Editorial & RWBTFC News

Welcome to Binfield

A warm welcome to the players, officials and spectators from Binfield for this UHlsport Hellenic League fixture. We hope all those from Binfield enjoy their short stay with us this evening and we wish them a safe journey home.

The two sides have met on twelve occasions previously and it is our visitors who have had the better of things with eight wins to our two with three draws between the two sides. Only one of our two wins was in the league. The past two seasons Binfield have done the double over us in the league. Last season we lost 1-0 here at the Gerard Buxton Ground and then lost 3-1 in the return at Binfield, Dan Bailey scoring our consolation goal. Of this season's Premier Division constitution our record against Binfield is the worst of any against this season's sides, although we have yet to play Woodley United in the league. We have only averaged 0.4 points in our 10 league games against Binfield, our next worst record is 0.45 v Bracknell Town. Hopefully tonight we can put that right a bit but it should be noted that Binfield are in a rich vein of form as they come into tonight's game unbeaten in their last seven matches. They currently sit in seventh place in the table, five points ahead of us having played the same number of games. I understand that Binfield manager Roger Herridge has already come down the M4 to have us watched so no doubt will have his side set up to give us another tough game tonight.

Trowbridge Game

A good performance on a night when the conditions made it very difficult saw us progress to the next round of the Wiltshire Senior Cup. Whilst holders Swindon Supermarine and Melksham Town have been knocked out already there are still some very good sides through to the last eight including Salisbury, Highworth Town, Bemerton Heath Harlequins and Westbury United. The Wilts FA videoed the draw and broadcast it on their social media feed and we were the first name drawn out of the "bucket" and we have been handed a home tie against near neighbours and Hellenic League Premier Division rivals Highworth Town in the quarter finals. The tie will take place on Wednesday 13th December at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground (7.45pm kick off). The game will mark a noted step up in the level of competition Bassett have faced in this year's edition of the County Cup, having progressed to the last eight thanks to a pair of wins against Wiltshire League opponents in the form of Cricklade Town and Trowbridge Town. Nevertheless, we will be hoping to pull off what would arguably be an upset victory given the impressive start Highworth have made to their league campaign, and reach the club's first Senior Cup semi-final since 2008-09. Highworth, six times cup winners – most recently in 2014-15 – and runners-up to Swindon Supermarine last season, have reached the quarter-final stage by virtue of a last gasp away victory against Downton and a walkover against Laverstock and Ford. It promises to be an intriguing, competitive encounter, and will be the first of two derbies in the space of a fortnight, with Highworth set to visit for the return league fixture on Boxing Day. The Worthians battled back from a half time deficit to win 3-2 against nine-man Bassett in this season's first league clash between the teams in August. Not since a semi-final tie in 1995-96, which Highworth won 3-1, have the two sides faced each other in the Senior Cup. The season before that, Bassett prevailed 4-3 in the first round, while also winning 2-1 at the same stage in 1992-93. The remaining ties in the Senior Cup quarter finals see an all-Chippenham derby between Chippenham Town and Chippenham Park, the last remaining Wiltshire League side Bremhill entertaining Bemerton Heath Harlequins and Westbury United hosting Salisbury.

Bluefin Insurance Cup and Floodlit Cup Draws

A bit like when the number 55 bus and number R1 bus used to come along at the same time when both were running between Bassett and Swindon earlier this year so come cup draws against Highworth Town. A couple of days after hearing the Wiltshire Senior Cup draw we then hear that we have again been drawn against Highworth in the Perpetuapress Floodlit Cup. This time the match will be away from home at the Elms. In the Bluefin Insurance Cup, whose draw was announced at the same time, we have been handed another home tie this time against Wantage Town or Pewsey Vale who were scheduled to play their Second Round tie last night. By the time you read these notes you will know who we have got unless the game last night was postponed.

It's a good job we defeated Fairford to avoid having to play in the Supplementary Cup else we could have played Highworth in that one as well. No doubt both games will be typical local derbies like the earlier encounter at the Elms in the league this season.

