Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Woodley United

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Woodley United for this UHlsport Hellenic League fixture. We hope all those from Woodley enjoy their short stay with us this afternoon and we wish them a safe journey home.

The two sides have met just twice before, both games coming last season in the cup in the space of a fortnight at the end of January beginning of February. The first meeting was in the Supplementary Cup when two goals from Steve Robertson gave us a 2-1 win. Eleven days later we met in the controversial Floodlit Cup fixture which this time was won 2-1 by Woodley and end our interest in the cup we thought we had already made it through to the quarter-finals in. At the end of last season Woodley were promoted to the Premier Division, finishing runners-up to Penn & Tylers Green on goal difference in Division One East to set up league fixtures with Bassett this season.

Woodley currently sit in 17th place in the table with 17 points from their opening 23 fixtures. Scoring goals has been their problem this season with just 14 goals in those 23 games, by far the lowest of any team in the division. That said they must come to the Gerard Buxton hoping to remedy that record when they see we have shipped 13 goals in our last three league fixtures.

Tuffley Rovers

After a good start on Wednesday against Tuffley we managed to throw away a 2-0 lead to lose the match 3-4. As noted above we are certainly shipping goals at the moment, which is hard to understand when defensively we have been so hard to break down in the early months of the season. Hopefully we can put this right quickly. It looks to me that we are missing the defensive abilities of Kieran Diaz Benitez and Antonio Gerrish a lot more than we would have expected.

Use of Sin Bns

It's still early days in the piloting of 'Sin Bins' in adult grassroots football but the FA are claiming that early impressions have been favourable. The FA's Disciplinary Manager Mark Ives, commented:

'We're working with 32 leagues and what we've seen is a 36% reduction in dissent cautions. More importantly we've received positive feedback from referees who have dealt with the practical demands of timing the exclusion of players and have welcomed the 'Sin Bin' as an additional disciplinary tool to use. Most players and managers also believe it's having a positive effect – offending players are perceived to have disadvantaged their own teams. This could be a really effective way of getting teams to self-manage player behaviour when it comes to dissent'.

It will be interesting to see if the use of sin bins makes it into the UHlsport Hellenic League.

Midweek Action

Elsewhere in the Premier Division, Monday night saw Abingdon united secure another good win when they travelled to Highmoor Ibis and came away with all three points following a 3-0 win. Three games took place on Tuesday evening and Thatcham Town and Bracknell both closed the gap to Highworth Town at the top of the table. Bracknell won 5-0 at home against Windsor in a local derby game whilst Thatcham secured an impressive 5-1 away win against Marcus Richardson's Flackwell Heath. In the othergame played Lydney Town defeated Fairford Town 2-1.

Veterans Side

The Vets fell to a 2-0 defeat against Marlborough Town in their opening Wiltshire County FA Winter Flexi League fixture on Tuesday night. Net up the opponents are Hardly Athletic in the second of five fixtures in what will be the last game until the New Year for the Vets side.

Henley Town

Sad to hear that Henley Town's near 32-year history as a Hellenic Football League Club is over after they tendered their resignation this week. A statement released to clubs by league General Manager Brian Kings states: "I have today received a telephone call from the Henley Town secretary indicating that a club committee meeting last night agreed to resign from the UHLSPORT Hellenic League with immediate effect. This has been confirmed in writing and I have responded to the club accordingly. As Henley Town have only completed 50% of their scheduled fixtures there will be a need to expunge their playing record for the 2017-2018 season. This will be undertaken by the UHL Webmaster who manages this site."

Henley were relegated from the Premier at the end of last season, just a year after being promoted and winning the Reading Senior Cup. A new committee took over in the summer with ex Finchampstead boss Jon Laugharne scheduled to manage the side, taking the bulk of the successful Finchampstead team that were demoted due to ground grading the same summer with him. Laugharne attended the club's AGM but events on the night meant he had a change of mind and decided not to join the club. This season they have won just one league game back at the end of August and sat bottom of the Division with a goal difference of -54 at the time of making their resignation decision. A real shame as a great ground although not the easiest to play at when wet.

