-0 in the final. The First Team, having finished runners-up in Division One West in Season 2012-13, currently play in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, at Step 5 of the Football Pyramid.

As well as the First Team the Club has always run an adult Development/Reserve team. Since the onset of the new millennium the club has also expanded significantly, with the establishment of a large thriving Youth Section and a very successful Ladies Section. The Ladies side recently did the "double" of being cup winners and securing promotion in the same season. The latest addition to the Club has been the establishment of a Veterans team, so the club now operates 26 teams from under 7s upwards. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established, with three Youth Section teams touring Holland annually since 2001. This has led to a relationship with amateur side FC 's-Gravanzande, who are based near The Hague.

The club now play their games at the fantastic New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, the Club continues to thrive as a key part of the community of Royal Wootton Bassett. Season 2017-18 again sees Rich Hunter in charge of the First Team as the Club looks to better its highest ever position in Non-League football the 11th place finish achieved in Season 2014-15. 








At the bottom of his emails the Chairman of the Hellenic League Bob Dalling has a soundbite footer which states "Minimise travel distance, time and costs for our clubs". Based on the draft of the fixtures as at 9th August 2017 perhaps this needs to be changed to read "Minimise travel distance, time and costs for our clubs (except Royal Wootton Bassett Town and Wantage Town)". Eagle eyed readers will note that Oxford City Nomads are no longer mentioned in my suggestion. Oxford clearly said something to the league as their unfair 450 miles of midweek travel has now been reduced by 288 mainly due to the loss of midweek trips to Lydney and Bassett. Unfortunately, ourselves, Wantage and Abingdon United (typo in last programme mentioned Town) are still over the 400 mile barrier. 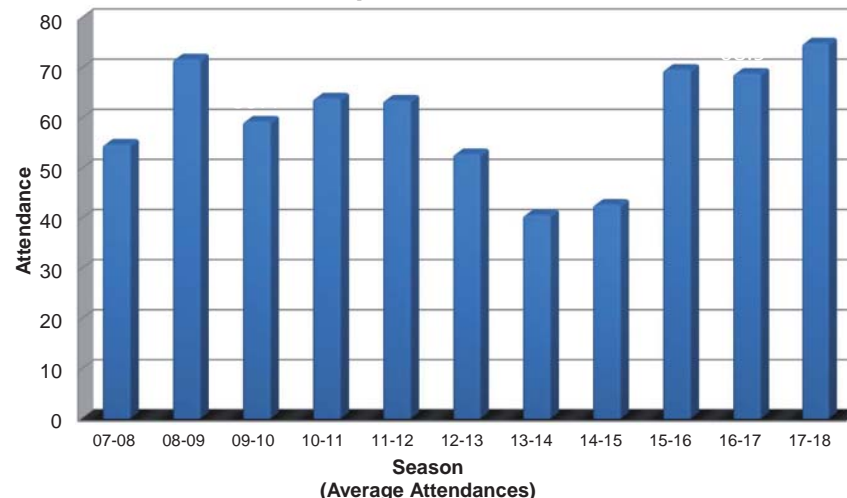