Development Side

With no First Team action on Saturday I again got to watch the Development side on Saturday in what turned out to be a thoroughly entertaining game. Two things really pleased me greatly on Saturday. The first was that there were three members of the First Team coaching staff watching the game and they were there from start to finish. Secondly there were a number of players who have only been making the bench and getting a short run out for the First Team who were able to get 90 minutes of football in their legs by playing for the Development side. That is how it is supposed to work with the second team and it is pleasing to see that this is now happening. Against a useful Westbury team, both sides tried to play passing football and there were some good goals from both sides. On target for us in the 3-3 draw were Ryan Withers, Joe Miller and an own goal. There is a match report on this game in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League round-up.

Ladies Team

The Ladies side continue to lead the way in the South West Women's League Eastern Division with eight wins from the opening eight games. Well done to Becky and the Ladies, a fantastic start to the season and the only adult side in Wiltshire with a 100% league record.

Opponents - History

Binfield • Club History

Binfield FC first played in 1892, during the reign of Queen Victoria, making us one of the oldest Association Football clubs in the world! The team comprised young men from the local brickworks and those who worked on the land around Binfield. The club's early years were spent in the Ascot and District League, where we enjoyed many successful seasons winning the Fielden Cup for the first time in 1924 and on eleven further occasions since.



During the 2nd World War, we joined the Great Western Combination League, winning the championship in 1947. During that period we also won the Berks and Bucks Junior Cup and the Maidenhead Norfolkian Cup and it was not unusual to see crowds in excess of 1,000 at our Forest Road ground.

In 1950 we joined the Reading and District League, where we remained for the next forty years. In 1972 Binfield won promotion to the Premier Division for the first time and although relegated two years later we returned in 1976 as 1st Division Champions. A huge crowd, reminiscent of the 1940's, packed Forest Road to witness our promotion. In 1980, the club made an important decision to move from Forest Road, where facilities were shared with the cricket club, to our current site in Hill Farm Lane. Turning that field into the football ground we see today was a massive task. Thanks to an enormous amount of physical work by the members of the club the area was levelled and drained within three years. The members then set about building the club house. This progress off the field was matched on it when in 1987 and 1988 we won Division 2 and then Division 1 of the Reading and District League. In 1989, we joined the high-profile Charrington Chiltonian League, winning the Division 1 title at the first attempt – a feat we repeated in 1996 - and reaching the final of the League Cup. The following year we finished runners-up to Peppard, despite remaining unbeaten from November until the end of the campaign.

In 2001 we merged with Binfield's junior club, Binfield Forest FC, and in doing so significantly increased the membership, with over 20 teams playing every weekend – this season we will field 36 teams each week. The junior part of the club is very important to Binfield with FA Charter status having been achieved in 2007 and in 2013 we were awarded the Berks & Bucks FA and South East Regional FA Charter Status Community Club of the Year awards, culminating in the club being invited to the FA Community Shield at Wembley in August 2013. We're also in our fourth season of a partnership scheme with Reading FC where some of our younger players have the opportunity to train with Reading. In 2003 we added an Allied Counties Youth team which is now providing a steady stream of talented young players ready for Senior football for the Reserves and 1st Team.

Our reserves side are a vital and successful part of our club, providing progression from our youth team into senior football and regularly providing players for the 1st team squad, whilst also being successful in winning UHlsport Hellenic Division 2 East in 2012 and again in 2014. Moving to the Suburban League for a new challenge last season, our reserves excelled, winning the league on the final day and later bringing the Ascot Fielden Cup back to Binfield FC for the first time since the 1970s, which the club first won in 1924! In 2015/16 the side consolidated in the Suburban Premier Division and retained the Fielden Cup. Our reserves also provide the bridge from youth into senior football with our Allied Counties players a regular feature of reserves teams and many of our regular reserves stepping up into the 1st team when called upon.

Since 2005, progress at the club has been swift, with the addition of floodlights and later a seated stand. The club is tirelessly working to improve our facilities with our "continuous improvement" plan making further change to the car park, to the club house and a new stand around our Tea Bar. We constantly strive to improve all elements of the facilities from changing rooms to a playing surface we are extremely proud of, to benefit everyone from our Under 6s up to our 1st Team and Veterans. We won the FTL Hellenic League Division 1 East title in 2008-09 and gained promotion to the next level of English football, where we finished runners up in the 2010/11 UHlsport Hellenic Premier Division, 3rd in 2012/13 and 5th in 2014.