Opponents - History

Woodley United • Club History

Woodley United FC was formed in 2011 as a result of four Woodley based football clubs and Berks & Bucks FA recognising that the provision of women's and girls' football in the town would be better provided by one club dedicated to this purpose rather than the existing clubs each having one female team to satisfy FA Charter Standard needs but no player progression policy.



During its time as a female club, Woodley United FC saw success on and off the pitch. This included coaching in schools, supporting the Woodley Community Carnival inter school tournaments, being presented the Wokingham Borough Sports Council annual award for Service to Sport in and the Community in 2014, winning four Berks & Bucks FA County cups and the Southern Region Women's Football League league cup.

Such were the benefits of working together that two of the town's oldest clubs, Woodley Town FC and Woodley Hammers FC in conjunction with Woodley United FC saw greater opportunities for the provision of local football if the clubs were to amalgamate. As such a "One Woodley" steering group was created in April 2014 and has overseen proceedings so that from 2015 – 16 the three clubs will be playing under the Woodley United FC name and be one of the biggest clubs in the county with approximately forty youth and adult teams for male and female players together with a thriving mini kickers pre-school section.

The objective of the club is to "offer everyone in our community the opportunity to play, develop and grow through football, regardless of race, gender, age or ability" and in so doing provide community based football that is the envy of the footballing world." To help with this objective the club is a FA Charter Standard Community Club.

Considerable interest in the project resulted in BBC Radio 5 Live running an article on it for their Non-League Show while The FA's National Clubs' Manager Mick Backie has stated "The vision, ambition and purpose of the One Woodley project is an inspirational football model that places the players and its community at its core."

The benefits of working together are already being seen with the support the club has been able to give to Reading University with the building of their new sports pavilion in at the Bulmershe, Woodley campus, which is available for use by club players, and to Woodley Town Council in their application to the Football Foundation for a new 3G 9v9 pitch that was completed in June 2016.

Winning the Berks & Bucks FA Saturday Intermediate cup and finishing runners-up in UHlsport Hellenic Division One East last season, 2017 – 18 sees the club compete in the Premier Division for the first time.

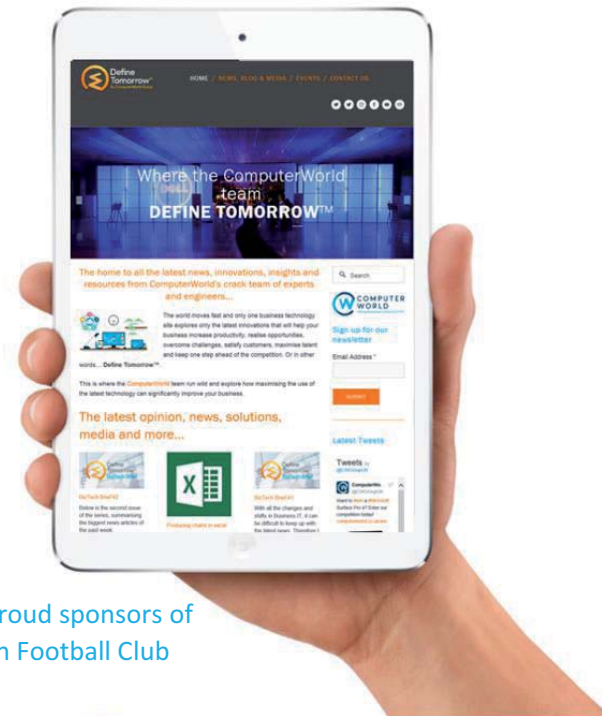

Defence

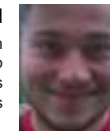
Past Player of the Season who returned to the club in the summer of 2017 after four years at Henley Town. Experienced defender comfortable at right back or centre back.