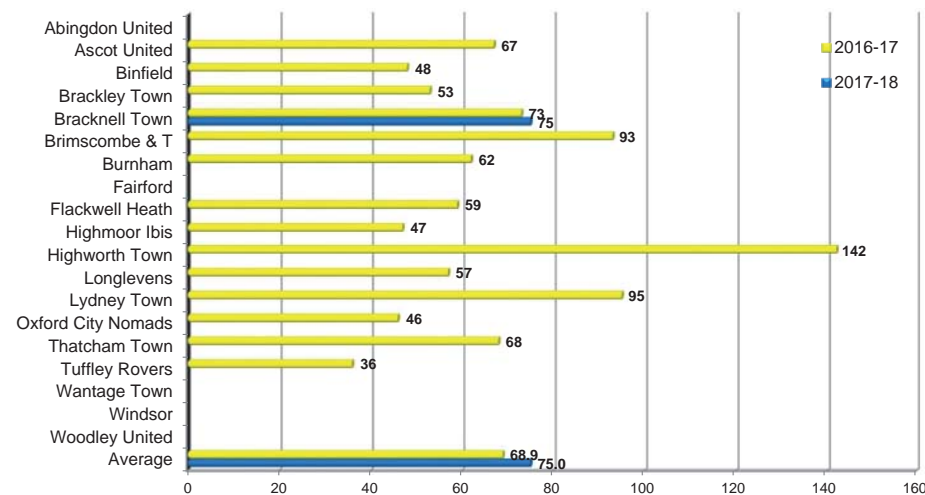

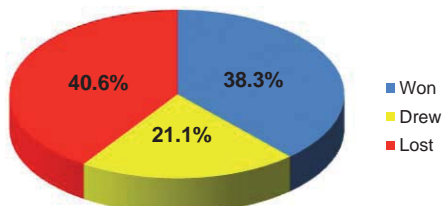

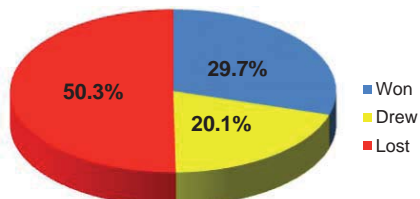

Life's A Pitch No More, Ciren by Matt Badcock (from last Sunday's paper)

Cirencester Town are making a fresh start in Step 4 this season. Boss Charlie Griffin has drawn a line under their relegation from Step 3 and is ready for his first full season as a manager in the Evo-Stik West. Things look a bit different at their Cornium Stadium too as they become the latest in an ever-growing list of Non-League football clubs to look for the benefits on laying down an artificial surface. But this is no ordinary 3G pitch. It has the latest artificial grass yarn technology and is considered to have similar characteristics to natural grass pitches.

Artificial grass manufacturers TigerTurf who also sponsor a Ciren stand, have helped the southwest club upgrade to a Premier Pro 60 pitch – the first of its kind in the UK. One of the big differences? No more black rubber crumb – this one has green!

"It's second to none, Griffin says. "It's a really good surface and it looks magnificent."

Namesake Scott Griffin had a legendary playing career at the club and is now secretary. He wishes he could get the boots back on.

"I'd have loved playing on it," he says. "I played a vets game on 3G and quite liked it but this is a totally different level. I've never seen one like it, it's pretty special. "Just watched the lads training on it for the first time on Tuesday night you could see they're taking one touch and pass, it's so sharp and quick. There will be some good football played on it, that's for sure."

That will be music to the ears of Ciren fans after a difficult season. Former Chippenham, Salisbury, Forest Green and Newport county striker Charlie Griffin, a Conference champion with Stevenage in 2010, has been doing his homework on their new surface. "I know quite a few players and I was up at a meeting at Sutton United earlier in the year," he says. "I got to have a look around and speak to people about the pitch, how they went about it, how they got used to it. "I spoke to Gavin Williams, the Merthyr manager quite a bit last season about their pitch too. So a lot has gone into it. I haven't just thought, "Oh it's ok, it's just a 3G pitch". "I've done my homework and brought in players who are going to be able to play on it and, away from home, bring experience of this level. That's vital to have".

So is local knowledge. Griffin has been putting in the hours by getting out to watch games and keep his finger on the pulse ever since he took over last September with the club already nailed on for the drop. "No matter what standard you are, you need to know what's going on," he says. If you want to be successful you have to. "As a player I always used to know what I was coming up against. I knew about the keeper, the back four, whether there would be a holding midfielder – I always looked out for the opposition's team the week before and things like that. If you're taking penalties, whether the keeper dived this way or that. "You need to do your homework whether you're a player, manager, coach or an assistant – and I've got a great management team. It's nice to know what's out there, who's playing and what formations teams have got. "Sometimes you've got to travel to watch games but that's part and parcel of Non-League football.

"The players will see that too. You have to lead by example and be the man that's out there leading your team. It's non-stop but I enjoy it. I've been in football a long time but I've just started managing. Cirencester is a great club to be at."

Griffin, 38, hopes that the community impact seen at other clubs with 3G pitches will contribute to the return of a feel good factor to a team that won this division in 2013-14.

"Last year was tough because of the losses we had," he says. "We didn't have many great victories but having the new pitch is an advantage. I've told the lads not to underestimate the teams we're going to come up against. "You've got to turn up and work hard. I emphasise that. We've got to be a team together. We've got a squad so we might go for a team when we're away that's different from at home. But we won't go into any game unprepared. We want that feel-good factor back of winning games at Cirencester. "There's great people here. We don't have a massive fan base, but when they come out they're really good. Steve Abley, who has been here 25 years – the pitch coming along now is testament to what he does. He loves football, he loves coming down and watching us on his Saturday. Hopefully we can all enjoy it this season.