August 15th 2009 will long be remembered as Binfield's first game in the legendary FA Cup – and we have enjoyed some good runs reaching the 1st Qualifying round in each of the last two seasons with 400 supporters enjoying the visit of Margate in 2010 and a trip to Slough Town and narrow defeat in 2011. In 2013 the side reached the 2nd Qualifying round, losing to a 96th minute free kick as Leatherhead came from behind. Binfield entered the FA Vase for the first time in season 2008-09 and enjoyed three rounds, before reaching the 4th round (last 32) in 2011/12 in an incredible season of cup success. The 2011/12 team is the most successful in our history, winning both the Berks & Bucks FA Senior Trophy and the AM Print & Copy Floodlit Cup in five glorious April 2012 days. We also reached the final of the Hellenic Challenge Cup.

Ultimately the step up to the next tier of English non league football is our aim..

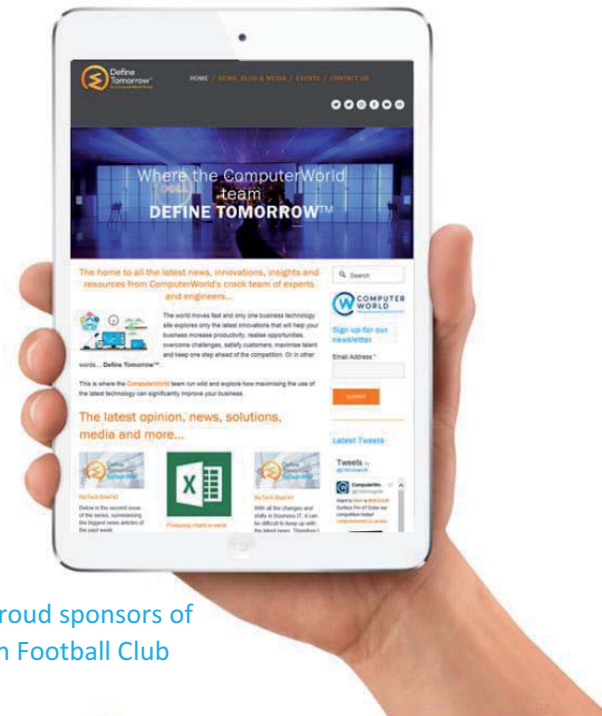

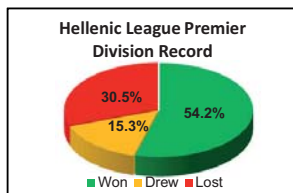
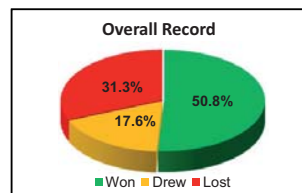

Wiltshire Senior Cup Last Week

Round-up Wiltshire Senior Cup Midweek Action

The two remaining Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League sides in the Wiltshire Senior Cup were both in Second Round action this week with mixed fortunes.

The young Bremhill side, struggling in the league and without a win to their name, were once again responsible for the shock of the round. Having already knocked Western League side Devizes Town out in the previous round, on Tuesday night they defeated Amesbury Town, a side from the Sydenhams Wessex league playing two tiers above Bremhill in the football pyramid. It was Kai Whitmore and Harry Ruty who scored the goals for Bremhill, with the winning goal from Ruty coming in injury time and continued Bremhill's fine form in cup competitions this season.

On a night when the weather left a lot to be desired, Amesbury had taken an early lead on three minutes when Kieran Stephens fired home following good set up play by Jordan Matthews and Luke Greenway. Despite being under pressure for most of the first half Bremhill thought they had equalised when Alex Pippard headed home a cross, but he was adjudged to be in an offside position and it remained 1-0 at the break. In the second half the rain that had been falling in the first period got heavier and the pitch became boggy making it difficult for both sides. Despite the deteriorating conditions Bremhill equalised on 64 minutes when Kai Whitmore raced clear of the defence, his initial effort being saved by the keeper but he was there to turn in the rebound for a deserved equaliser. Both sides had opportunities to get in front, but it was Bremhill, a side who ironically have suffered a number of costly late goals against them this season in the league, who won the tie when in the third minute of added time a free kick by George Lance was met by Zak Mitchell and the ball fell for Harry Ruty to score and send the home team into raptures.