Midfield

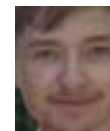

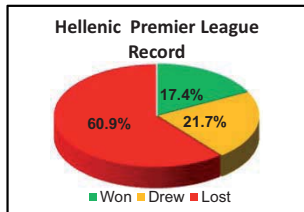
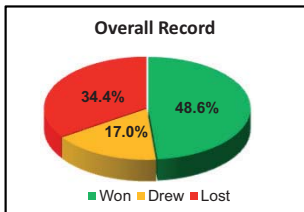

Junior Division 2 was won by Sherston Town with Southbrook Reserves runners-up.

After two seasons of being losing finalists Cricklade Town finally won the Addkey Senior KO Cup defeating Raychem SSC in the final. Ashton Keynes defeated Cricklade Town Reserves in the final of the Fountain Trophies Junior Cup.

Elsewhere, in the Swindon & District League the Premier Division champions were AFC Dolphin. Division One champions were Swindon Eagles and Division Two was won by Cross Keys. Swindon Eagles Reserves lifted the Division 3 title. The Advertiser Cup was won by County Ground whilst the George Thomas Cup was won by Artois Athletic.

In the world of professional football, Manchester United stormed to the Premiership title whilst Wimbledon were relegated from the top flight. Manchester City were promoted to the Premier League whilst Swindon Town finished rock bottom of the Championship. Chelsea won the FA Cup defeating Aston Villa 1-0. The season ended with Swindon's Billie Piper at Number One for the third and last time with Day & Night. Euro 2000, co-hosted by Belgium and the Netherlands, is won by France in an extra time thriller against Italy.

Hellenic Years - 1999-2000

As this is the 30th year of our participation in the Hellenic League this year's programme will look back at each of those years to see what was going on in the local Non-League football at the time.

Today the featured season is 1999-2000:

The 1999-2000 Season kicked off with former player Barry Giles at the helm, Giles having taken over from Dave Warren. The season commenced with a home fixture against Easington Sports and Bassett could not have got off to a better start with an excellent 6-1 win. However, the goals completely dried up for the next fixture, a lengthy Bank Holiday Monday trip to Ross Town, when neither side managed to find the net but a useful point nevertheless. A 4-2 win at Old Woodstock followed at the beginning of September. The unbeaten run came to an end with a surprise 2-1 loss at home to Cheltenham Saracens and September was to end in major disappointment as Bassett returned from Letcombe, never an easy place to visit, having taken a 6-1 hammering.

Manager Barry Giles must have read the riot act to his Bassett squad after this humiliating defeat and it seemed to do the trick as the team went unbeaten throughout October. The first weekend in November saw the first of the season's local derby fixtures with the old enemy Purton. As is typical in games with our near neighbours it was settled by a solitary goal in favour of the Red House side. After that the side won some and lost some but stayed in contention with the leading sides right to the end of the season.

The final league game saw Wootton Bassett secure all three points with a 3-2 win away at Cirencester United and in the process secure third place in the league. Champions were Cheltenham Saracens who were promoted but, with runners-up Ardley not having the required ground grading requirements, Wootton Bassett Town were promoted to the Hellenic Premier League for the first time in their history, this in Barry Giles first season in charge. A great achievement for the side.

Unfortunately they were not able to round the season off with a County Ground trip in the Wiltshire Senior Cup. In the semi-final against Pewsey Vale the two sides shared four goals after extra-time and the match went to penalties. Paul Davis and Lee Stoddart scored the two goals for Wootton Bassett in open play. In the penalty shootout Wootton Bassett went down 5-4 and would have to wait twelve months for that Senior Cup final appearance. Lee Stoddart finished the season with 18 goals and in second place in the top scorers chart for the division.

Elsewhere in the non-league scene the Hellenic Premier Division was won by Banbury United who finished a massive thirteen points clear of runners-up Highworth Town. Swindon Supermarine won the Challenge Cup and also the Floodlit Cup. The Supplementary Cup was won by Carterton Town.

Player Profile

Rory Sproule (Forward)



Sproule is an experienced centre forward, who brings a physical presence to Bassett's front line. Outstanding in the air, possessing a great touch and adept at holding up the ball to bring others into play, he is an unselfish, hard-working player also capable of playing in defence.