Kai Robinson's attempted pass to left back Richards was seized upon by Cornell, who played a quick pass in behind the Bassett defence, which Bowerman raced onto and guided over the onrushing Bulman.

Bulman then denied Ferdinand, batting away a strike from 15 yards before Bassett saw a chance to retake the lead go begging.

Lodge brushed aside the attention of left back John Gray and cut the ball back to Packer, whose sweeping shot crashed off the right post.

Soon Bracknell punished Bassett for passing up a third gilt-edged opportunity.

With seven minutes remaining, Dan Roberts' corner picked out an unmarked Gater, and the centre half sent a controlled side-foot volley into the roof of the net.

The points were then quickly sealed when Ferdinand's clever run across the defence allowed him to latch onto Bowerman's threaded pass and slot into the bottom corner.

Football can be a cruel game at times, and, on this occasion, it was Bracknell discovering their ruthlessness late on that sealed Bassett's undeserved fate.

Robins late show sees off valiant Bassett

Despite giving their much fancied opponents a run for their money, two late goals saw Royal Wootton Bassett Town fall to a 3-1 defeat against title favourites Bracknell Town..

Having recorded two crushing 6-0 victories against Royal Wootton Bassett Town last season, Bracknell Town were perhaps shocked to be given such a test by Bassett in their opening encounter this year.

For the best part of 70 minute Rich Hunter's team were the Robins' equals, and were perhaps unfortunate not to have been in front, having had the better of the game's chances.

Yet, a late two goal salvo from Joe Gater and Liam Ferdinand ended any hopes Bassett had of claiming a second successive point to begin the season, with their goals clinching a slightly flattering 3-1 triumph for the visitors.

Prior to kick off, Bassett – whose side was much changed from last week's FA Cup loss – would have been forgiven for not expecting to take anything from the contest given Bracknell's status as one of the favourites for this year's Hellenic League Premier Division title.

But after frustrating their guests with a mature, disciplined display in the opening period, Bassett's chances of salvaging something – be it a draw, or even victory – looked rather decent. Confidence then picked up significantly after Ben Lodge headed home from Sam Packer's delightful cross midway through the second half.

Bracknell were handed an equaliser within two minutes though, punishing Bassett for being too cute when deep inside their opponents' territory, and they built on that to eventually grab the goals that took them to their win.

As with last week's defeat, there was therefore a sense of frustration in the Bassett camp come full time. However, rather than lamenting a sub-standard performance, they were left to rue coming away empty-handed after one of their better displays.

From the off, Bassett played a clever game. Understanding the offensive threat Bracknell posed, Hunter opted for a 4-5-1 formation with the powerful David Coleman the lone man up front. Allowing Bracknell to play as much as they wanted along their backline, the hosts sat deep and preserved their shape, a tactic which cut off the visitors' midfield.

That left them to play hopeful long balls forward, which found little traction against an assured Bassett backline marshalled by Matt Cheetham and Jonny Aitkenhead, who was playing through a knee injury.

Bowerman, one of the division's leading talents, did have a sight on goal early on, but he struck a curling effort straight into the hands of debutant 'keeper Matt Bulman.

The former Swindon Town and Forest Green shotstopper was rarely troubled for the rest of the period. Instead, his opposite number Chris Grace was forced to be more alert in the opening period.

Bassett should have had the lead on nine minutes when Ben Lodge's jinking run inside from the right opened up the Bracknell defence. They failed to clear their lines when Lodge's progress was halted on the edge of the box, with the ball breaking for Coleman. After holding the ball up well, he set it back to Sam Packer, who saw a powerful shot from just inside the area headed over.

On the half hour mark, Grace was forced to awkwardly tip over Coleman's rising 25-yard free kick. He was lucky to find himself in the right place at the right time minutes before the break when Gio Wrona's corner was headed back across the six-yard box by one of his own defenders. Dale Richards was in place to pounce for Bassett and, a matter of yards out, he was expecting to score, yet he could only guide his snap header into the thankful arms of the 'keeper.

Bassett's guard slipped slightly upon the resumption of play as Adam Cornell found himself free at the near post, but could only drag his shot from Carl Withers' corner wide.