The other side from the league in Second Round action were Trowbridge Town who fell to a 4-0 defeat away at Royal Wootton Bassett Town on Wednesday night. Playing with a fierce wind behind their back in the first half Trowbridge put in a stubborn defensive performance to restrict their opponents, who are also two levels higher in the pyramid, to a single goal lead at half time. That opening goal came in the twelfth minute courtesy of Lewis Waldon, With the wind behind them in the second half it didn't take the home side long after the restart for their lead to be doubled as Steve Yeardeley confidently stroked home from the penalty spot. Rory Sproule then added a third with quarter of an hour remaining before completing his brace in the closing stages to complete the scoring. A disappointing result on the night for Trowbridge but a spirited performance against higher league opposition.

Can the Bremhill Wiltshire Senior Cup romance continue in Round 3? Alongside them in the last eight of this prestigious competition, which dates back to 1886-87, will be some of the big names in Wiltshire football. Joining Bremhill in the draw will be Hellenic League sides Highworth Town and Royal Wootton Bassett Town, Wessex League Premier Division outfit Bemerton Heath Harlequins, Southern League Salisbury and National League South side Chippenham Town and two teams from Western League Division One - Westbury United and Chippenham Park. Player Profile

Adam Corcoran (Defender)



Corcoran is a talented, imposing defender, with the ability of playing either at centre half or full back, who re-joined Bassett for a second spell in the summer of 2015.

Composed on the ball and dominant in the air, Corcoran is a Cirencester Town Academy graduate and featured in the team that made it to the third round of the 2008/09 FA Youth Cup where they were narrowly defeated by Sunderland. That season he would also make four appearances for the Cirencester Town first team in Southern League Division One South & West. He would play one game for the Centurions a season later before beginning the 2010/11 campaign with Hellenic Premier Division Fairford Town. He made nine appearances, scoring one

goal in a 2-2 draw with Shrivenham for the Cinder Lane outfit, before transferring to Western League side Calne Town. And Corcoran established himself as a first team regular for Jeff Roberts' team, appearing 16 times, 15 of which were starts.

He spent the entire 2011/12 campaign with Bassett, making his debut on the opening day at centre back away against Malmesbury Victoria. He appeared 28 times, scoring once that season before again playing a key role in Bassett's 2012/13 promotion campaign, playing 34 times and grabbing one goal. While manager Dave Turner moved on following that season, Corcoran stayed with Bassett and new manager Jeff Roberts, featuring 40 times, primarily at full back, and netting five goals. He then switched to Shrivenham in 2014, making 33 appearances.

Corcoran returned to Bassett the following season and played 32 times. Last season the defender saw his number of appearances limited as he played 18 times, scoring a single goal in a Floodlit Cup thrashing of Sandhurst Town.

Despite his defensive qualities, Corcoran can also be a threat going forward and can strike a ball finely as evidenced by his lone goal in his first season with Bassett – a stunning left footed curler against Pewsey Vale in the Wiltshire Senior Cup - and the brace he scored against Abingdon United in 2013/14.

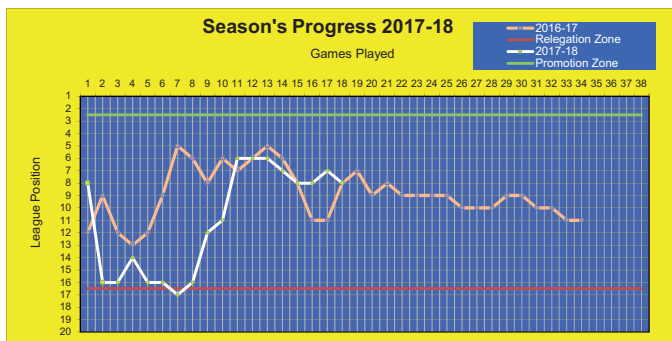

Royal Wootton Bassett Town FC • Club History

Situated in the small market town six miles west of Swindon, Royal Wootton Bassett Town Football Club was first established within the town in 1882, making the club one of the oldest in the county of Wiltshire. The club's early achievements came in the prestigious Wiltshire Senior Cup, making the final in both 1902-3 and 1903-4, although both ended in defeat. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. folded for a period pre World War 1 before re-forming in the Calne & District League when the club began playing at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground which had been donated by local dignitary Major Gerard Buxton for sporting activities within the town and opened in 1930.