He joined Bassett early into the current season, and counts Highworth Town, Shrivenham and Calne Town among his former teams.

Having impressed for Marlborough Town in the Wiltshire League, Sproule first appeared for the

Worthians in the 2006-07 season, playing and starting twenty games.

He joined Shrivenham a year later and was one of their leading appearance makers. In all he featured 35 times for Pete Horwat's side, scoring once and helping them reach the last 32 of the FA Vase, where they would lose away at Northern League outfit Dunston Federation.

Sproule was back at Highworth in 2008-09 before returning to Shrivenham under their new manager Mark Love. He enjoyed his first extended run playing up front in a struggling side in 2009-10, finishing as second top scorer for Shrivenham with eleven goals in 36 games. A season later he netted three times in 32 games after moving back to primarily playing in defence.

A return to The Elms followed for 2011-12. There he was part of Dave Webb's Hellenic League Challenge Cup winning side. Sproule made it into double figures for the second time in his career, notching ten goals in thirty appearances, a haul which included braces against Lambourn Sports and Witney United.

Sproule would then split the 2012-13 campaign between Calne Town and Highworth. In eighteen games for Western League Division One Calne he would score a single goal in an FA Cup tie at Rylands Way against Bassett. He then returned to Highworth in December, featuring ten times before the season's end.

While featuring briefly for Purton last season, Sproule has largely played only Sunday League football over the past couple seasons, where he has starred for the hugely successful Greyhound team.

Quarter finalists dumped out in second round New Gerard Buxton Ground, 8th February 2017

Despite reaching the quarter finals, Royal Wootton Bassett Town were dumped out of the Floodlit Cup at the second round stage following a 2-1 defeat against Woodley United.

Having originally defeated Sandhurst Town and Lydney Town in the competition's second and third rounds, Rich Hunter's side were expecting to prepare for a trip to Bicester Town in the last eight.

However, as a result of what can only be described as an administrative farce, Bassett were forced to go back two rounds and play Woodley instead. And Reading-based side would end any hopes Bassett had of fighting for silverware this year.

To compound matters, the home side were reduced to ten men early on as 'keeper Curtis Meare was sent off for denying an obvious goalscoring opportunity.

His replacement, 16-year-old Conor Chivers, acquitted himself well on his first team debut, the Wiltshire Under 18s shotstopper making one particularly fine save. However, he could do little to deny Charlie Little's 32nd minute opener and Jake Nicholls' 52nd minute free kick.

Captain Matt Cheetham did equalise for Bassett in first half stoppage time. Yet, his team failed to create much else, disadvantaged as they were by playing shorthanded for the majority of the game.

How the game got to be played in the first place was ridiculous though.

Originally Woodley had defeated Sandhurst in the opening round - a game played back in early September. They were then deemed by the Hellenic League to have fielded an ineligible player, and so Sandhurst were re-instated.

As was their right, Woodley - who Bassett narrowly defeated in the Supplementary Cup two weeks ago - appealed that decision. The wheels of FA bureaucracy obviously had not been oiled though, as it was not until January when their appeal hearing was held with Woodley winning the case.

In the intervening period no further games impacted by the appeal should have been played given that their participants were going to be affected by its outcome.

Instead, the league allowed them to go ahead, with Bassett thumping Sandhurst 5-1 and edging out Lydney 2-0 after extra time.

Into the quarter finals they marched with a great opportunity to book a place in the final four of the Floodlit competition for the first time since the 2002-03 season.

Not so fast. Woodley should be wished the best of luck for the remainder of the Floodlit Cup, as they have been wronged in this situation too. Nonetheless, it's an episode that the Bassett players and management can rightly feel aggrieved about, and one which the Hellenic League should look back on with no feelings other than that of shame.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated in the small market town six miles west of Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established within the town in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in the county of Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although both ended in defeat. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when the club began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by local dignitary Major Gerard Buxton for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County Senior League with limited success until Season 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. Season 1987-88 also saw the club again reach the final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup but that first win remained elusive. That changed in 1998-99, however, when the Club defeated Pewsey Vale 3-2 in the final at the County Ground and success was again achieved in Season 2000-01 when Shrewton were defeated 2-0 in the final. The First Team, having finished runners-up in Division One West in Season 2012-13, currently play in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, at Step 5 of the Football Pyramid.