Early successes included winning the Calne & District League in the 1930-31 Season, having finished runners-up the previous season, and then again in 1934-35. Following a move up to the Wiltshire League Division 2 promotion was earned again the following season and the team then remained in the top division in the county until the outbreak of war.

After the war Wootton Bassett Town F.C. recommenced in the County Senior League with limited success until Season 1958-59 when they won their first Wiltshire League title. In 1987-88 the Wiltshire League Division 1 title was won, elevating the Club into the Hellenic League, where they have remained ever since. Season 1987-88 also saw the club again reach the final of the Wiltshire Senior Cup but that first win remained elusive. That changed in 1998-99, however, when the Club defeated Pewsey Vale 3-2 in the final at the County Ground and success was again achieved in Season 2000-01 when Shrewton were defeated 2-0 in the final. The First Team, having finished runners-up in Division One West in Season 2012-13, currently play in the Premier Division of the Hellenic League, at Step 5 of the Football Pyramid.

As well as the First Team the Club has always run an adult Development/Reserve team. Since the onset of the new millennium the club has also expanded significantly, with the establishment of a large thriving Youth Section and a very successful Ladies Section. The Ladies side recently did the "double" of being cup winners and securing promotion in the same season. The latest addition to the Club has been the establishment of a Veterans team, so the club now operates 26 teams from under 7s upwards. This growth led to the club being awarded Charter Standard Development Club status by the Football Association in 2008 before this was upgraded to Community Club status a year later. Wootton Bassett Town F.C. was the first club in Wiltshire to achieve this. International ties have also been established, with three Youth Section teams touring Holland annually since 2001. This has led to a relationship with amateur side FC 's-Gravenzande, who are based near The Hague.

The club now play their games at the fantastic New Gerard Buxton Sports Ground, which was opened in the summer of 2015 and with the Royal title now included within the club name, the Club continues to thrive as a key part of the community of Royal Wootton Bassett. Season 2017-18 again sees Rich Hunter in charge of the First Team as the Club looks to better its highest ever position in Non-League football the 11th place finish achieved in Season 2014-15. The Club will again be entering the F.A. Cup and F.A. Vase with the Development side playing in the Wiltshire County League.

A Right Royal Occasion

Stubbs Lane, 9th September 2015

Binfield 3, Royal Wootton Bassett Town 4

A superb performance from Royal Wootton Bassett Town on Monday night secured Bassett a trip to Windsor in the next round of the F.A. Vase following a thrilling 4-3 victory away at Binfield.

Given the circumstances of having to travel to Binfield on a Monday night minus their four most experienced players in Steve Yeardley, Adam Corcoran, Richie Carter and top scorer Steve Robertson, few would have predicted what happened on Monday night. With six players starting the game under the age of 19 and with 17 year old Hugo Vivash on the bench it was a very inexperienced side that Bassett fielded at Stubbs Lane. The one thing with youth is that they show no fear and this performance demonstrated that admirably.

Royal Wootton Bassett went close to taking the lead on 5 minutes when an audacious shot from Dan Bailey from his own half nearly caught Binfield keeper Nathan Silver. Having been done on Saturday with a shot over his head Silver only just managed to do enough to keep out Bailey's cheeky effort.

Binfield's first effort on goal came on 9 minutes from Liam Ferdinand but his shot was easily saved by Curtis Meare in the Bassett goal. Bassett immediately counter attacked and great set up play between Dan Bailey and Steve Olphert put Kalum Youngsam through but his effort was well saved by Silver. The best chance of the night so far fell to Binfield on 20 minutes when, after good set-up play, James Knight missed a sitter. The game continued to be very open and played at pace, with Binfield hurrying every throw-in and free kick. On 30 minutes a shot from Matt Cheetham was well held by Silver. Binfield themselves had another glorious chance to take the lead on 36 minutes when a ball to the far post found Liam Ferdinand in acres of space but his header was poor and did not trouble Curtis Meare in the Bassett goal. The deadlock was finally broken on 37 minutes when Harvey Scholes became the second player in a couple of days to beat Silver from distance with a cracking 30 yard shot screaming over the keepers head and into the back of the Binfield net. So, whilst Binfield had more the possession in the first period it was Bassett that went into the half time break with the slender lead.