As well as the First Team the Club has always run an adult Development/Reserve team. Since the onset of the new millennium the club has also expanded significantly, with the establishment of a large thriving Youth Section and a very successful Ladies Section. The Ladies side recently did the "double" of being cup winners and securing promotion in the same season. The latest addition to the Club has been the establishment of a Veterans team, so the club now operates 26 teams from under 7s upwards. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established, with three Youth Section teams touring Holland annually since 2001. This has led to a relationship with amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande, who are based near The Hague.

The club now play their games at the fantastic New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, the Club continues to thrive as a key part of the community of Royal Wootton Bassett. Season 2017-18 again sees Rich Hunter in charge of the First Team as the Club looks to better its highest ever position in Non-League football the 11th place finish achieved in Season 2014-15. The Club will again be entering the F.A. Cup and F.A. Vase with the Development side playing in the Wiltshire County League.

From the Archives...

Robertson rescue act sees Bassett through New Gerard Buxton Ground, 28th January 2017

Staring at a second elimination from a cup competition at the hands of a Hellenic League Division One East side square in the face, sharpshooting Steve Robertson stepped forward to rescue Royal Wootton Bassett Town and guide them to an eventual 2-1 Supplementary Cup first round victory after extra time against Woodley United.

Trailing ever since Charlie Oakley's finely taken fifth minute opener, Bassett had encountered stiff resistance from a well-organised, stingy Woodley defence, which has conceded less than a goal a game in league contests so far this season. However, with one thunderous swing of his left boot in the fourth minute of stoppage time, Robertson brought his side back level to force an extra half hour's play.

Then, in the first period of extra time, a sublime first touch with his back to goal allowed Robertson not only to bring Dan Comer's cross under control, but also forge a path in behind the visitors' back line before he calmly slotted into the corner for what proved to be the winner. Prior to that, Bassett's leading marksman had cut a frustrated figure, with his team unable to conjure up any real meaningful chance in front of a goal. But Robertson is a player who has the quality to turn a game in an instant – even on what are, by his standards, quiet days. And that is exactly what he did on this occasion, much to the delight of his boss Rich Hunter. His goals have been vital to Bassett's fortunes over the past two and a half seasons, and it is hoped his late contribution against Woodley can spark a deep run in this competition. Saying that, had it not been for the performance of 'keeper Curtis Meare throughout the ninety minutes preceding Bassett's equaliser, then they would certainly have been mulling another exit against lower level opponents. The Bassett shotstopper, who has been in excellent form throughout the campaign, had another great day between the posts, pulling off a series of important saves and brave claims to ensure that the deficit his team faced was kept to a minimum. He could well have done more to keep out Oakley's opener. But more at fault was slack marking from those in front of him, which allowed the Woodley frontman to receive a throw in on the left edge of the area without a marker in sight. Afforded way too much time, Oakley was able to arrow a fierce drive past Meare and into the bottom right corner, the ball taking an awkward bounce just in front of the 'keeper which did enough to beat him.

Along with a goalline block from Steve Yeardley, Meare was on hand to deny Woodley a second in the game's eighth minute. Danny Horscroft headed onto the bar after Bassett had failed to clear. Then, Yeardley threw himself in the way of Oakley's follow up before Meare sprung to his right to prevent the still loose ball from crossing the line. With eighteen minutes elapsed, Meare saved with his chest to keep Horscroft's powerful drive out before, on the half hour mark, he batted away Carl Prestige's low curler after the midfielder had dispossessed Liam Edmondson on the edge of the box. Bassett had been slow out of the blocks and stifled by Woodley's sharp pressing game. After the restart the hosts did come into the game more, but that did not translate into James McKimm being tested in the Woodley goal. Instead, it was his opposite number who continued to be brought into action.