Three minutes after the break things were to get even better for Bassett when a great solo run from young Harvey Scholes beat 5 players and ended with a cool finish with a shot into the bottom right hand corner of the Binfield net, 2-0 Bassett and a very shocked home side. On a night of great goals Jemel Johnson brought Binfield back into the game with another quality goal. Coming in from wide on the left, he played a one-two with Liam Ferdinand before hitting a brilliant dipping volley from 25 yards in off the far post. The game continued to ebb and flow and Binfield introduced substitute Brad Brown who was then booked after a very silly two footed lunge within minutes of coming on. On other days this would have resulted in a straight red and both Brown and Binfield benefitted from the referee's leniency when moments later he curled a ball into the Bassett net from the edge of the box to bring Binfield level with half an hour left to play.

At that moment all present probably expected the young Bassett side to capitulate but they continued to work hard defensively and keep the home side from getting their noses in front. Brown again tested Curtis Meare and only the keeper's finger tips with the help of the post kept the score level. Whilst soaking up the pressure Bassett were always a threat on the break and when Dan Bailey rose highest on 82 minutes to meet a left wing cross from man of the match Scholes, his downward header gave Silver no chance and Bassett were back in front again. Having got back in front surely Bassett would not throw away the lead again? However, a controversial corner award six minutes from time allowed Binfield to continue to exert pressure. With Bassett still smarting from the corner award Lewis Leonetti connected with the corner, but this was cleared off the line but Liam Ferdinand was there to force the ball home. 3-3 and still five minutes to play in this pulsating game. Just when it looked like extra time would again be needed Bassett broke up a Binfield attack and won a corner of their own. From the corner centre-back Nathan Hawkins rose highest to head powerfully into the Binfield net for the 7th goal of the night. The closing moments were tense but the youngsters held out against the more experienced Binfield side and secure that precious win and prize money. So it is the Royal town of Wootton Bassett who will make that trip to Windsor. Both sides were applauded off the pitch at the end. It had been a cracking game witnessed by the Chairman of the Hellenic League who commented that the game had been a credit to the UHlsport Hellenic League.

Lauren Usher wrapped up the scoring with two minutes remaining, completing a flowing passing move by firing in her first of the season from the edge of the area.