Just before the hour, Greg Beckett cut in from the left before feeding pass into the feet of Horscroft, who rolled Edmondson before shooting on the turn from close range only to see Meare pull off another fine parry. The 'keeper then diverted Oakley's deft touch from Beckett's low left-wing cross around the right post. Bassett finally had an opening eleven minutes before the end when Jamie Richards attempted shot broke for Dale Richards in the area. Despite having just McKimm in front of him, he was unable to get a shot off as Idris Kamara – perhaps with the help of a nudge on the Bassett winger – recovered to make a saving tackle.

It therefore appeared that the home side's desperate search for a goal was to prove in vain. However, deep into injury time, Edmondson delivered a towering cross from the left, which Dale Richards, rising highest at the far post, redirected into the path of Robertson, who hammered home into the bottom corner with a high-quality, lethal finish.

Midway through the opening period of extra time, substitute Dave Morgan stung Meare's palms with an effort from distance. But two minutes later, the game was to be decided in some style at the other end courtesy of Robertson's magic.

Man of the Match: Curtis Meare – while he may have felt he could have done better to keep out the shot that put Woodley ahead, the Bassett 'keeper was otherwise outstanding again. He made a number of vital, high calibre saves, was assured when coming to claim the ball from multiple corners and crosses and made all the right decisions when leaving his line to help snuff out any additional danger.

They were made to pay for their wastefulness in front of goal when Ludgershall fired in an equaliser. However, they were not to be denied when Ben Jenks scored his second of the game ten minutes from time to secure all three points for the home side.