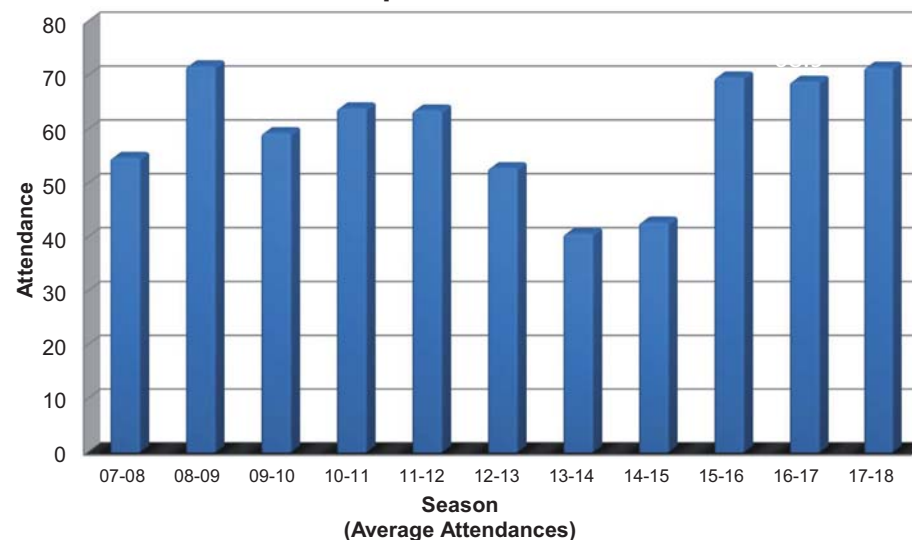

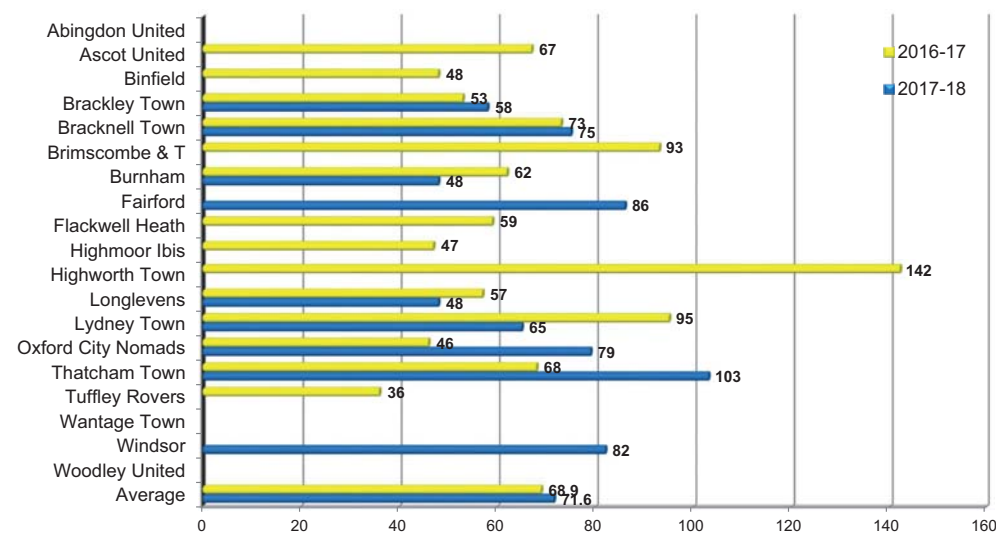

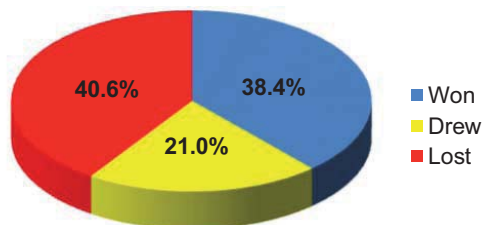

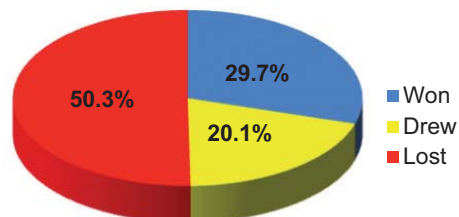

Youth Section Round-up

Jacob Rendell-Haines was on fire for Royal Wootton Bassett Town Under 13 Blues as he struck six goals in a 8-3 win over Marlborough Youth Mavericks, to make it a perfect ten wins out of ten in North Wilts League Division Two for his team.

Those goals took the sharpshooting striker to an amazing 34 goals on the season. Joey Warren, meanwhile, added the other two Bassett goals, giving him 18 for the campaign so far.

The Under 13 Blues are one of four Bassett sides who sit top of their respective tables.

Joining them at the summit are the Under 14 Blues, Under 15 Blues and Under 15 Yellow, all of whom recorded victories this weekend.

A sound defensive display and strikes from Otis Lewis and Scott Taylor delivered a 2-0 triumph for the Under 14 Blues against FC Abbey Meads Strikers. They now have a three point lead at the top of Division One, though second place FC Chippenham Youth White do have two games in hand.

The Under 15 Yellows preserved their 100% record in Division Three against Lydiard Youth Black. However, they were pushed all the way by their mid-table opponents, ultimately prevailing by the odd goal in five.

The Under 15 Blues were awarded the points against Cirencester Town Gladiators.

On Saturday, the Under 12 Girls bounced back from consecutive defeats in style, dominating FC Chippenham Youth Amethyst in a 14-0 win.

The girls produced a great, all-round team display, and six different players got on the scoresheet. Leading scorer Poppy Wannell struck six, while there were braces for Lucia Green, Rosie Jones, Darcie Little, and further goals from Edie Harris and Hollie O'Driscoll.

There was disappointment for the Under 12 Blues, who fell to a 5-1 loss against Cirencester Town Centurions in their North Wilts League Cup quarter final. Harvey Fulton scored Bassett's consolation.

Elsewhere, there were narrow defeats for the Under 18 Blues (2-1 against Swindon Rangers) and Under 18 Yellow (1-0 against league leader Marlborough Youth), and the Under 13 Yellows fell to a 4-1 loss against Purton Youth.

The lead would last all of seven minutes though, with Bassett being dealt a terrible blow in the process. A cross from the left was half cleared as far as Harry Jackson who, from close range, fired a fierce shot towards goal. At point blank range, the ball struck Chris Jackson, with the referee determining that the defender had knowingly blocked it with his hand.

It was an absolutely disgraceful decision. How on earth the referee could think that any player would deliberately do such a thing in that particular game situation - with your side a goal up with a good deal of time still to play in the opening period – is beyond belief. To compound matters, the shot was blasted at Jackson from a matter of yards away.

The damage was done, with Collier being sent off as well. And Jack Maloney confidently sent Lawrence the wrong way to even up the scores.

Horndean then went ahead seven minutes after the restart. Everett saw Lawrence block his shot at his feet, but the danger wasn't averted and, at the second time of asking, Ash Howes bundled in from close range.

Having gone ahead, the hosts may have been sensing a capitulation from their opponents. But Bassett never quit.

Within ten minutes they were on level terms. Kai Robinson, whose industrious performance in the heart of midfield was phenomenal, stole possession and delivered a perfect ball over the home right back for Waldon to run onto. On his weaker left foot and from a tight angle, the forward steered a delicate clip over Holt and into the opposite bottom corner.

Horndean were flustered, seemingly unclear what to do as all the possession they were having was getting them nowhere.

Jackson wasted a rare chance from inside the box when he struck wide after being played in by Everett's through ball. Otherwise, they were being limited to hopeful shots from range.

They were to be gifted the crucial third goal, however. Rather than clearing his lines, Harvey Scholes was caught out when trying to play a square pass deep inside the Bassett half, and substitute Josh Maloney pounced, winding his way into the box before stabbing the ball beyond Lawrence.

To that the visitors, still giving their all despite being spent, had no reply.

It was to their immense credit that they ensured Horndean were unable to kill the game off for good though. Lawrence was forced to make one more save, tipping Jack Maloney's powerful drive around the post, but otherwise he was untroubled the rest of the way.

Come full time, Rich Hunter's team were therefore left with nothing but an immense amount of credit to take from the game.

And that's the most disappointing aspect of an evening when you're left asking yourself what could have been.

Man of the Match: Kai Robinson – Bassett's display with nine men was exemplary, and Robinson was the pick of the bunch. There was no blade of grass he left uncovered as he tirelessly chased down ball after ball across the entire length and width of the pitch. His assist for Lewis Waldon's goal was superb too.

Courageous Vase battle in vain as nine man Bassett bow out

Having to play for the best part of an hour with nine men, Royal Wootton Bassett Town fought bravely in their FA Vase second round tie at Horndean, narrowly losing 3-2.

Adversity brought the best out of Royal Wootton Bassett Town in their FA Vase second round clash with Horndean. Yet that didn't prove to be enough as they fell to a 3-2 defeat, running their hosts close despite having to play for the best part of an hour with nine men.

The outcome of the tie hinged on a controversial penalty awarded to Horndean in the game's 36th minute.

Chris Jackson was adjudged to have deliberately handled Harry Jackson's fiercely struck shot, resulting in the awarding of a spot kick and a red card for the defender, with Sam Collier joining his teammate for an early bath for expressing his outrage at the decision.

Having been dealt such a bad hand, the expectation was that Horndean would canter to victory in the second half. However, summoning all the spare reserves of energy they had, the nine Bassett men who remained on the pitch put up a fierce fight.

They were diligent and disciplined in their defending, frustrating the home team, who more often than not were forced to try their luck from range. That provided a platform on which Bassett were able to build, and they took the lead on the half hour mark in stunning fashion. Antonio Gerrish gained possession just inside the hosts' half and, after advancing into the space ahead of him, unleashed a thirty-yard rocket that flew beyond Aaron Holt into the bottom right corner.