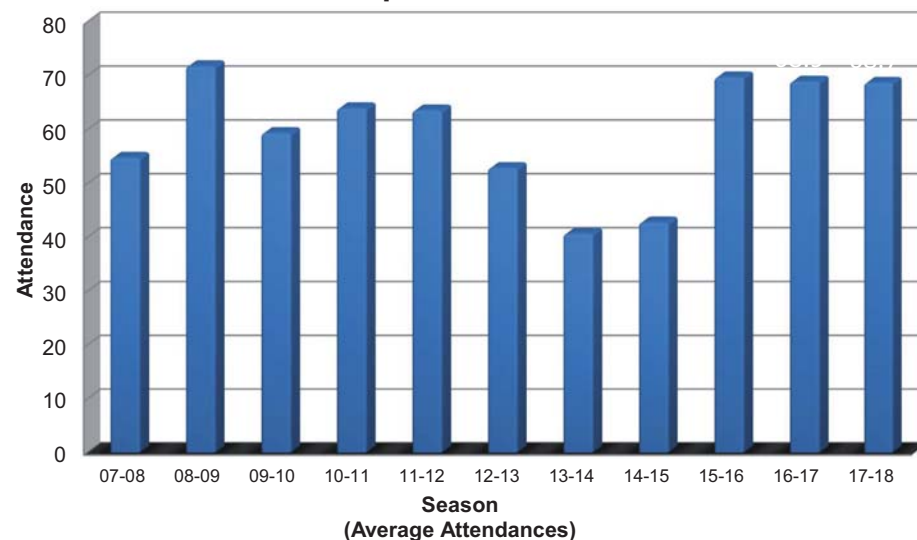

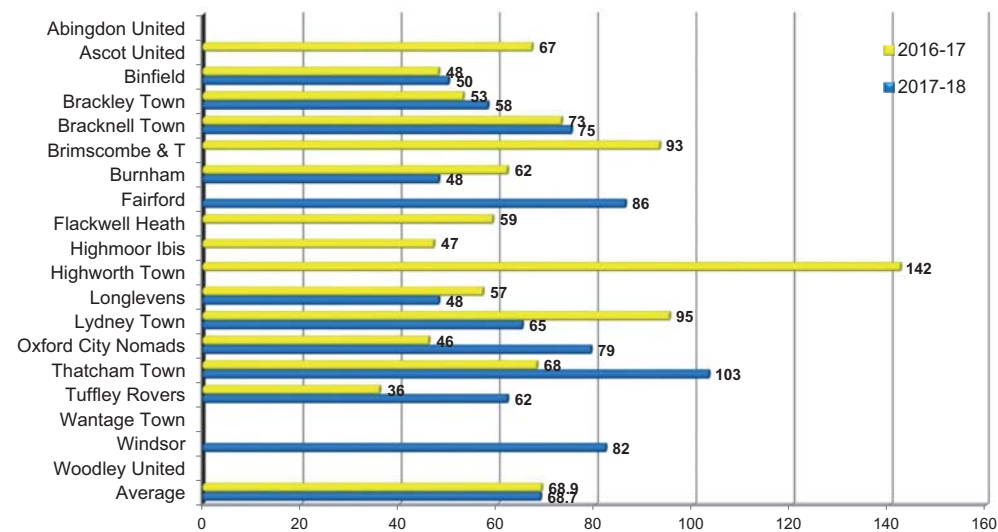

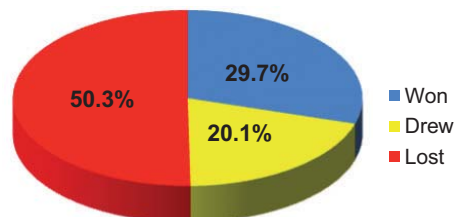

As an up-and-coming young goalkeeper, Paul Bastock idolised everything Peter Shilton did. Now, after breaking his record for the most amount of senior club appearances, it's the England great leading the tributes. Long-serving Bastock, 47, etched his name into the world record books when he took to the field for Wisbech Town in the FA Vase against Thetford Town last Saturday – his 1,250th club appearance, 29 years after his first. The feat surpassed Shilton's tally which has stood since 1997 when the former Leicester City, Nottingham Forest and Southampton goalkeeper made his last ever career appearance for Leyton Orient. Shilton still holds the world record of overall appearances – 1,387, to include his 125 full England caps and various recognised matches – but in an exclusive interview with The NLP, he was quick to hail the achievements of the lower league stalwart.

"It's a great milestone and an amazing feat," said Shilton, who ended his playing career at the age of 49. "To do that takes a variety of things. It takes ability, as well as determination and dedication to your football, in terms of keeping up your fitness and sharpness. "Also, as I'm sure Paul would agree, you need to have that little bit of luck. Your ability, and good training can help prevent injuries and extend your longevity in the game. "Goalkeeper training is very specialist and very difficult. You need to be strong, but subtle in moving your body weight around. Diving around in the mud on cold evenings at training takes a lot out of you, so you need to be dedicated and have a genuine love for the game and what you do. Paul clearly has that in abundance."

The significance of Shilton's glowing tribute will be heart-warming indeed for Bastock, whose career spanned across no fewer than 18 different clubs, most notably perhaps a 13-year spell at Boston United, which saw him win promotion to the Football League and earn an England C call-up.

"As a young boy, I'd try to emulate everything that Peter Shilton did," commented the man known as 'The Cat' before breaking the record. "Because I'm not the tallest, I even used to hang off the crossbar to stretch out my body like he did. "When I was young, there were the likes of Ray Clemence, John Burridge and Joe Corrigan, but Shilton was always the one I aspired to be like as a kid whenever I was wearing the yellow England goalkeeper jersey in the park with my mates. I can't believe that I'll be passing his record."

And pass it he did at Thetford's Mundford Road ground, where he came out to a guard of honour and a raft of media interest before leading his Wisbech side to a 4-1 win.

"The guard of honour was special, especially the way both teams got involved," he added. "Thetford didn't have to do that, especially as they were focusing on the game, but it was a nice moment. "I got a little bit emotional at the end looking around the pitch and seeing people from all over the country. I just thought wow, it's pretty special that my story has touched this many people to come and stand in the bitter cold." "I never thought it would lead to this exposure, I've not had a minute to myself since last Wednesday. I've had my head in the phone, texting and on Twitter – the problem is everybody wants to speak to you at the same time. It feels like coming from nothing and winning the X Factor!"

So after finally eclipsing his idol's appearance record, how many more years does Bastock believe he's got left in him?

"It's unbelievable how many times I've retired – I think I've given up every year since my early 30s and have had more comebacks than Frank Sinatra," he joked. "But this will be my last season now, that's 100 per cent this time. Shilts played in the Football League when he was 49 and I still get messages from my mates to say I've got years left in me, but this will definitely be my last year."

Hit For Six

Following their big midweek victory over Binfield, Royal Wootton Bassett Town crashed back down to earth with a 6-1 defeat away at Abingdon United.

Northcourt Road, 2nd December 2017

After cantering to an emphatic victory in midweek, Royal Wootton Bassett Town received a taste of their own medicine as they were thumped 6-1 by Abingdon United on a miserable afternoon for Rich Hunter's side. With December now upon us, Bassett got into the spirit of giving early. They gifted their lower mid-table hosts their opening two goals and offered a meek, insipid response when faced with the hole that left them in. By half time they trailed by three goals. And it wasn't until the penultimate minute of the game that Bassett finally registered, by which point they had shipped a further three goals. It's a game where both management and players need to shoulder the blame equally. The way Bassett set up wasn't conducive to an effective style of play. Given the absence of Lewis Waldon and Rory Sproule, they went with Sam Collier and Aaron Maximen up front, two players with very similar qualities. And with a pair of target men with no partner to feed off them, there was unsurprisingly little in the form of penetration, making life easy for Abingdon's scarcely tested defence. But that doesn't excuse for the poor performances across the pitch. Really only the central midfield pairing of Gio Wrona and Kai Robinson and left back Chris Jackson can be spared criticism for their play.

Indeed, it was a defensive error that allowed Abingdon to all too easily take a fifth minute lead as Adam Corcoran underhit a backpass, which Callum Harvey seized upon before rounding a stranded Conor Thompson and tapping in. A slip from Thompson then almost presented Harvey with his second, but he was saved by Steve Yeardley heading a tight angle shot off the line. A Thompson spill would lead to the second, however, as the debutant 'keeper failed to gather Cameron Hawtin's free kick, the ball falling for John Dennis who slotted in from the edge of the area. Bassett full further behind on the stroke of half time – something they could ill afford to do – when Abingdon hit their visitors on the break. Harvey raced onto a ball played into the right channel, and while Dennis was unable to get onto the end of his cross, Tom Butler was in position to steer home from eighteen yards out with a fine finish. Emphasising their struggles in the opening period, the only real danger Bassett had posed prior to the interval came from a pair of corners, which saw a Sam Collier header hacked away and Maximen head over.

Whereas they had been unable to take advantage of set pieces, the home side were able to capitalise on theirs, scoring their fourth from a short corner routine three minutes after the restart. Sam Wharton eventually delivered a cross into the box, which Joe Green's glancing header guided into the back of the net. Bassett were fortunate to then survive two chances that arrived in a matter of minutes, being spared by Wharton striking straight at Thompson when one-on-one and an unmarked Jayce Olivero skewing wide from twelve yards out. Abingdon weren't to be denied a fifth though, substitute Ryan Barney curling a twenty-yard free kick into the top right corner. And in the final five minutes a counter attack from a failed Bassett foray forward ended in Butler being hauled to the floor by Thompson, with Graham Edney confidently putting away the resulting penalty. There was still time for Bassett to register as Maximen headed in from a Wrona free kick. Whether it can count as a consolation is another matter. The latest in a series of heavy league defeats so far this season, it means in their eight losses Bassett have conceded thirty goals, netting just four in response. That's a horrendous record and attests to the team's Jekyll and Hyde nature.

In victory, Bassett have typically conjured up resolute, disciplined performances, defending diligently, while offering cutting edge in attack. However, in defeat they have generally, inexplicably, been torn apart. It's a habit that needs to be eradicated.
